



7. Update on Melksham 0-19 Resilience Project

Richard Parker & Dr Janet Rose (Bath Spa University) gave an update on the the Melksham 0-19 Resilience Project that came to the Area Board in December 2010.

The project was a collaborative venture between schools, Bath Spa University and a number of other services working with young people in the Melksham area. It had two main aims – to test out the potential of emotion coaching techniques to improve behaviour, outcomes and family relationships in an area of significant deprivation, and to examine the feasibility and impact of adopting a common approach to such techniques across all services, on individuals, families, multi agency working and community well being.

Early indications were that the project's techniques were working and that the next phase would involve working more with parents and setting up a parents forum.

The Chairman thanked Richard Parker & Dr Janet Rose for their update.

8. Royal United Hospital NHS Trust - Foundation Trust Application

Brian Stables RUH, Bath, gave a presentation that outlined the implications of the application for trust status.

Points made included:

- The RUH is in the top 20% of acute hospitals in England and Wales for stroke care.
- The trust is improving the ways in which it cares for people with dementia and setting local standards.
- The RUH is expanding its role as a regional provider of specialised treatment for patients with prostrate cancer.
- To continue to provide comprehensive acute care.

Questions from the floor included:

How much extra funding would be available for services?

a) Around 2% per annum would be ploughed back into services.

How will members be elected?

a) Any elections would be carried out by a third party.

The Chairman thanked Brian Stables for his presentation.

9. Melksham Community Campus - Shadow Community Operations Board

At the meeting of the Melksham Area Board held on 29 March 2011 the Area Board confirmed that it should be the governance route for the development of the Melksham Community Campus and delivery of the preliminary management project in the Melksham Community Area. The Board also asked officers to support the creation of a Shadow Community Operations Board.

In order to move forward with this project the Board was asked:

- (a) To confirm the draft terms of reference considered by the Area Board on 29 March 2011 as amended.
- (b) To appoint a Wiltshire Council member of the Area Board to the Shadow Community Operations Board.
- (c) To agree the composition of the Shadow Community Operations Board.

Mel has been in post for 4-years and in that time has been responsible for the implementation and the ongoing success of Neighbourhood Policing Team. I am sure that you will all join me in thanking her for her dedication to the service of the people of Melksham and the surrounding Parishes and to wish her well in her new job. I am currently working to select and recruit her replacement.

2. Vision Wiltshire

Vision Wiltshire has been set-up to deliver a new policing model to meet the projected funding cuts over the next 4-years. Wiltshire Police Authority (WPA) must reduce its budget from £108million in 2009-10 by £15million over the next four years. Work is ongoing to achieve this and news of changes to frontline policing delivery will be reported over the next couple of months. As I have previously reported there are unlikely to be any significant changes that impact on policing in the Melksham Community Area.

3. Performance

Performance continues to be good. There is an overall reduction in crime levels in the Community Area.

Due to changes in how Anti-Social Behaviour is nationally categorised current comparison figures are not available for this report.






Incidents and Calls




Fires by Cause




Non-Fire incidents attended by WFRS




Number of False Alarm Incidents

NHS Update - July 2011

NHS Reforms - the Health and Social Care Bill 2011

Following the publication of the report of the NHS Future Forum in June 2011, the Government has set out a detailed policy response which announces important changes to the government's plans for modernisation of the NHS. The changes include:

- Change from GP Commissioning Consortia to Clinical Commissioning Groups with Board members and wider duties to involve patients and public
- Stronger safeguards against competition
- Additional safeguards against privatisation
- More choice and involvement for patients
- Increased emphasis on joint commissioning
- Strong messages about integration of health and social care
- · Revised timetable

NHS Wiltshire will continue working closely with local GPs to establish the structures and organisation of the Wiltshire Clinical Commissioning Groups to ensure a smooth transfer of services and commissioning duties in April 2013. The emerging Clinical Commissioning Groups will become sub-committees of their respective NHS Boards, which for Wiltshire currently means three Clinical Commissioning Groups - North and Kennet, West Wiltshire Yatton Keynell and Devizes (WWYKD) and the Sarum NHS Alliance.

PCT clustering

Jeff James and Jenny Howells have been appointed Chief Executive and Director of Finance respectively, across PCT cluster which comprises NHS Wiltshire and NHS Bath and North East Somerset. The Chief Executive is accountable for the quality, finance, performance and the development of commissioning functions across the whole cluster area, supported by a single executive team. Clustering also helps to deliver the national ambition of a 43% decrease in management costs across the NHS by 2013, as set by the Department of Health.

Jeff James will lead a single Executive Team drawn from existing staff in the South West region. Recruitment to other posts within the Executive Team is underway, with positions advertised nationally and expressions of interest received. Interviews are to be held in early July.

NHS Wiltshire and NHS BANES will continue to exist as legal entities and their Boards will continue to meet separately to carry out their strategic duties led by their existing respective Chairmen.

Melksham Community Area Transport Group, 27 June 2011: Recommendations to Melksham Area Board, 14 July 2011

Budget for minor highways capital works

Discretionary highways budget 2011/12 – including roll over from 2010/12 is **£26,450**. This can be topped up by the Area Board, town/ parish councils and others. NB. There will be no roll over to 2012/13 at the end of this financial year.

<u>Updates on Priorities agreed by Melksham CATG, 2010:</u>

- i. A365 Bath Rd, Melksham pedestrian crossing (refuge) Metro count data now collected. Waiting for pedestrian count data.
- ii. Queensway pedestrian crossing (zebra) Report completed. Recommends a zebra crossing at total cost of £20,900. Approaching town council for any contribution. CATG RECOMMEND to AREA BOARD to approve funding (up to £20,900) subject to MTC contribution.
- iii. A365 Bath Rd, Atworth completion of pedestrian crossing facility Construction substantially complete. One small patch of high grit to finish.
- iv. Whitley footway improvements Preliminary designs for 5 sections of footway were looked at, ranging from £2000 £13,000 depending on length and materials used. Officer recommendation is to prioritise funding for standard footway at location 2 (£8923.36). MWPC think location 1 is more important. Will contribute £1000 towards this section which has total cost of £7500. **RECOMMEND to AREA BOARD to approve funding for section 1 (£6500).**
- v. A3102 Sandridge Rd, Nr Queensway pedestrian crossing facility Relative scoring carried out, rated high with 44 points suggesting this should be a priority. Pedestrian and metro counts ordered. Potentially a zebra crossing but worried about high speeds off peak which may need a signalled crossing. This crossing is also likely to need upgraded lighting increasing the costs and may cause objections from local houses. CATG will look at this issue again in October once the data is available.

Summary of other significant matters

Bridge at Bollands Hill, Seend – Following the inquest into last year's fatal road collision at this location, the coroner made a number of recommendations for highway improvements. The council has carefully considered these recommendations and has written to the coroner to inform of the improvements to be implemented. We will introduce solid edge lines over the bridge to provide a visual narrowing, which encourages greater caution, and some signing changes which we believe will help driver's awareness of the bend to the north of the bridge will also be put in place. This includes a revised chevron board which can be seen on approach to the bridge. Rumble strips were also considered on the north bound approach, however, because of the noise they produce and the close proximity of local residential properties, these will not be installed at this time. Wiltshire Council anticipate the measures will be installed before the end of August 2011.

Purpose of Report

To ask Councillors to consider 3 application seeking 2011/2012 Community Area Grant Funding:

- 1. **Melksham & District Young Farmers club** have applied for £544 to provide an outdoor education trip for five 12-16 year old from rural backgrounds. The recommendation is to award the funding.
- 2. **Keevil Parish Council** have applied for £885 towards the renovation of the village war memorial. The recommendation is to award the funding.
- 3. **Alzheimers Support** have applied for £1358 to start up a 'Movement for the Mind' project in Melksham. The recommendation is to award the funding.

1. Background

- Area Boards have authority to approve Area Grants under powers delegated to them by the Deputy Leader and Cabinet member for Community Services (27 February 2010). Under the Scheme of Delegation Area Boards must adhere to the Area Board Grants Guidance for funding.
- 1.2. In accordance with the Scheme of Delegation, any recommendation of an Area Board that is contrary to the funding criteria would need the approval of the Leader, the appropriate Cabinet Member or the Cabinet.
- 1.3. In accordance with the Area Board Grants Guidance officers are required to provide recommendations in their report, however, the decision to support applications and to what level is made by Wiltshire Councillors on this Area Board.
- 1.4. EXAMPLE Two applicants withdrew their applications and hope to reapply at a future date. One application did not meet the funding criteria and was referred to Charities Information Bureau (CIB) for support to seek funding from elsewhere. CIB work on behalf of Wiltshire Council to support community and voluntary groups, town and parish councils to seek funding for community projects and schemes both from the Area Board and other local and national funding sources.
- 1.5. Funding applications will be considered at every other Area Board meeting.
- 1.6. Melksham Area Board has been allocated a 2011/2012 budget of £49,762 for community grants, community partnership core funding and councillor led initiatives. The carry forward from the 2010/2011 budget is £3687. This leaves a total budget of £53,449 for the 2011/2012 budget.
- 1.7. A decision has been made in 2010/2011 that paper copies of funding applications will no longer appear as part of the agenda in an attempt to reduce volume of paper used. However, the application forms will be available on the Wiltshire Council web site and hard copies available upon request.
- 1.8. The 2010/2011 funding criteria and application forms are available on the council's website (www.wiltshire.gov.uk/areaboards) or paper versions are available from the Community Area Manager.
