Research by the Dept of Transport shows that the addition of planters to existing traffic calming measures are an effective, low cost, enhancement.

The estimates are based on prices from leading street furniture manufacturers. We have requested the necessary consents from the Council's Highways and will ensure that our scheme complies with their guidance.

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Woodbrough Road Safety Group

Terms of Reference

- 1) Group Aim: To deliver improved road safety in Woodborough.
- 2) Group Membership: 2 x Parish CouncillorsC, 2 x School Governors, 2 x Parishioners.
- 3) Ensure we are representative of the Woodborough community in order to adequetly represent their views to the Council and Police.
- 4) Ensure effective communication with stakeholders via regular newsletters and meetings.
- 5) Overall Strategy to achieve improved road safety will follow three principal work strands:
 - a) Enforcement action by Police
 - b) Engagement with Pewsey Area Board and Pewsey CATG
 - c) Refresh the School Travel Plan and initiate a Taking Action on Shool Journeys funding application.

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Planter Options

Whilst we await detailed guidance from Wiltshire Council on the acceptable design of the planters we have not been able to finalise our choice.

Also given the shape of the traffic calming build outs they would be best served by the use of several small planeters on a modular basis.

The intent would be to spend circa £750 on planters from the following ranges (or similar) and the remaining £250 on soli and plants. Labour would be free and supplied by volunteers.
