Performance and Other Local Issues

I am pleased to confirm that PCSO Jenny Moss joins the team in the coming month to replace Sam Spacey who left us to train as a Constable. Jenny will be splitting her time between Salisbury & Wilton in the early stages whilst we tutor other new staff. Beat Manager Rachel Jennings has recently completed a considerable amount of activity to tackle low scale drug supply around the village. Her team

have searched in excess of half a dozen homes where Cannabis, Amphetamine and other prohibited items have been seized. Beat Manager Pete Jung continues to operate our periodic night time Rural Crime initiative, these continue to be well supported by local farmers and I thank you again for your continued support in this regard. You will note that acquisitive crime is increasing and Wilton is not alone in this regard. Particular issues are theft from cars, sheds, garages & outbuildings. Sergeant Dean Garvin has pulled together a plan aimed to reduce this offending by ensuring we chart and investigate every offence to draw out any intelligence links and to actively target a group of known offenders with robust police activity. On this theme, I am pleased to report the charge of local male with Burglary at C&O Tractors Wilton, following recovery of forensic evidence. Our neighbourhood teams are being supported by our colleagues in investigation, response and specialist policing in this regard. It is unfortunately the case that many of these offences are avoidable. I urge you to ensure you spread the word to your neighbours and ensure valuables are not left in cars and that sheds etc are locked. You should also consider properly cataloguing and marking your property – this can be particularly important with desirable items such as garden machinery.
