	A film was shown about young people from Devizes and Lavington and their experience of living in the area.					
	<ul> <li>This was followed by round table discussion of the film, facilitated by Damian Haasjes, Youth Development Co-Ordinator. The Chairman asked for an issue arising from the film and a possible solution to the issue from each table. The main issues raised were: <ul> <li>Nowhere to go in Market Lavington</li> </ul> </li> </ul>					

	<ul> <li>Parties for young people banned in village halls</li> <li>Lack of ownership of facilities and under appreciation of existing facilities by young people</li> <li>Lack of a skate park</li> <li>Transport for young people from the villages</li> <li>Lack of respect for young people and a lack of interaction between the generations</li> <li>Nowhere for young people to go</li> <li>Lack of awareness of available facilities and how to become involved</li> </ul>

0.	Councillor Gamble presented an update on a possible transport scheme for young people in villages, which had been put together with David Whewell (Head of Youth Work) and Carl Bowen (Special Projects Officer). The scheme was for an evening bus club running from the villages into Devizes for young people. He underlined there would be no special provision planned for the young people once they were in the town. A pilot scheme was intended to be run from late 2010. The club would be debated by young people at a conference held on Friday 19 February.	

7.	Partner Updates	
	a) The written update from Wiltshire Police was noted.	
	b) The written update from Wiltshire Fire and Rescue Service was noted.	
	c) Alison Knowles from NHS Wiltshire provided a short update on the Primary Care Centre. The centre would now be located at the Quakers Walk site adjacent to a scheme for social care for older people from the charitable foundation St Monica's Trust. This site was selected after the initial site selected in 1997 became financially unviable.	
	Alison Knowles answered a number of questions from the floor. There were no plans for a Minor Injuries Unit in Devizes. No money had been spent on investigating the initial site, except for the cost of two public exhibitions. Quakers Walk would be resurfaced as part of the new housing development. Figures on the relative costs of the sites would be available to the public once negotiations were completed. Concern was raised regarding how Devizes infrastructure would cope with the new development and the concentration of cars at peak times.	
8.	Issues Update	
	The Community Area Manager drew attention to the issues log circulated with the agenda papers and emphasised that issues could be submitted and tracked online through the Wiltshire Council website: <u>www.wiltshire.gov.uk</u> .	
	Matt Davies, creator of a Facebook petition for a skate park in Devizes, spoke to the meeting about the need for a skate park in the town. The Community Area Manager advised the Area Board of progress to date and sought authority for the creation of a working group to advise the process.	
	<u>Decision</u> A working party would be created to advise the progress of the skate park.	
	Decision The Council's property department would investigate the acquisition of a parcel of land referred to in the skate park for Devizes report, included in the agenda papers.
