# 1. Options

1.1 Opting out of these arrangements is not a practicable course of action given the statutory need to provide an adjudication service to support the enforcement of car parking restrictions.

## 2. Background

- 2.1 This report relates to car parking enforcement. The enforcement regime operates through the issue of penalty notices. Anyone receiving a penalty notice may appeal to the Council, and, if unsuccessful may make a further appeal to a parking adjudicator. It is the function of the local authorities themselves to appoint parking adjudicators and to provide them with accommodation and administrative staff. The legislation prescribes that this function shall be discharged by a Joint Committee of all the participating authorities. A formal legal agreement giving effect to these arrangements has been entered into by all the participating authorities including North Wiltshire District Council. The adjudication service is based in Manchester and is administered by Manchester City Council.
- 2.2 The existing arrangements were entered into under the Road Traffic Act 1991 and regulations made thereunder. This legislation has been repealed and replaced by Part VI of the Traffic Management Act 2004 and a new set of regulations as from 31<sup>st</sup> March 2008. In order to be able to continue to use the adjudication service the Council needs to enter into a new formal agreement with the other participating authorities. This report is to seek authority to do so. This is more a change of form than substance as the provisions of the new agreement will be very similar to the provisions of the old agreement.

### 3. Legal Implications

3.1 The Council has a statutory obligation to provide an adjudication service and the Joint Committee is the only practicable way both operationally and financially of providing this service.

#### 4. Risk Assessment

4.1 Failure to enter into a new arrangement will prejudice the Council's ability to enforce car parking penalty notices.
