#### 2. touch2id

The National Launch for the touch2id Project (formerly VerifyMe) will be in Trowbridge in November. This is a 21<sup>st</sup> century solution to provide an age verification scheme to tackle the sales of alcohol to underage persons. #### 3. Performance

Following the Unitary boundary changes work is still on-going to back convert records to allow continuing performance comparisons for the new Community Areas. I produce below figures covering all 3 Community Areas within the Sector area. The main area of concern is an increase in Dwelling Burglaries though the trend is now on a steady decrease. Recent arrests have had a positive effect and reported numbers have decreased over the last 8-weeks. Total Crime is down by 7.8% with detections rates being maintained well above national averages.
