<p>The Meer Stone is one of a number of stones that marked the boundary of Cricklade. It is the only one surviving and is cited in a 1776 parliamentary boundary dispute concerning the right to vote of the occupiers of the properties in the area. The position of the Meer Stones are shown on an 8th century map of the Borough of Cricklade situated in the Museum which is adjacent to this Meer Stone. Therefore it would be beneficial to the Community to have the only one in existence enhanced for all to see visitors and residents alike.</p> <p>Wiltshire County Council have been consulted and they would be delighted if this project were to be concluded as it would certainly tidy up an area that is in full public view.</p> <p>There are a large number of visitors to Cricklade each year. These include the 500-600 visitors to the museum (open 2 days per week) as well as those who visit the fritillaries in April. An enhanced Meer Stone would be another important and historical attraction for tourists.</p>
