1. Background

Project description

Located in the second largest village in Wiltshire Potterne Youth Club is part of the Potterne Youth Centre Charity, offering a free and safe environment for young people in the Potterne and surrounding areas to relax and build positive relationships and behaviours. The Club is open Wednesday after school and Friday evenings for secondary ages most weeks throughout the year. The sessions can offer young people activities such as games, pool table, movie nights, chill out area, refreshments, theme nights and other support such as face to face conversations, discussion to help with job applications and training. These sessions are attended by many of the local children and staffed by volunteers from the local area who have a heart for the young people of the village and want to help make a real difference in their lives. Young people have been asked and supported to develop their ideas. This grant will allow us to put some of those suggestions into action such as more organised trips training opportunities and supporting fundraising for charities. The club is supported by a Parish Youth Worker from Youth for Christ and this grant will include staffing support for an additional paid worker.

This will run during the May-June half term.
