enough there is insufficient or no emergency lighting on exterior fire exits cabling is open to the elements when it should be in exterior containment. The majority of external lighting is very old and attempts to fix it have resulted in a mixture of additional issues one being that one of the lights is on permanently. This project aims to provide enough light in required areas whilst being mindful of nearby properties.
