What will your project involve?

We are keen to develop the landscape in and around our school to generate an environment more reflective of our location within the beautiful local landscape. As part of a Year 10 BTEC group beginning a course in vocational studies, we are keen to increase our practical skills in landscaping through planting trees, shrubs and flower beds. An important part of our overall vision is to create an environment that is both more peaceful and also more stimulating and which would encourage our students to take a pride and interest in our garden.
