In 2012/13, as part of our theme of Volunteering, we awarded 4 nominated community groups £50 each and presented them with a certificate. We think that celebrating the fantastic contribution made to community life by individual volunteers and groups is really important so we would like to make Community Awards a fixed annual feature of the Area Board's programme.

<b>*What is Participatory Budgeting?</b> Participatory Budgeting (PB) involves local people in deciding how a defined portion of public resources will be allocated. It attempts to ensure that public spending is consistent with citizens' needs and priorities.		The Area Board is asked to set aside £1500 revenue funding for 2014/15: £500 for event costs such as hall booking and refreshments; £1000 to be available to the successful community groups. It is also asked to consider holding a special event in January 2015. Funding implications are set out in the Community Grant report.
