LICENSING COMMITTEE

PROCEDURAL RULES FOR THE HEARING OF LICENSING ACT 2003 APPLICATIONS

1 Purpose

- 1.1 These rules have been prepared to facilitate proper consideration of licence applications, made under the Licensing Act 2003, by the Licensing Committee and its Sub Committees.
- 1.2 The rules set out a framework for how applications are to be heard and explain the role of the participants at the Hearing.

2 Definitions

- 2.1 The following definitions describe the participants at and the subject matter of a Hearing:

“Applicant” means the person who has submitted an Application for consideration by the Committee.

“Applicant’s Premises” means premises subject to the Application.

“Applicant’s Representative” means a person attending a Hearing to assist or represent an Applicant including a lawyer.

“Application” means an application for the Grant/Variation/Transfer/Review and any other decision to be made by the Committee/Sub-Committee in respect of a Licence.

“Chairperson” means the Member who is the Chairperson of the Committee for the particular Hearing.

“Committee” means the Council’s Licensing Committee and includes any Sub Committee of the Licensing Committee.

“Committee Lawyer” means the Council’s Lawyer (including an external Lawyer instructed by the Council’s Legal & Democratic Services Manager) who is present at a Hearing to advise the Chairperson and the Members.

“Committee Manager” means the Council’s Officer who is present at a Hearing to take minutes.

“Committee Report” means the Licensing Officer’s written report to the Committee concerning an Application, a copy of which has been previously

made available to the Applicant or their Representative, a Responsible Authority or their Representative or any person/s or their representative who have made a Relevant Representation.

“Hearing” means a meeting of the Committee at which an Application is considered.

“Licence” means a Licence which the Committee has the power or duty inter alia to grant, transfer, suspend or revoke.

“Licensing Officer” means the Council’s Licensing Officer(s) who is/are present at a Hearing to present reports in respect of an Application and to give technical advice in respect of an Application to the Committee when requested.

“Licensing Authority” the Council in whose geographical area the subject matter of the Application relates to, and includes the Council’s Licensing Committee, any Sub Committee of the Licensing Committee and a Licensing Officer.

“Member” means a Member who is a Member of the Committee that is considering an Application.

“Responsible Authority” means a person who is present at a Hearing to make representations in respect of an Application in their capacity as Responsible Authority and includes any person who is present to assist or make representations on behalf of the Responsible Authority including a Lawyer.

“Person making a Relevant Representation” means a person who is present at a Hearing to make a representation in respect of an Application and includes any person who is present to assist or make representations on behalf of that person including a Lawyer.

3 Key Principles

- 3.1 The principles of ‘natural justice’, and Article 6 ‘Right to a Fair Trial’, which is one of the Convention Rights in the Human Rights Act 1998, require that there is a fair Hearing of Applications.
- 3.2 Natural justice is an umbrella term for the legal standards of basic fairness. This will include that:
 - 3.2.1 the Applicant has an opportunity to make representations before a decision is made;
 - 3.2.2 those making representations have an opportunity to voice their representations before a decision is made;

- 3.2.3 the Applicant has an adequate opportunity to consider and respond to any submissions made by a Responsible Authority/Authorities and/or any person/s who have made a Relevant Representation;
- 3.2.4 the Committee does not exclude an Applicant from a Hearing in order to consider submissions from a Responsible Authority/Authorities and/or any person/s who have made a Relevant Representation.
- 3.3 It is also fundamental that there is an orderly presentation of submissions at a Hearing so that the relevant issues are properly understood, evidence is tested and that oral statements made at the Hearing are accurately recorded.
- 3.4 Ultimately the Chairperson determines the application of these rules, having regard to any submissions being made by those present and in particular the Committee Lawyer.

4 The Hearing

- 4.1 The Hearing shall take place in public.
 - 4.1.1 The Committee may exclude the public from all or part of the Hearing where it considers it to be in the public interest to do so and, in accordance with the Local Government (Access to Information) Act 1985, as amended. Public includes a party and any person assisting or representing a party.
 - 4.1.2 The Committee may require any person attending the Hearing who, in its opinion, is behaving in a disruptive manner, to leave the Hearing and may:
 - a refuse to permit them to return;
 - b permit them to return only on such conditions as the Committee may specify;
 - c in the event that a person is required to leave a Hearing that person may, before the end of the Hearing, submit to the Committee in writing any information which they would have given orally.
- 4.2 Prior to the Hearing commencing, the Chairperson shall advise the parties of the procedure it proposes to follow at the Hearing.
- 4.3 Where a party has previously requested permission for a person(s), other than their representative, to appear at the Hearing then the Committee shall consider whether to permit that request.
- 4.4 The Committee will allow the parties an equal maximum period of time in which to exercise their rights.
- 4.5 This equal maximum time may have been notified in advance of the Hearing;
- 4.6 Where there is a number of people who have made a Relevant Representation who have attended the Hearing to make the same

representation then the Committee would normally require that a spokesperson be appointed by them to make the representations on behalf of all of those who have made a Relevant Representation.

5 Presentation of Submissions

5.1 The Chairperson will introduce the Application.

5.2 In the event that the Licensing Authority has given notice to a party requiring clarification on a point(s) then that party shall respond to the points raised by the Licensing Authority.

5.3 Submissions shall be made in the following order unless the Chairperson directs otherwise:

5.3.1 The Licensing Officer will orally present the Committee Report and will in particular advise the Committee as to:

- a the options available to it;
- b the considerations that are relevant in reaching its decision.

5.3.2 The Review Applicant (or the Applicant's Representative) will orally present its submission which may include:

- a presenting their case in accordance with the papers, which will have been circulated with Agenda papers;
- b confirming key information and answer pertinent questions; and
- c calling witnesses in support of the Application (see paragraph 4.3).

A Responsible Authority/Authorities and/or any person/s who have made a Relevant Representation will orally present their representations in turn which shall include:

- a the grounds of the representation to the Application; and
- b any condition(s) that the Responsible Authority/Authorities and/or any person/s who have made a Relevant Representation would be happy to have the Application granted subject to which would cause the representation to be withdrawn.

The Premises Licence Holder and/or their representative will orally present their representations which shall include;

- a The response to the representations made by the Review Applicant, a Responsible Authority/Authorities and/or any person/s who have made a Relevant Representation; and
- b Whether they would be happy to accept any modifications to the Licence as suggested by the Review Applicant, a Responsible Authority/Authorities and/or any person/s who have made a Relevant Representation.

6 Questioning of Submissions

- 6.1 The Chairperson will regulate the order in which questions are asked by Members.
- 6.2 The Chairperson and Members, voiced through the Chairperson, may question any party following the completion of their submission.
- 6.3 The Chairperson will normally permit the Applicant, a Responsible Authority/Authorities or any person/s who have made a Relevant Representation to ask questions through them of the other parties.
- 6.4 The Chairperson may direct that questions which are not relevant to the Application or one of the four Licensing Objectives are not formally put or answered.

7 Documentation

- 7.1 No party shall present new documentation to the Committee at the Hearing other than with the consent of all of the other parties. This does not preclude the Licensing Officer from correcting errors, providing updated information or an extract from a local map showing the Applicant's Premises in the context of the surrounding premises and any person/s who has made a Relevant Representation's premises. If any party is granted permission to present supplementary papers at the Hearing they shall provide at least 10 copies at the start of their submission.

8 Intervention

The Chairperson shall permit the following interventions at any point in the Hearing:

- 8.1 The Committee Lawyer to advise the Committee on issues of law, procedure and relevant considerations on decision making. If necessary, the Chairperson may require the Committee, the Committee Lawyer and the Committee Manager to leave the Hearing so that advice can be given.
- 8.2 The Committee Manager to advise the Committee on procedure generally, or to request that statements made are repeated for reasons of clarity and so that they can be properly recorded.
- 8.3 The Licensing Officer to seek to clarify statements that have been made in light of information held on their file.

9 Failure of Parties to Attend Hearing

- 9.1 If a party has informed the Licensing Authority that it does not intend to attend or be represented at a Hearing, the Hearing may proceed in its absence.

- 9.2 If a party has not indicated that it does not intend to attend or be represented at a Hearing and fails to attend or be represented at the Hearing then the Licensing Authority may:
- 9.2.1 where it considers it be necessary in the public interest, adjourn the Hearing to a specified date; or
 - 9.2.2 hold the Hearing in the party's absence.
- 9.3 Where the Licensing Authority holds a Hearing in the absence of a party, it shall consider at the Hearing the application, representations or notice made by that party.

10 Closing Submissions

- 10.1 The Chairperson shall allow first, the Responsible Authority/Authorities and any person/s who have made a Relevant Representation to make a closing oral submission(s) and secondly invite the Applicant or the Applicant's Representative an opportunity to make an oral closing submission in support of the Application.

11 Decision

- 11.1 The Committee, the Committee Lawyer and the Committee Manager, shall retire so that the decision may be considered in private, and to consider any legal issues raised by the Members.
- 11.2 The decision, and reasons for the decision, of the Committee shall be communicated orally by the Chairperson to the parties after the Committee has deliberated in private on the Application.
- 11.3 Written reasons shall be provided soon after the deliberations of the Application and in any event within the statutory time limits.

Review Hearing Procedure Summary

1. The Democratic Services Officer will request nominations for a Chairman for the Hearing.
2. The Chairperson welcomes all those present and introduces the Application.
3. The Chairperson invites the Sub Committee Members, Council Officers, the Review Applicant and/or their representative, any Responsible Authorities and/or any person who has made a Relevant Representation and the Premises Licence Holder and/or their representative to introduce themselves.
4. The Chairperson outlines the Hearing Procedure.
5. The Licensing Officer presents the Committee Report and outlines the application.
6. The Review Applicant and/or their representative address the Sub Committee to present their case.
7. Questions to the Review Applicant by Members of the Sub Committee, any Responsible Authorities and/or any person's who have made a Relevant Representation and the Premises Licence Holder.
8. Responsible Authorities and/or any person/s who have made a Relevant Representation address the Sub Committee.
9. Questions to any of the Responsible Authorities and/or any person's who have made a Relevant Representation by Members of the Sub Committee, the Review Applicant and the Premises Licence Holder.
10. The Premises Licence Holder and/or their representative address the Sub Committee to present their case.
11. Questions to the Premises Licence Holder by Members of the Sub Committee, any Responsible Authorities and/or any person/s who have made a Relevant Representation and the Review Applicant.
12. Summing up by the Responsible Authorities and/or any person's who have made Relevant Representations.
13. Summing up by the Premises Licence Holder.
14. Summing up by the Review Applicant.
15. The Sub Committee retires with the Committee Lawyer and Committee Manager to consider its decision.
16. The Sub Committee returns and the Lawyer gives a summary of any legal advice that may have been given to the Sub Committee.
17. The Chairperson either gives the decision with reasons, or advises that it will be released in writing with reasons within the statutory time limits.

Application for Review of a Premises Licence; New Inn, 10-16 High Street, Salisbury, Wiltshire, SP4 7DL

1. Purpose of Report

- 1.1 To determine an application for a Review of a Premises Licence in respect of New Inn, 10-16 High Street, Amesbury, Wiltshire, SP4 7DL made by Wiltshire Police.

2. Background Information

- 2.1 An application for the Review of the premises licence for the New Inn, 10-16 High Street, Amesbury, Wiltshire, SP4 7DL has been made by Wiltshire Police. Following advertisement of the application 12 relevant representations have also been received.
- 2.2 Wiltshire Council (as the Licensing Authority) must hold a hearing to consider the review application and any representations received. In accordance with Section 52 (3) of The Licensing Act 2003 the Licensing Sub Committee is required to take such steps as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- 2.3 The licensing objectives are:
- i) The Prevention of Crime and Disorder;
 - ii) Public Safety;
 - iii) The Prevention of Public Nuisance; and
 - iv) The Protection of Children from Harm.
- 2.4 Such steps are:
- i) To modify the conditions of the licence.
 - ii) To exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence.
 - iii) To suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months.
 - iv) To revoke the licence.
 - v) To determine that no steps are necessary.

Government Guidance issued under s.182 of the Licensing Act states that:

“Licensing Authorities should also note that modifications of conditions and exclusions of licensable activities may be imposed either permanently or for a temporary period of up to three months. Temporary changes or suspension of the licence for up to three months could impact on the business holding the

licence financially and would only be expected to be pursued as a necessary means of promoting the licensing objectives. So, for instance, a licence could be suspended for a weekend as a means of deterring the holder from allowing the problems that gave rise to the review to happen again. However, it will always be important that any detrimental financial impact that may result from a licensing authority's decision is necessary and proportionate to the promotion of the licensing objectives”

- 2.5 The current licence holder, Keystone Public Houses Ltd, was granted a licence for this premises issued under the Licensing Act 2003 on 4 February 2020. The directors of Keystone Public Houses Ltd are Mr Nathan Muirhead and Miss Chantelle Strong. Mr Muirhead held the position as DPS on the licence from 4 February 2020 until 2 December 2021 when the licence was varied to appoint Miss Strong as DPS.
- 2.6 The premises has held a premises licence under the Licensing Act 2003 since 24 November 2005.
- 2.7 A copy of the current premises licence LN/000043211 issued following the application to vary the DPS on 2 December 2021 is attached as **Appendix 1**.
- 2.8 On 28 October 2021 an application to vary the premises licence was made by Keystone Public House Ltd. Following the submission of the review application by Wiltshire Police, the variation application was withdrawn on 30 November 2021 during its consultation period (The consultation period for the variation application had been extended due to the blue notices failing to correctly advertise the variation application),
- 2.9 On 22 December 2021 Wiltshire Police made a correction to the appendix which was submitted with their review application. The correction related to a former premises licence known as The Bank which had been owned by Keystone Entertainment Ltd. The corrected appendix was emailed by Wiltshire Police to Wiltshire Council and Chantelle Strong. (**Appendix 2**)
- 2.10 On 22 December 2021 an email with attached letter was sent from Chantelle Strong to Wiltshire Police asking for the review application to be withdrawn (**Appendix 3**). The Police responded to this request on 31 December 2021 (**Appendix 4**).

Application to Transfer Licence LN/000043211

- 2.10 On 5 January 2022 an application was made by Mr Muirhead's mother, Mrs Katharine Clark, to transfer the licence into her name. Wiltshire Police objected to this application on 10 January 2022. The consultation period for the transfer application will end on 19 January 2022. The Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005 state that a hearing must be held to determine a transfer application within 20 working days beginning with the day after the end of the period within which an objection can be made.

3. Details of the Grounds for Review

- 3.1 The review of the licence has been requested on the grounds that the premises have been conducted in such a manner as to prejudice the licensing objectives; The Prevention of Crime and Disorder, Public Safety and the Prevention of Public Nuisance. The grounds for review are:
- The Licence holder's failure to comply with conditions attached to their premise licence and to promote the licensing objectives under the Licensing Act 2003
 - Significant incidents have taken place at the premises which relate to potential offences under the Licensing Act 2003. Wiltshire Police have no confidence in the ability of the management /licence holder to provide any demonstrable compliance with or promotion of the Licencing Objectives. In particular the prevention of crime and disorder, public safety and the prevention of public nuisance
- 3.2 The application for review is attached as **Appendix 5**. The evidence relied upon in support of the application is contained within **Appendices 5a and 5b**.

4. Consultation and Representations

- 4.1 The review process requires a public notice to be posted on the premises for a period of 28 days together with a copy of the notice posted at the offices of Wiltshire Council, Bourne Hill, Salisbury. During the consultation period relevant representations have been received from Wiltshire Council's Licensing Authority, Wiltshire Council's Environmental Protection and Control and 10 members of the public

- 4.2 The Sub Committee can take into account documentary or other information presented at the hearing with the consent of all other parties.

4.3 A location map of the premises and relevant representations is attached as **Appendix 7**

5. Legal Implications

5.1 This hearing is governed by the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations. These provide that hearings should be held in public unless the Licensing Authority considers that the public interest in excluding the public outweighs the public interest in the hearing taking place in public.

6. Officer Recommendations

6.1 Officers are not permitted to make a recommendation – the decision is to be reached by the members of the Licensing Sub Committee.

7. Right of Appeal

7.1 It should be noted that the Premises Licence Holder, the party that applied for the review and any Responsible Authority or Interested Parties who have made representations may appeal the decision made by the Licensing Sub Committee to the Magistrates Court. The appeal must be lodged with the Magistrates Court within 21 days of the notification of the decision.

7.2 The decision of the Licensing Sub Committee does not take effect until the end of the period for appealing against that decision. In the event of an appeal being lodged, the decision made by the Licensing Sub Committee does not take effect until any appeal is heard and finally determined.

7.3 The Premises Licence Holder and all Interested Parties have been informed of the date, time and location of the hearing and their right to attend and be represented.

ANNEX 1 - MANDATORY CONDITIONS

Supply of Alcohol

1. Where this Licence authorises the supply of alcohol:

No supply of alcohol may be made under this licence:

- (a) At a time when there is no Designated Premises Supervisor in respect of the Premises Licence
- (b) At a time when the Designated Premises Supervisor does not hold a Personal Licence or his Personal Licence is suspended

Every retail sale or supply of alcohol made under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a Personal Licence.

Exhibition of Films

1. Where a premises licence authorises the exhibition of films, the licence must include a condition requiring the admission of children to the exhibition of any film to be restricted in accordance with this section.
2. Where the film classification body is specified in the licence, unless subsection (3)(b) applies, admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation by that body.
3. Where:-
 - (a) The film classification body is not specified in the licence, or
 - (b) The relevant licensing authority has notified the holder of the licence that this subsection applies to the film in question,

admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that licensing authority.

4. In this section “children” means any person aged under 18; and

“film classification body” means the person or persons designated as the authority under Section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984(c39) (authority to determine suitability of video works for classification).

Irresponsible Promotions

1. The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
2. In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
 - i. drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - ii. drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability)

Free Tap Water

1. The responsible person must ensure that free potable tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available. (*This means that responsible persons at all premises must ensure customers are provided with potable (drinking) water for free if they ask for it.*)

Age Verification Policy

1.
 - (a) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (b) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (c) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - i. a holographic mark, or.
 - ii. an ultraviolet feature.

Drink Volume Measures

1. The responsible person shall ensure that:
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:
 - i. beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - ii. gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - iii. still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
2. these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and.
3. where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

Permitted Price

1.
 - (a) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
 - (b) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—
 - A. “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - B. “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula—
$$P = D + (D \times V)$$
where—
 - i. P is the permitted price,
 - ii. D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - iii. V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
 - C. “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—
 - i. the holder of the premises licence,
 - ii. the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - iii. the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
 - D. “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
 - E. “value added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
2. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph B of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
3. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph B of paragraph 2 on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Door Supervision (except theatres, cinemas, bingo halls and casinos)

1. Where a premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, each such individual must:
 - (a) be authorised to carry out that activity by a licence granted under the Private Security Industry Act 2001; or
 - (b) be entitled to carry out that activity by virtue of section 4 of the Act.
2. But nothing in subsection (1) requires such a condition to be imposed:
 - (a) in respect of premises within paragraph 8(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (c12) (premises with premises licences authorising plays or films); or

(b) in respect of premises in relation to:

- i. any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of that Schedule (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or
- ii. any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of that Schedule (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act).

3. For the purposes of this section:

- (a) "security activity" means an activity to which paragraph 2(1)(a) of that Schedule applies, and, which is licensable conduct for the purposes of that Act, (see Section 3(2) of that Act) and
- (b) paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule.

ANNEX 2B – OPERATING SCHEDULE

PREVENTION OF PUBLIC NUISANCE

- The outside area will be limited to background music only (not regulated entertainment), which will be inaudible beyond the perimeter of the premises. This will be limited to April to September inclusive.
- The background music outside will cease at or before 23:00hrs.
- The use of the external drinking area will cease at or before 23:30hrs.
- Entrance and exit to the 'sound proofed' function room will always be via the acoustic lobby which has two sets of doors, so music does not escape.
- Notices will be displayed reminding customers to respect neighbours and leave quietly.
- The DPS (or nominee) will manage the exit of customers from the premises so as to prevent public nuisance.
- All windows and doors closed from 23:30hrs.
- A noise limiter will be provided to limit the sound from both live and recorded music to prevent public nuisance.

PUBLIC SAFETY

- Indoor sporting events shall be limited to those normally described as pub games.

PROTECTION OF CHILDREN FROM HARM

- Persons under 16 will not be permitted on the premises after 22:00hrs.

PREVENTION OF CRIME AND DISORDER

- Two Door Supervisors will be provided from 22:30hrs when functions and regulated entertainment are provided.

- No entry or re-entry after 00:30hrs.







NEW INN - APPLICATION TO REVIEW - APPENDIX 1

Amesbury town centre consists of a number of small businesses and residents (80% residential) and contains 4 main licensed premises within the areas of Salisbury Street and High Street.

Over an extended period of time and now certainly since the re-opening of licensed premises on the 19/7/21 there has been a very high number of complaints from members of the public concerning things such as loud music, urinating/vomiting on residents property and in residents doorways and multiple reports of fighting/disorder in both of those streets.

Two of the licensed premises, namely The Bell Inn and The George Hotel close at 23:59. The Bell has been observed to always close dead on time, but The George Hotel often closes early, sometimes as early as 21:00 hrs.

The remaining two main licensed premises, namely The New Inn and The Kings Arms stay open until 02:30 hrs on a Thursday, Friday and Saturday night and it is between the hours of 23:59 - 02:30 on those days where almost all the incidents take place.

Historically there has always been a considerable number of drink/drug related incidents in this small town but since 19/7/21 there has been 17 (to date) reports made to the police concerning The New Inn either directly i.e. at or inside the premises or very nearby that can be attributed to over-intoxicated clientele who've come from the premises. This includes incidents of disorder/fighting in both large and small groups, assaults of various degrees of severity and over-intoxication. It is also felt that drug use and drug dealing is a regular occurrence at the premises.

Large numbers of over-intoxicated clientele are often observed to be leaving the New Inn between the hours of 02:00 - 02:30 hrs on Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights.

The subject of over-intoxication has been discussed numerous times over the last few months either directly with the DPS, Mr Nathan MUIRHEAD or discussed in open forum at local Pubwatch meetings where, more often than not, a representative from the pub has been in attendance. All Pub watch members are fully aware of the issue of over-intoxication in the town and the misery it brings to residents. Again, it must be emphasised that the over-intoxication is observed to be taking place between the hours of 23:59 - 03:00 hrs.

During recent discussions, Mr MUIRHEAD has displayed a level of ignorance towards the issues caused by over-intoxication and has appeared unconvinced/disbelieving of what has been described to him by Police Licensing Officer, Mr Alastair DAY.

The observations are that the New Inn is the main source of the over-intoxication in the town, despite the many discussions between police licensing, the DPS and other representatives from the pub.

Additionally, there has been a high number of complaints regarding loud music coming from the pub causing considerable public nuisance to the residents of Salisbury Street and the surrounding areas. This nuisance is on-going despite several months of engagement with both Wiltshire Council Environmental Health Officer (Vicky BROWN) and Police Licensing Officer (Alastair DAY). In respect of these on-going complaints Mr MUIRHEAD was directed to produce a noise management plan (NMP) and install sound limiting equipment within The Stables part of the premises. This equipment was inspected several months ago by aforementioned Vicky BROWN and Alastair DAY and the volume was set at a level that, at that time could not be heard by local residents with their windows open and that limit was locked into the equipment and the password only known to police and council authorities. Both live and recorded music must be plumbed into that equipment so that the sound level does not exceed the level that was set. However, on a recent visit and meeting at the pub, that equipment had been removed from The Stables part of the pub and replaced with different equipment from inside the pub, the sound limiter on which was observed to working intermittently and was easily adjustable. The removal of the original equipment is viewed by the police as a deliberate attempt to circumnavigate the sound level that was agreed and written into the NMP.

The latest complaint regarding noise from music emanating from the pub is from the weekend of 19/21 November 2021, many months after engagement started with responsible authorities.

Mr MUIRHEAD recently applied to vary the conditions of his current licence to include the use of a part of the pub called The Jaeger Bar and to extend the use of the area known as The Courtyard. Following the submission of that application it was noted by licensing staff that his current licence contains a condition that the use of the courtyard shall cease at or before 23:30 hrs. The Courtyard has historically been in continual use for several years up until 02:00 hrs on a Thursday, Friday and Saturday evening but the condition hadn't been enforced as, due to an oversight it hadn't been spotted. Mr MUIRHEAD was arguably aware of this condition but has continually used the courtyard after 23:30 hrs for many years. However, this condition was immediately pointed out to him and he was directed by both Council Licensing Officer (Carla ADKINS) and PLO Alastair DAY that the use of the courtyard after 23:30 hrs must cease with immediate effect until such times as a variation to that condition had been agreed. Mr MUIRHEAD initially argued that he didn't feel that this condition could be enforced, and it was again reiterated to him that it would be from thereon in.

However, during the evening of Saturday the 13/11/21 PLO Alastair DAY spoke to Mr MUIRHEAD at The New Inn and the focus of that discussion was on the use of courtyard and the fact that its' use should cease at or before 23:30 hrs that evening. Mr MUIRHEAD agreed that this was the case. He was also informed that another visit would be made after that time to ensure compliance.

Mr DAY returned to the pub at 01:00 hrs in company with a police officer and both observed the courtyard in full use with the area containing approximately 50-60 people, several of whom were consuming alcohol. This observation went on for approximately 10 mins before a member of the door staff was asked to find Mr MUIRHEAD who was in The Stables building. During this short period several very intoxicated persons were also observed to leave the premises as well.

The matter was pointed out to Mr MUIRHEAD and he was notified that it would be reported to Wiltshire Council Licensing as a clear breach of his premises licence conditions.

Following that visit, Mr DAY returned to the premises at a little after 02:00 hrs on the morning of 14/11/21 to observe clientele leaving the pub and it could be clearly seen that many were over-intoxicated. In particular, 2 females came out of the courtyard gate and into the pub car park in a very intoxicated state and went on to cause a considerable public order incident in the street. These females had been present in the pub during the visit at 22:00 hrs 13/11. It would be fair to describe their level of intoxication as being way past a score of 10 on scale of 1 to 10.

This incident caused a high level of public nuisance, so much so that the Manager of The George Hotel opposite came out into the street to complain and he was followed by paying residents in the hotel who'd been awoken by all of the screaming and shouting and police presence.

Mr MUIRHEAD was able to observe the whole incident as he was present in the car park at the time.

Subsequently to these incidents, Mr MUIRHEAD was issued with a formal warning in respect of both breaching a condition of his premises licence (use of the courtyard) and a breach of S.141 of the Licensing Act 2003, serving alcohol to a person who is drunk.

It is acknowledged that not all the issues in Amesbury are caused solely by over-intoxication and that some incidents can be attributed to the illegal use of drugs and several dealers have been identified and arrested.

During the evening of 3/10/21 one of those identified dealers was arrested directly outside The New Inn and was found to be in possession of several hundred pounds in cash and over 8 grams of the class B drug, ketamine. It was confirmed by door staff at the New Inn that this drug dealer had been inside the pub for several hours. There is police intelligence available that illustrates a clear personal link between this dealer and a former member of the New Inn door staff and the police suspect that this member of staff was facilitating drug dealing within the premises and that person was employed by the pub at this time but has since been dismissed over another matter.

On the 9/11/21, a female was found in Salisbury Street in what can only be described as a stupefied state. Thankfully she was accompanied by her boyfriend. She had previously been in The Bell and it was staff there who called the police. Subsequent enquiries have revealed that she had been in The New Inn from approximately 19:30 - 22:30 and that her boyfriend had consumed 14 or 15 double rums and she herself

had consumed approximately 12 alcoholic drinks. She was in a very vulnerable state and ended up being taken to hospital where blood samples have been taken for toxicology.

Following the events of 13/14 Nov '21 a meeting was arranged at the premises for the 17/11/21 to discuss these matters. Present at that meeting was the licence holder and his partner, the Local police commander Inspector Tina OSBORN, PLO Alastair DAY and Wiltshire Council Environmental health Officer Vicky BROWN. During this meeting the licence holder and his partner were specifically asked about measures that they have in place to deter drug users and/or drug dealers coming into the premises. The answer that was given was that if they didn't let drug users/drug dealers into the premises then they wouldn't have any customers!

This has caused grave concerns for the police in that it now presents a real possibility that the licence holder may knowingly be allowing drug use/dealing to take place on the premises?

Further to that meeting an incident took place at the premises in the early hours of the morning of 26/11/21 whereby customers are seen to be leaving the premises in a very intoxicated state, one of whom was subsequently arrested for being drunk & disorderly. Other customers, also highly intoxicated are seen to leave the premises and head into Salisbury Street where they start shouting and swearing loudly and then verbally abuse police officers who are trying to deal with the earlier detainee. This is another illustration that the licence holder seems incapable of upholding the licensing objectives and continues to over serve alcohol to customers despite the high level of engagement, explanation and encouragement that has taken place over the last 12 months.

Engagement with residents and a local residents committee highlights the level of misery that they have put up with for a very long period of time and a large percentage of their vitriol is directed at this particular premises, the New Inn.

Police body worn video footage is stored on police systems and can be made available for viewing. Properly redacted incidents reported to the police and subsequently logged will be presented in appendix style along with records of complaints from local residents.

Wiltshire Police are seeking Revocation of the Premise Licence, as there is no confidence in the ability of the management to provide any demonstrable compliance with or promotion of the Licensing Objectives, together with Licensing Act Offences.

APPLICATION TO REVIEW A PREMISES LICENCE - THE NEW INN AMESBURY

Dear Alastair, Linda and Vicky

Having considered the application from Wiltshire Police and the representations of responsible authorities, we are extremely saddened by the situation and disappointed by the collective effort to revoke our premises licence, resulting in the closure of The New Inn.

The New Inn has been a public house for just over 200 years, and it is a hub for the community. Under our ownership, we have hosted a range of music and entertainment events which have been well attended and well supported. The New Inn is one of the most popular venues in the town centre, attracting around 500-600 unique customers per week. We appreciate that your attention is rightly on those matters that require improvement, but we also ask that you do not ignore the majority of occasions where the pub has been well managed and well frequented. There are significantly more positives coming out of The New Inn than negative and we know that the community would be devastated by its closure.

The issues of crime and disorder appear to be relatively new. In 2018 when The Bank was open, we were able to take positive steps, working closely with the Amesbury Residents Committee, Wiltshire Police and Wiltshire Council, that led to a reduction in crime and disorder in the town centre. There was certainly no review of our licence as suggested by Wiltshire Police. We firmly believe that we can work constructively with authorities and residents to manage the existing issues and return to a safe and enjoyable nightlife.

We do recognise the issues raised by Wiltshire Police and other responsible authorities and we believe that we have taken significant steps to reduce the risk of crime and disorder, public nuisance and safety of the public. As a result of these actions, we ask that Wiltshire Police reconsider the application with a view to withdrawing it.

In the last month, we have implemented measures that will instil confidence in Wiltshire Police and Wiltshire Council:

- The nominated Designated Premises Supervisor has been changed
- All members of staff have received additional training around intoxication and drugs
- The Stables closes at 12.30am

- The courtyard is not in use after 11.30pm other than for smoking
- A Door Supervisor is employed with the sole responsibility of monitoring the courtyard
- The games room closes at 9.00pm
- Door supervisors are more proactive in assessing levels of intoxication at the point of entry
- Known drugs users and dealers have been barred
- We have increased the frequency of checks on the door eg bags and coats
- We have closed earlier over two weekends to measure the impact on the streets

If Wiltshire Police withdraw their application, we will submit a variation to formalise the following changes, thereby going further in promoting the four licensing objectives.

- Reduce the hours of operation on Friday and Saturday from 1200 to 0230 to 0130
- Move the noise limiting device back to pub and install a new limiter in The Stables
- All regulated entertainment to stop at 0100
- Monthly meetings with responsible authorities to review progress
- Implement Best Bar None with a view to seek accreditation within 6 months
- Implement monthly training sessions with the team to focus on key areas of the Licensing Act and best practice
- Implement regular meetings with the ARC, key venues and Wiltshire Police with a view to proactively manage disorder in the town centre
- Permit use of the courtyard to 0100 with an agreed NMP in place (we strongly believe that this will have a positive impact, not negative)

We stand by to defend our position through the review process, but we would much rather work with authorities to ensure the long term future of The New Inn. Were The New Inn to close, the community would lose a valuable asset, 16 members of staff would lose their job and 5 residents would lose their home. We strongly believe that steps can be taken to reverse the opinion of authorities and The New Inn can be an enjoyable and safe place for customers. We also believe that efforts over the last month help demonstrate how seriously we are taking this situation.

Amesbury town centre consists of a number of small businesses and residents (80% residential) and contains 4 main licensed premises within the areas of Salisbury Street and High Street.

Over an extended period of time and now certainly since the re-opening of licensed premises on the 19/7/21 there has been a very high number of complaints from members of the public concerning things such as loud music, urinating/vomiting on residents property and in residents doorways and multiple reports of fighting/disorder in both of those streets.

Two of the licensed premises, namely The Bell Inn and The George Hotel close at 23:59. The Bell has been observed to always close dead on time, but The George Hotel often closes early, sometimes as early as 21:00 hrs.

The remaining two main licensed premises, namely The New Inn and The Kings Arms stay open until 02:30 hrs on a Thursday, Friday and Saturday night and it is between the hours of 23:59 - 02:30 on those days where almost all the incidents take place.

Historically there has always been a considerable number of drink/drug related incidents in this small town but since 19/7/21 there has been 17 (to date) reports made to the police concerning The New Inn either directly i.e. at or inside the premises or very nearby that can be attributed to over-intoxicated clientele who've come from the premises. This includes incidents of disorder/fighting in both large and small groups, assaults of various degrees of severity and over-intoxication. It is also felt that drug use and drug dealing is a regular occurrence at the premises.

Large numbers of over-intoxicated clientele are often observed to be leaving the New Inn between the hours of 02:00 - 02:30 hrs on Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights.

The subject of over-intoxication has been discussed numerous times over the last few months either directly with the DPS, Mr Nathan MUIRHEAD or discussed in open forum at local Pubwatch meetings where, more often than not, a representative from the pub has been in attendance. All Pub watch members are fully aware of the issue of over-intoxication in the town and the misery it brings to residents. Again, it must be emphasised that the over-intoxication is observed to be taking place between the hours of 23:59 - 03:00 hrs.

During recent discussions, Mr MUIRHEAD has displayed a level of ignorance towards the issues caused by over-intoxication and has appeared unconvinced/disbelieving of what has been described to him by Police Licensing Officer, Mr Alastair DAY.

The observations are that the New Inn is the main source of the over-intoxication in the town, despite the many discussions between police licensing, the DPS and other representatives from the pub.

Additionally, there has been a high number of complaints regarding loud music coming from the pub causing considerable public nuisance

to the residents of Salisbury Street and the surrounding areas. This nuisance is on-going despite several months of engagement with both Wiltshire Council Environmental Health Officer (Vicky BROWN) and Police Licensing Officer (Alastair DAY). In respect of these on-going complaints Mr MUIRHEAD was directed to produce a noise management plan (NMP) and install sound limiting equipment within The Stables part of the premises. This equipment was inspected several months ago by aforementioned Vicky BROWN and Alastair DAY and the volume was set at a level that, at that time could not be heard by local residents with their windows open and that limit was locked into the equipment and the password only known to police and council authorities. Both live and recorded music must be plumbed into that equipment so that the sound level does not exceed the level that was set. However, on a recent visit and meeting at the pub, that equipment had been removed from The Stables part of the pub and replaced with different equipment from inside the pub, the sound limiter on which was observed to working intermittently and was easily adjustable. The removal of the original equipment is viewed by the police as a deliberate attempt to circumnavigate the sound level that was agreed and written into the NMP.

The latest complaint regarding noise from music emanating from the pub is from the weekend of 19/21 November 2021, many months after engagement started with responsible authorities.

Mr MUIRHEAD recently applied to vary the conditions of his current licence to include the use of a part of the pub called The Jaeger Bar and to extend the use of the area known as The Courtyard. Following the submission of that application it was noted by licensing staff that his current licence contains a condition that the use of the courtyard shall cease at or before 23:30 hrs. The Courtyard has historically been in continual use for several years up until 02:00 hrs on a Thursday, Friday and Saturday evening but the condition hadn't been enforced as, due to an oversight it hadn't been spotted. Mr MUIRHEAD was arguably aware of this condition but has continually used the courtyard after 23:30 hrs for many years. However, this condition was immediately pointed out to him and he was directed by both Council Licensing Officer (Carla ADKINS) and PLO Alastair DAY that the use of the courtyard after 23:30 hrs must cease with immediate effect until such times as a variation to that condition had been agreed. Mr MUIRHEAD initially argued that he didn't feel that this condition could be enforced, and it was again reiterated to him that it would be from thereon in.

However, during the evening of Saturday the 13/11/21 PLO Alastair DAY spoke to Mr MUIRHEAD at The New Inn and the focus of that discussion was on the use of courtyard and the fact that its' use should cease at or before 23:30 hrs that evening. Mr MUIRHEAD agreed that this was the case. He was also informed that another visit would be made after that time to ensure compliance.

Mr DAY returned to the pub at 01:00 hrs in company with a police officer and both observed the courtyard in full use with the area

containing approximately 50-60 people, several of whom were consuming alcohol. This observation went on for approximately 10 mins before a member of the door staff was asked to find Mr MUIRHEAD who was in The Stables building. During this short period several very intoxicated persons were also observed to leave the premises as well.

The matter was pointed out to Mr MUIRHEAD and he was notified that it would be reported to Wiltshire Council Licensing as a clear breach of his premises licence conditions.

Following that visit, Mr DAY returned to the premises at a little after 02:00 hrs on the morning of 14/11/21 to observe clientele leaving the pub and it could be clearly seen that many were over-intoxicated. In particular, 2 females came out of the courtyard gate and into the pub car park in a very intoxicated state and went on to cause a considerable public order incident in the street. These females had been present in the pub during the visit at 22:00 hrs 13/11. It would be fair to describe their level of intoxication as being way past a score of 10 on scale of 1 to 10.

This incident caused a high level of public nuisance, so much so that the Manager of The George Hotel opposite came out into the street to complain and he was followed by paying residents in the hotel who'd been awoken by all of the screaming and shouting and police presence.

Mr MUIRHEAD was able to observe the whole incident as he was present in the car park at the time.

Subsequently to these incidents, Mr MUIHEAD was issued with a formal warning in respect of both breaching a condition of his premises licence (use of the courtyard) and a breach of S.141 of the Licensing Act 2003, serving alcohol to a person who is drunk.

It is acknowledged that not all the issues in Amesbury are caused solely by over-intoxication and that some incidents can be attributed to the illegal use of drugs and several dealers have been identified and arrested.

During the evening of 3/10/21 one of those identified dealers was arrested directly outside The New Inn and was found to be in possession of several hundred pounds in cash and over 8 grams of the class B drug, ketamine. It was confirmed by door staff at the New Inn that this drug dealer had been inside the pub for several hours. There is police intelligence available that illustrates a clear personal link between this dealer and a former member of the New Inn door staff and the police suspect that this member of staff was facilitating drug dealing within the premises and that person was employed by the pub at this time but has since been dismissed over another matter.

On the 9/11/21, a female was found in Salisbury Street in what can only be described as a stupefied state. Thankfully she was accompanied by her boyfriend. She had previously been in The Bell and it was staff there who called the police. Subsequent enquiries have revealed that she had been in The New Inn from approximately 19:30 - 22:30 and that her boyfriend had consumed 14 or 15 double rums and she herself

had consumed approximately 12 alcoholic drinks. She was in a very vulnerable state and ended up being taken to hospital where blood samples have been taken for toxicology.

Following the events of 13/14 Nov '21 a meeting was arranged at the premises for the 17/11/21 to discuss these matters. Present at that meeting was the licence holder and his partner, the Local police commander Inspector Tina OSBORN, PLO Alastair DAY and Wiltshire Council Environmental health Officer Vicky BROWN. During this meeting the licence holder and his partner were specifically asked about measures that they have in place to deter drug users and/or drug dealers coming into the premises. The answer that was given was that if they didn't let drug users/drug dealers into the premises then they wouldn't have any customers! This has caused grave concerns for the police in that it now presents a real possibility that the licence holder may knowingly be allowing drug use/dealing to take place on the premises?

Further to that meeting an incident took place at the premises in the early hours of the morning of 26/11/21 whereby customers are seen to be leaving the premises in a very intoxicated state, one of whom was subsequently arrested for being drunk & disorderly. Other customers, also highly intoxicated are seen to leave the premises and head into Salisbury Street where they start shouting and swearing loudly and then verbally abuse police officers who are trying to deal with the earlier detainee. This is another illustration that the licence holder seems incapable of upholding the licensing objectives and continues to over serve alcohol to customers despite the high level of engagement, explanation and encouragement that has taken place over the last 12 months.

Engagement with residents and a local residents committee highlights the level of misery that they have put up with for a very long period of time and a large percentage of their vitriol is directed at this particular premises, the New Inn.

The current licensee, Mr Nathan MUIRHEAD has run another venue in the town centre previously and this premises was also subject to a review.

Police body worn video footage is stored on police systems and can be made available for viewing.

Properly redacted incidents reported to the police and subsequently logged will be presented in appendix style along with records of complaints from local residents.

Wiltshire Police are seeking Revocation of the Premise Licence, as there is no confidence in the ability of the management to provide any demonstrable compliance with or promotion of the Licensing Objectives, together with Licensing Act Offences.

NEW INN - APPLICATION TO REVIEW - APPENDIX 1

Amesbury town centre consists of a number of small businesses and residents (80% residential) and contains 4 main licensed premises within the areas of Salisbury Street and High Street.

Over an extended period of time and now certainly since the re-opening of licensed premises on the 19/7/21 there has been a very high number of complaints from members of the public concerning things such as loud music, urinating/vomiting on residents property and in residents doorways and multiple reports of fighting/disorder in both of those streets.

Two of the licensed premises, namely The Bell Inn and The George Hotel close at 23:59. The Bell has been observed to always close dead on time, but The George Hotel often closes early, sometimes as early as 21:00 hrs.

The remaining two main licensed premises, namely The New Inn and The Kings Arms stay open until 02:30 hrs on a Thursday, Friday and Saturday night and it is between the hours of 23:59 - 02:30 on those days where almost all the incidents take place.

Historically there has always been a considerable number of drink/drug related incidents in this small town but since 19/7/21 there has been 17 (to date) reports made to the police concerning The New Inn either directly i.e. at or inside the premises or very nearby that can be attributed to over-intoxicated clientele who've come from the premises. This includes incidents of disorder/fighting in both large and small groups, assaults of various degrees of severity and over-intoxication. It is also felt that drug use and drug dealing is a regular occurrence at the premises.

Large numbers of over-intoxicated clientele are often observed to be leaving the New Inn between the hours of 02:00 - 02:30 hrs on Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights.

The subject of over-intoxication has been discussed numerous times over the last few months either directly with the DPS, Mr Nathan MUIRHEAD or discussed in open forum at local Pubwatch meetings where, more often than not, a representative from the pub has been in attendance. All Pub watch members are fully aware of the issue of over-intoxication in the town and the misery it brings to residents. Again, it must be emphasised that the over-intoxication is observed to be taking place between the hours of 23:59 - 03:00 hrs.

During recent discussions, Mr MUIRHEAD has displayed a level of ignorance towards the issues caused by over-intoxication and has appeared unconvinced/disbelieving of what has been described to him by Police Licensing Officer, Mr Alastair DAY.

The observations are that the New Inn is the main source of the over-intoxication in the town, despite the many discussions between police licensing, the DPS and other representatives from the pub.

Additionally, there has been a high number of complaints regarding loud music coming from the pub causing considerable public nuisance to the residents of Salisbury Street and the surrounding areas. This nuisance is on-going despite several months of engagement with both Wiltshire Council Environmental Health Officer (Vicky BROWN) and Police Licensing Officer (Alastair DAY). In respect of these on-going complaints Mr MUIRHEAD was directed to produce a noise management plan (NMP) and install sound limiting equipment within The Stables part of the premises. This equipment was inspected several months ago by aforementioned Vicky BROWN and Alastair DAY and the volume was set at a level that, at that time could not be heard by local residents with their windows open and that limit was locked into the equipment and the password only known to police and council authorities. Both live and recorded music must be plumbed into that equipment so that the sound level does not exceed the level that was set. However, on a recent visit and meeting at the pub, that equipment had been removed from The Stables part of the pub and replaced with different equipment from inside the pub, the sound limiter on which was observed to working intermittently and was easily adjustable. The removal of the original equipment is viewed by the police as a deliberate attempt to circumnavigate the sound level that was agreed and written into the NMP.

The latest complaint regarding noise from music emanating from the pub is from the weekend of 19/21 November 2021, many months after engagement started with responsible authorities.

Mr MUIRHEAD recently applied to vary the conditions of his current licence to include the use of a part of the pub called The Jaeger Bar and to extend the use of the area known as The Courtyard. Following the submission of that application it was noted by licensing staff that his current licence contains a condition that the use of the courtyard shall cease at or before 23:30 hrs. The Courtyard has historically been in continual use for several years up until 02:00 hrs on a Thursday, Friday and Saturday evening but the condition hadn't been enforced as, due to an oversight it hadn't been spotted. Mr MUIRHEAD was arguably aware of this condition but has continually used the courtyard after 23:30 hrs for many years. However, this condition was immediately pointed out to him and he was directed by both Council Licensing Officer (Carla ADKINS) and PLO Alastair DAY that the use of the courtyard after 23:30 hrs must cease with immediate effect until such times as a variation to that condition had been agreed. Mr MUIRHEAD initially argued that he didn't feel that this condition could be enforced, and it was again reiterated to him that it would be from thereon in.

However, during the evening of Saturday the 13/11/21 PLO Alastair DAY spoke to Mr MUIRHEAD at The New Inn and the focus of that discussion was on the use of courtyard and the fact that its' use should cease at or before 23:30 hrs that evening. Mr MUIRHEAD agreed that this was the case. He was also informed that another visit would be made after that time to ensure compliance.

Mr DAY returned to the pub at 01:00 hrs in company with a police officer and both observed the courtyard in full use with the area containing approximately 50-60 people, several of whom were consuming alcohol. This observation went on for approximately 10 mins before a member of the door staff was asked to find Mr MUIRHEAD who was in The Stables building. During this short period several very intoxicated persons were also observed to leave the premises as well.

The matter was pointed out to Mr MUIRHEAD and he was notified that it would be reported to Wiltshire Council Licensing as a clear breach of his premises licence conditions.

Following that visit, Mr DAY returned to the premises at a little after 02:00 hrs on the morning of 14/11/21 to observe clientele leaving the pub and it could be clearly seen that many were over-intoxicated. In particular, 2 females came out of the courtyard gate and into the pub car park in a very intoxicated state and went on to cause a considerable public order incident in the street. These females had been present in the pub during the visit at 22:00 hrs 13/11. It would be fair to describe their level of intoxication as being way past a score of 10 on scale of 1 to 10.

This incident caused a high level of public nuisance, so much so that the Manager of The George Hotel opposite came out into the street to complain and he was followed by paying residents in the hotel who'd been awoken by all of the screaming and shouting and police presence.

Mr MUIRHEAD was able to observe the whole incident as he was present in the car park at the time.

Subsequently to these incidents, Mr MUIRHEAD was issued with a formal warning in respect of both breaching a condition of his premises licence (use of the courtyard) and a breach of S.141 of the Licensing Act 2003, serving alcohol to a person who is drunk.

It is acknowledged that not all the issues in Amesbury are caused solely by over-intoxication and that some incidents can be attributed to the illegal use of drugs and several dealers have been identified and arrested.

During the evening of 3/10/21 one of those identified dealers was arrested directly outside The New Inn and was found to be in possession of several hundred pounds in cash and over 8 grams of the class B drug, ketamine. It was confirmed by door staff at the New Inn that this drug dealer had been inside the pub for several hours. There is police intelligence available that illustrates a clear personal link between this dealer and a former member of the New Inn door staff and the police suspect that this member of staff was facilitating drug dealing within the premises and that person was employed by the pub at this time but has since been dismissed over another matter.

On the 9/11/21, a female was found in Salisbury Street in what can only be described as a stupefied state. Thankfully she was accompanied by her boyfriend. She had previously been in The Bell and it was staff there who called the police. Subsequent enquiries have revealed that she had been in The New Inn from approximately 19:30 - 22:30 and that her boyfriend had consumed 14 or 15 double rums and she herself

had consumed approximately 12 alcoholic drinks. She was in a very vulnerable state and ended up being taken to hospital where blood samples have been taken for toxicology.

Following the events of 13/14 Nov '21 a meeting was arranged at the premises for the 17/11/21 to discuss these matters. Present at that meeting was the licence holder and his partner, the Local police commander Inspector Tina OSBORN, PLO Alastair DAY and Wiltshire Council Environmental health Officer Vicky BROWN. During this meeting the licence holder and his partner were specifically asked about measures that they have in place to deter drug users and/or drug dealers coming into the premises. The answer that was given was that if they didn't let drug users/drug dealers into the premises then they wouldn't have any customers!

This has caused grave concerns for the police in that it now presents a real possibility that the licence holder may knowingly be allowing drug use/dealing to take place on the premises?

Further to that meeting an incident took place at the premises in the early hours of the morning of 26/11/21 whereby customers are seen to be leaving the premises in a very intoxicated state, one of whom was subsequently arrested for being drunk & disorderly. Other customers, also highly intoxicated are seen to leave the premises and head into Salisbury Street where they start shouting and swearing loudly and then verbally abuse police officers who are trying to deal with the earlier detainee. This is another illustration that the licence holder seems incapable of upholding the licensing objectives and continues to over serve alcohol to customers despite the high level of engagement, explanation and encouragement that has taken place over the last 12 months.

Engagement with residents and a local residents committee highlights the level of misery that they have put up with for a very long period of time and a large percentage of their vitriol is directed at this particular premises, the New Inn.

Police body worn video footage is stored on police systems and can be made available for viewing. Properly redacted incidents reported to the police and subsequently logged will be presented in appendix style along with records of complaints from local residents.

Wiltshire Police are seeking Revocation of the Premise Licence, as there is no confidence in the ability of the management to provide any demonstrable compliance with or promotion of the Licensing Objectives, together with Licensing Act Offences.

In this statement I will be referring to a premises called The New Inn, High Street, Amesbury, SP4 7DL.

I will also be referring to the following people:

- Mr Nathan MUIRHEAD, licence holder of The New Inn
- Miss Elle SRONG, partner of Mr MUIRHEAD
- Inspector Tina OSBORN, Wiltshire Police Commander for Amesbury
- Sergeant James OSMENT, Amesbury Police

- Mrs Carla ADKINS, Wiltshire Council Licensing Officer
- former member of door staff team at The New Inn

At about 22:00 hrs on the evening of Saturday 13/11/21 I made the first of several visits to Amesbury licensed premises in company with PC John PAGAN and 2 x Royal Military Police personnel and one of those visits was to The New Inn where I had a conversation with Nathan MUIRHEAD in the rear courtyard. One of the subjects that was discussed was the fact that the use of the courtyard was to cease at or before 23:30 hrs, in accordance with his current licence conditions. He agreed that this was the case and he had been reminded of this fact twice in the previous few days by both me and Mrs Carla ADKINS.

Not only was he reminded of this fact, but I also thought it fair to tell him that I would be back at some point after 23:30 hrs to check that this aspect of his licence conditions was being observed.

At about 01:00 hrs on Sunday the 14/11/21 I attended the car park of The New Inn with PS OSMENT where we stood by the gated entrance to the rear courtyard. During the several minutes that we were there we witnessed a substantial number of people in the courtyard, several of whom were clearly consuming alcohol and it was some time before I spoke

with a member of the door staff and asked him to find Mr MUIRHEAD to discuss the matter. Whilst waiting for Mr MUIRHEAD, a female member of the door staff, [REDACTED] escorted a male and female couple out of the gate who were clearly way over-intoxicated. They tried to get back in but were escorted back out again and a couple of the door staff started telling people in the courtyard that they weren't allowed to consume alcohol there.

I spoke with Mr MUIRHEAD in the car park and made him aware of what I'd witnessed, and that Council Licensing would be notified. He was eager to deflect the conversation from what the issue was and only seemed keen to discuss other aspects of the pub.

I later returned to the Salisbury Street/New Street areas at about 02:00 hrs to observe the dispersal of customers from both the Kings Arms and The New Inn. The operation at the Kings Arms had been fine all evening and I had no concerns about that premises and so I positioned myself by a police vehicle that was parked pretty much opposite the car park of The New Inn.

There was quite a large group of customers milling around in the car park, some waiting for taxis and others standing around chatting in varying degrees of intoxication. My attention though was then drawn to two females who appeared out of the courtyard who were clearly very, very intoxicated, way past a score of 10 on a scale of 1 to 10. These two were already having a debate that started to become quite heated and voices became raised before escalating into fully blown public order incident, both screaming and shouting at each other, pushing and shoving each other, most of the time into the road (High Street). Police officers were intervening and at one point it seemed likely that one of the females would have to be arrested? I had observed these same 2 females in the pub during my earlier visit at approximately 22:00 hrs.


The screaming and drunken disorder was such that both the Manager and residents from The George Hotel opposite were coming out into the street, clearly angry and complaining at what was going on.

Police at the scene managed to calm both females down and one of their partners came to collect her.

The incident has been captured on several police officers BWV and is available to view.

I again spoke to Mr MUIRHEAD after the incident who, having witnessed the whole incident himself, did display a degree of acceptance that this type of disorder is being caused in the main by the over sales of alcohol and he agreed with me that the two females were very intoxicated. Up until this point he has displayed a level of denial that such disorder is taking place on a regular basis and has also stated in written form that the condition relating to the use of his courtyard 'couldn't be enforced'?

The events I have described above constitute two clear breaches of both S.141 of the Licensing Act 2003 and Mr MUIRHEADS' licence conditions regarding the use of the rear courtyard. Equally concerning is the fact that these

incidents have occurred soon after all of the Amesbury town centre DPS' had been given a fair amount of warning regarding the ramping up of enforcement visits in an effort to tackle the disorder issues but that warning seems to have been met with very little regard as far as The New Inn is concerned.

Subsequently, a formal warning letter was sent to Mr MUIRHEAD by Carla ADKINS, Wiltshire Council.

Following these 2 incidents Mr MUIRHEAD informed me that he has sacked one of his door staff [REDACTED] and that he was going to apply to vary the DPS for The New Inn removing himself and proposing his partner Elle STRONG as the new DPS. That application has since been received.

I will now talk about a meeting that took place at The New Inn at 11:00 hrs on the morning of the 17th of November 2021. Present at that meeting was me, Inspector Tina OSBORN, Mrs Vicky BROWN, Mr Nathan MUIRHEAD and Miss Elle STRONG.


The purpose of this meeting was to discuss recently received noise complaints and to examine the noise limiting equipment that had previously been examined by Mrs Vicky BROWN and myself during a visit on the 23/3/21. This equipment was installed in a part of the premises called The Stable. During that inspection, a level of volume was set that could not be heard by occupants of the nearest residential property and that level was locked into the equipment and then password protected. That password was only known to me and Mrs Vicky BROWN.

The meeting was also arranged to discuss recent events and took place in the front bar seating area at the pub and, amongst other things that was discussed, was the subject of drug abuse in the town and I asked Mr MUIRHEAD and Elle STRONG what mechanisms they had in place to deter the use and sales of illegal drugs. Their joint response was that, if they didn't let drug users and dealers into the premises, they wouldn't have any customers! I asked them to repeat what they'd said so that I was sure that I'd heard their response correctly and they repeated their response but added that they know who the drug users and dealers are and that they try and 'keep an eye' on them.

We then moved as a group into the part of the premises called The Stable, the purpose of which was to examine the sound limiting equipment that had been installed several months earlier and to check that the volume limit that had been previously agreed and locked in by Mrs Vicky BROWN, was still working?

Mr MUIRHEAD proceeded to play some music, but I soon became concerned that the equipment being used did not look the same as what I'd seen installed on the 23/3/21? Furthermore, the volume on this new equipment seemed to be easily adjusted, which shouldn't be possible, and the limiter didn't seem to cut in when it was supposed to. Both me and Vicky BROWN enquired as to where the original equipment was and Mr MUIRHEAD explained that it had been replaced by this current equipment which was originally inside the main pub. Effectively, this change of equipment not only contravenes Mr MUIRHEADS own Noise Management Plan (NMP) but also by-passes the sound limit that was set by Vicky BROWN and me during our visit of 23/3/21, following noise complaints. It is the view of Wiltshire Police that this was done blatantly to circumnavigate the sound limiting capability inside The Stable.



New Inn High Street Amesbury – Licence Review

The Environmental Control and Protection Team are in receipt of the consultation on the Wiltshire Police application for review of premises licence LN/000043211 held by Keystone Public Houses Limited. I have covered the Amesbury area for investigation of noise complaints since July 2020 and supported colleagues covering the area for a number of years prior to that. I am therefore responding to the consultation on behalf of the Environmental Control and Protection Team. Our team is mainly concerned with the 'Prevention of a Public Nuisance' Licensing Objective.

Since 2018 we have been regularly involved with licence consultations and the investigating noise complaints about The New Inn. We have investigated complaints mainly in relation to noise from loud music emanating from the main pub, courtyard when music is played outside, and from the function room now known as 'The Stables'. Along with colleagues in the Licensing Team and Police we have also received complaints about noise and antisocial behaviour caused by members of the public in Amesbury Town Centre late and night and in the early hours of the morning.

The Licence holder has a Noise Management Plan (NMP) in place which has been developed over the years and amended when it has become apparent that changes to noise control are required. Adherence to the noise management plan has, at times, been inconsistent. There are also a number of conditions on the licence which relate to the control of noise from music. There is a condition which states: 'A noise limiter will be provided to limit the sound from both live and recorded music to prevent public nuisance.' During my involvement, until recently, there has been a noise limiter in the main pub to ensure compliance with this condition. The Live Music Act 2012 means certain conditions are disapplied before 23:00.

I will give a brief summary of our involvement with the premises in the last 12 months.

In February/March 2021 the function room, now called The Stables, was refurbished and sound insulation was installed. I was made aware the licence holder intended to apply for a full variation for regulated entertainment in there until 02:00. The Stables was already licenced to have regulated entertainment until 00:30. Given the history of our involvement, I suggested rather than apply for the variation straight away, they trial the 02:00 regulated entertainment using Temporary Event Notices and apply for the variation once that had shown music until 02:00 could take place without causing a public or statutory nuisance

I visited 23.03.2021 at 20:30 with Alastair Day to inspect The Stables and help set the noise limiter. The noise limiter at this time was not a standard noise limiter, it was a level that could be set on software so it could not be exceeded. The level could then be password protected. This was not ideal but we were assured by Mr Murihead that once the level was set it could not be changed unless the password was used. A PCSO went to the nearest resident's property and listened with the resident while Alastair and I stayed in The Stables with Mr Muirhead. The volume was adjusted so it was just below the level where it was audible inside the resident's property. We then set the software and password protected it from any changes, only myself and Alastair Day knew the password.

On 12th April 2021 outdoor venues such as pubs were permitted to re open and on 17th May up to 30 people were allowed to mix outdoors. On 21st June all legal limits on social were planned to be lifted but this relaxation was delayed until 19th July 2021.

I received noise complaints from a resident about music taking place outside at the New Inn on 22nd May and 29th May 2021. Advice was given to Mr Muirhead about control of music noise levels. Given the locality, regular events with music outside at the New Inn are not recommended because it is very difficult to play music at a level required for entertainment and not adversely impact at residential properties. Prior to Covid, outside music only took place 2 or 3 times a year for the 'music festivals'. However, considering the challenging time the hospitality industry had been through, that music noise level should have been restricted to avoid customers having to raise their voices and that outside music was only planned for once a week until restrictions were lifted we decided to apply a light touch to the plans for music outside for a couple of weeks. The most impacted resident was also able to accept this this given the circumstances.

Social distancing restrictions were then extended until 19th July. Mr Muirhead cancelled some planned events but intended to continue with outside music approximately once a week. I visited the evening of 3rd July 2021 to observe the noise levels at the nearest residential property. Our opinion of the music noise level that night was that if residents were regularly subject to noise at that level it would constitute a public nuisance and a statutory nuisance under the Environmental Protection Act 1990. We were also concerned about the music level for customers as we found it at a level significantly above that which would cause customers to have to raise their voices. In the 12 months prior to this a considerable amount of advice had been given to Mr Muirhead about music noise levels during the pandemic. Our experience on this evening was that this advice was not being followed. I forwarded these concerns to the Covid Compliance Officer.

After informing Mr Murihead of our observations on 3rd July he said he amended the schedule so the performances on 10th and 17th July would be quieter; they would be acoustic and a duo. We did not receive complaints about noise on these weekends. From 24th July, other than the planned music festival, music would be inside. A number of TENS for music in the Stables until 02:00 were applied for over the summer and autumn.

The way the noise limiting device matter has been managed is indicative of the way noise management at the pub often seems to be approached. It falls to the authorities to notice matters that need attention for compliance rather than management having firm control over compliance and noise management.

There has appeared to be a willingness by the Licence holder to work with us and to put in place measures to control music noise. However, the practical application of these measures has been inconsistent which has results in disturbance for residents and a comparatively high level of involvement from this department over a number of years. I therefore support Wiltshire Police's concerns about the ability of the Licence holder to comply with the 'Prevention of a Public Nuisance' Licencing Objective.

The Licensing Authority is in receipt of the review application by Wiltshire Police for premises licence LN/000043211 held by Keystone Public Houses Limited.

As the officer delegated to respond on behalf of the Licensing Authority, I am writing in support of the Police application. Having considered the review application and the evidence contained within, the Licensing Authority has a number of serious concerns relating to the management of the premises.

It is the view of the Licensing Authority that the premises licence holder has not demonstrated their ability to manage the premises in a sufficient manner to enable the promotion of the licensing objectives, The Prevention of Crime and Disorder, Public Safety, and the Prevention of Public Nuisance.

The Licensing Authority has significant concerns given the levels of consumption and indifferent management of intoxication that is associated with the current level of disorder and the impact it is having on the local community. The review highlights that on occasions the intoxication levels of patrons leaving the New Inn are excessive, the possible and increased vulnerability of those who have been permitted to consume too much alcohol undermines the licensing objective of public safety.

The Licence holder has demonstrated during their interactions with the Licensing Department that whilst comprehending the necessary requirements to operate a licensed premise under the Licensing Act 2003, that compliance can sometime be overlooked, and staff awareness of what the licence requirements are and need for conditions to be compiled with is lacking.

Earlier in the year Mr Muirhead created a new Jager bar in an area that was not covered by the premises licence. Mr Muirhead was unaware of the area covered on the licence and was also unaware of the licensable activities permitted in each area.

The Licensing Authority expects responsible licence holders to comply with their licence and not complain it's the fault of the authorities for not enforcing. Even during the period of consultation for the review the communication between staff and management does not demonstrate

effective management of a late night venue with high volumes of customers and worrying intoxication levels.

The Licensing Authority is aware that Police concerns have been growing in relation to the number of incidents linked to the New Inn which has also been subject to considerable concerns raised by the local community in the past few years in relation to noise break out from the premise and the lateness of the operating hours.

The accumulation of concerns and incidents which have led to this review application by the Police clearly demonstrate the licence holder's failure to ensure patrons safety, highlight a lack of compliance with the licence issued, poor management of customers intoxication levels effectively and a failure to promote the Licensing Objectives.


The Licensing Authority wrote a formal warning to the licence holder on the 15th November 2021, in relation to their failure to comply with the conditions attached to the premises licence, namely, "*The use of the external drinking area will cease at or before 23:30hrs*" at the premises.

The licencing authority, having considered the review application made, are supporting the application as the Licence holder has not demonstrated they are promoting the four licensing objectives therefore continuation of the current premises operating practices without intervention is likely to seriously undermine the prevention of public nuisance, prevention of crime and disorder and public safety.

The concerns raised by Wiltshire Police relating to drugs and consumption levels, leading to antisocial and sometime violent behaviour of their customers and the ineffectiveness of the licence holder to understand that their premises needs robust management to operate in the late night economy which leaves the Licensing Authority with no other conclusion than to support revocation of the licence.

I fully support a Review of the Licence for The New Inn called for by the Police.

The Crime and Disorder, Public Safety, Public Nuisance and Child Protection categories of a Licence are all included in the Anti-Social Behaviour because of the poor New Inn management.

For a long time, residents have been reporting problems from this property in the middle of this old part of town which is both commercial (20%) and Residential (80%) (There should be my copious Diary notes filed with Public Protection)

Problems,

1. Music. Our house is about 50 yds from The New Inn property and we have suffered with their loud "music" long enough. The sound levels and the vibrations have been monitored by the council prior to this review. The sound limiters do not work, for whatever reason. eg. 24th Oct , 30th Oct , 20th November 2021. We could hear the "music" above our television in our double -glazed lounge, windows closed! Vibrations could be felt when touching the walls.

2. Street Noise is generated when customers leave, frequently behaving anti-socially eg. shouting, fighting, yelling in the street, using our doorway for urinating, vomiting , using the pavement and shop fronts to urinate, Breaking shop windows, Breaking plant pots and Playing with wheelie bins. (photos available) Their noise regularly wakes us up, especially Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights. The people can be out there until 3.30 am, after 2.0am closing time. They are often so drunk they don't seem to know where they are.

Our families are reluctant to stay at weekends knowing that it is fairly certain that they will be woken up in the early hours. The grandchildren have been woken and frightened by the noise and the drunks' vocabulary being shouted out, is not what you would want young children, or the general public, to hear.

3. Broken Glass in the streets is dangerous to people, children and adults. Apart from slipping on it, pieces get stuck in shoes and transferred indoors. Glass comes from broken glasses and broken windows. Pets i.e. dogs are in danger of cutting their feet on the fragments left by the revellers.

All this property damage is expensive for owners and not good for the day-time economy. Shoppers and visitors don't want to walk around glass and dollops of vomit on our streets; they will go elsewhere.

4. Transport. Not many of the customers live locally so as to be able to walk home and there is no provision for transportation of customers at 2.0am. There is very little parking for taxis or friends to wait while collecting the customers. All this adds to anti-social street noise at **1.0 and 2.0 am onwards.**

We need to have this Licence reviewed and the Times of Opening reduced so that the streets can be quiet by midnight as appropriate to a small country town. The Hours REDUCED so that the residents can obtain the necessary sleep for good health and healthy functioning in our jobs whether paid or unpaid! Streets quiet by mid-night!

It is not right that police should have to spend their time "nannying" inebriated people because of irresponsible publicans

I do not wish this licence to be passed to any of the existing staff of the New Inn as the philosophy of the present management is quite out of keeping with this small 'village' part of town, **the conservation area!**

I support the review for the license for this establishment, which I believe should be revoked because of the repeated failure of the licensee to abide by the terms of the license.

The license should be revoked for the prevention of Public Nuisance. This occurs frequently at weekends (Thursday, Friday and Saturday night) as this venue closes in the small hours. Brawls, mass urination, vomiting often going on for hours.

The license should be revoked for public Safety. Anyone out on the streets in this environment, including the drunks, is not safe.

The license should be revoked for the Prevention of Crime and Disorder. I gather a review of the New Inn Licence is about to be undertaken, please accept my comments on this particular public house in Amesbury.

- a. The rowdy nature of the clients that are attracted to this property in the evenings causes considerable anxiety to the general public who might be in the vicinity. Foul language, drunken behaviour, occasional fights, vomit and urine and occasionally defecation appear on the street .
- b. From the Public Safety viewpoint this is an alarming situation and does cause fear and distress when accessing the private homes within close proximity. Noise is also a major factor overall.
- c. I cannot say specifically whether crimes have been committed, I've not witnessed these, however local residents have I believe suffered. Disorder is a common factor towards the evenings end of drinking time.

I highlight these factors not because I wish to see the establishment closed down, but rather to have the facility properly managed and exercising far more rigid control of customers before they become over intoxicated.

I trust you will take these aforementioned factors into full consideration when undertaking your Licencing Review of this establishment.







I provide this statement in relation to an incident in which I believed the New Inn, in Amesbury, were in breach of their licensing conditions, by serving excessively drunk people and the staff not having sufficient control over the management of the premises.

ON the 30th December 2021 I was on duty in full police uniform in the company of PC 1497 MORGAN and PS 2671 BLISS. At approximately 23:00 hours I was tasked to make an immediate response to an ongoing disorder outside the New Inn pub High Street, Amesbury. When we arrived things looked to have calmed down and the parties dispersed, as we were talking to the member of staff [REDACTED] who called in the incident we were approached by a male by the name of TAFF, full name unknown but I would describe this male as approximately 5ft 4inches tall, small build wearing a green jumper and blue Jeans, TAFF was also being followed around by a male I recognised as [REDACTED] from my previous dealings with him, I would describe [REDACTED] as approximately 6ft 1in tall, well built wearing a long beige coloured trench coat with blue jeans, he has a short brown beard and was wearing a flat cap on his head.

[REDACTED] is very well known to Police and has approached Police on the two separate occasions I have entered the New Inn. TAFF was highly intoxicated and absolutely stank of alcohol he was extremely rude to [REDACTED] saying to her "WHY DID YOU CALL THE POLICE YOU KNOW WHAT WILL HAPPEN", TAFF said this in a very aggressive manner his behaviour was disgraceful. TAFF also stated that he was the owner of this establishment. PC MORGAN and myself stepped forward and said to TAFF "EXCUSE ME. SHE WAS RIGHT TO CALL US. WHO ARE YOU TO TELL HER THAT SHE CANNOT TELEPHONE US?".

TAFF then shouted at PC MORGAN "I AM THE OWNER, THAT'S WHO. THIS WHOLE PLACE IS MINE".

PS 2671 BLISS then informed myself and PC MORGAN that we need to go inside the premises in order to speak to the person in charge, as we walked through the main entrance TAFF stepped forward along with [REDACTED] and both said "YOU CANNOT COME IN HERE", both said this in a very confrontational manner, [REDACTED] was clearly standing over the shoulder of TAFF trying to intimidate officers by staring us down, acting as if he was some kind of bodyguard to TAFF. The behaviour of TAFF was shameful throughout this whole incident, he was shouting and pointing saying "WHY DON'T YOU GO TO THE KINGS". I was appalled that he was trying to prevent uniformed officers from entering the licensed premises, I was not intimidated by his behaviour nor the demeanour of [REDACTED] and we still entered the premises.

PS 2671 BLISS Identified the person in charge Hannah MUIRHEAD, we all went over to speak with her, at this point TAFF came over again shouting "WHY DON'T YOU GO THE KINGS", at this point MUIRHEAD asked PS BLISS if she could just sort her dad out, she went to TAFF and said to him "I HAVE IT SORTED" and she ushered him away. She then came back to us, I pointed out to MUIRHEAD that his behaviour and treatment of [REDACTED] was disgraceful, at this point [REDACTED] then came over to Police in the pub and said " IS EVERYTHING CALM GENTLEMEN ARE WE ALL GOOD" to which PC MORGAN told him to move on as it has nothing to do with him. MUIRHEAD was completely out of her depth and had not control of the pub, there was inadequate staff and clearly [REDACTED] and TAFF were pulling the strings in the pub.

As we were leaving the pub [REDACTED] shouted "YOU CAN ALL LEAVE NOW. THANK YOU FOR YOUR SERVICE. GOODBYE OFFICERS. FEEL FREE NOT TO COME AGAIN". [REDACTED] also started to follow us out the pub again using his size to try and intimidate officers; in my professional opinion any good standing licence holder would have told both TAFF and [REDACTED] to leave the pub due to their shameful and disgraceful behaviour and for being drunk.

As we came back out the premises there was a group of screaming girls one of which was [REDACTED] [REDACTED] all of them had just left the New Inn and were extremely intoxicated, two of them were arrested later. The noise level was high from the screaming girls and they did not care about the neighbours living in the high street. This pub is continually over selling alcohol to the point of extreme intoxication and once these people have left the pub and are on the street they do not care and are happy to pass the problem of over selling of alcohol to someone else. This pub clearly has no regard for the people that live in the vicinity of these premises and week after week we are called to deal with incidents of extremely drunk people causing all sorts of disorders, during this incident there were two arrests. TAFF had clearly intimidated [REDACTED] who is a young bar staff member working at the pub, she was clearly visibly upset by what he had said and how he had spoken to her, over all I was extremely concerned by the way the New Inn is being managed.

I provide this statement in relation to an incident in which I believed the New Inn, in Amesbury, were in breach of their licensing conditions, by serving excessively drunk people and by the staff not having sufficient control over the management of the premises.

On Thursday 30th December 2021 I was on duty in full uniform, as the driver of a marked police vehicle. This day at approximately 22:46 hours, Amesbury officers were asked to attend the New Inn, on Amesbury High Street, following a report from the bar staff of a disorder at that location. The call-taker could not obtain more details because there was so much noise on the call.

I arrived on scene, along with PC MORGAN and PC PAGAN. Upon our arrival, there was no disorder.

The member of bar staff who called us, [REDACTED], came outside and explained to us that everything seemed to have calmed down and the instigator of the disorder had left.

At the point [REDACTED] was talking to my colleagues and I, a male called "TAFF" (full name unknown) came outside. TAFF was clearly very drunk, he smelt of intoxicating liquor, was red in the face, was unsteady on his feet and slurred his words when he spoke. TAFF was being followed around by a male called [REDACTED] born [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] is very well-known to local officers, as he is regularly involved in criminality, including violence and drugs. [REDACTED] Stands at around 6"1' and is of an large build. [REDACTED] was wearing a flat cap and a long beige coat.

TAFF came over to [REDACTED] and said words to the effect of "WHY DID YOU CALL THE POLICE? YOU KNOW WHAT WILL HAPPEN". TAFF shouted this in a really hostile manner and [REDACTED], who appeared timid in nature, was clearly very uncomfortable and didn't know how to respond. At this point, PC MORGAN stepped forward and said to TAFF "EXCUSE ME. SHE WAS RIGHT TO CALL US. WHO ARE YOU TO TELL HER THAT SHE CANNOT TELEPHONE US?". TAFF then shouted at PC MORGAN "I AM THE OWNER, THAT'S WHO. THIS WHOLE PLACE IS MINE".

I then turned to my colleagues and said that we needed to go inside the premises to speak with the person in charge. At this point, TAFF stepped forward and said "NO YOU'RE NOT. YOU DON'T NEED TO GO IN". TAFF said this in an aggressive tone and stepped in front of our path. TAFF was flanked by [REDACTED], who was standing behind him in a clear attempt to intimidate us, as if acting like some kind of henchman to TAFF. I was shocked; I have never experienced a situation where

uniformed officers have been refused entry to a licensed premises by someone purporting to be the owner.

Needless-to-say my colleagues and I were not intimidated by TAFF and [REDACTED], despite their best attempts, so ignored them and went into the pub.

We identified the person in charge, Hannah MUIRHEAD, who looked really nervous at our presence. MUIRHEAD was instantly apologetic and kept saying "PLEASE JUST IGNORE MY DAD", in reference to TAFF.

PC MORGAN and I pulled MUIRHEAD to the side of the bar for a more private chat.

MUIRHEAD said words to the effect of "I DON'T KNOW WHAT'S GOING ON". Obviously, this is concerning, as MUIRHEAD is supposed to be the person in charge. Whilst we were trying to speak with MUIRHEAD, TAFF kept stumbling over to us and butting-in to our conversation, being rude and hostile. MUIRHEAD was pleading with him to go away and eventually ushered some other people within the bar to move him away. Despite being moved to another part of the pub, he remained within the premises.

PC MORGAN explained to MUIRHEAD that it's completely unacceptable that TAFF is reprimanding bar staff for telephoning us. MUIRHEAD remained apologetic, but clearly didn't have a grasp of what was going on within the pub.

As my colleagues and I were leaving, [REDACTED] was stood by the door and, in a loud volume so the whole pub could hear, he sarcastically said words to the effect of "YOU CAN ALL LEAVE NOW. THANK YOU FOR YOUR SERVICE. GOODBYE OFFICERS. FEEL FREE NOT TO COME AGAIN".

[REDACTED] started walking out behind us with his chest puffed out, as if ushering us out, whilst still sarcastically shouting things like "BYE-BYE OFFICERS". The pub had gone quiet and this was clearly an overt display by [REDACTED] to show the pub that he was the dominant figure.

I stopped walking and turned to [REDACTED] and said "YOU'VE DONE YOUR PIECE, SHOWN EVERYONE THAT YOU'RE THE BIG MAN HERE. YOU CAN STOP SHOWING-OFF NOW. YOU DON'T RUN THIS PLACE, WE LEAVE WHEN WE DECIDE, NOT YOU."

I was quite surprised that MUIRHEAD, given the conversation we'd just had, was allowing one of their patrons to openly and very publicly act like that towards officers, without intervening or telling him to leave. My colleagues and I are of the same opinion, that MUIRHEAD was scared of challenging [REDACTED].

On later discussion with my colleagues, we were in agreement that it appeared MUIRHEAD had no control over the pub that evening; it was TAFF and [REDACTED] who were pulling all the strings and making the demands. I am of the opinion that a competent publican would have banned both TAFF and [REDACTED] TAFF because he was so intoxicated and [REDACTED] because he was so loud and hostile.

A further area of concern was the number of patrons who were coming out of the New Inn whilst very drunk. Two of which ended up getting arrested for public order offences and being drunk and disorderly; [REDACTED] and [REDACTED].

[REDACTED], in particular, was extremely drunk; screaming, crying and shouting swear words at the top of her voice.

Overall, I was highly concerned with the way in which the New Inn was being managed that night and believe that the premises owner needs to make significant changes to prevent further incidents from occurring in future.

On Saturday 20th November 2021 I was informed by PC 447 THOMPSON that they had been dealing with a female who I now know to be [REDACTED] DOB [REDACTED] on Friday 19th November 2021 in AMESBURY TOWN CENTRE.

It was alleged that she had been potentially spiked whilst out with her boyfriend [REDACTED] drinking in the AMESBURY.

That same morning I attended [REDACTED] and spoken to both [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. I can recall [REDACTED] sat in the corner of her sofa and her boyfriend having not long returned from picking up their very young child.

I can not recall word for word the conversation had with both [REDACTED] and [REDACTED], however they stated that they were out from 2230 hours approximately until 2345 hours on Friday 19th November 2021. [REDACTED] had stated that this was [REDACTED] first night out after having their child and she had not been drinking that much. He stated that she was matching him drink for drink that evening and consumed about 12-13 double vodkas. [REDACTED] however did not disclose that was the amount she had drunk. But stated at some point in the evening she had got up from the rear garden and had gone inside the pub and used the toilet. She believes at this point either prior to entering the toilet or inside the toilet she felt a scratch to her leg and appeared to have an unexplained injury.

When asked to confirm what pub it was they were in, they described the end of the street in the town centre, and that they turned right and were in the pub opposite a nail bar which would confirm this pub to be the NEW INN on the HIGH STREET.

Unfortunately their accounts were quite vague due to the amount of alcohol they had consumed that evening and [REDACTED] appeared to be nursing a very bad hangover.

During the afternoon of Saturday 20th November 2021 I attended the NEW INN PH and spoke to a member of staff who was on duty to asked if it would be possible to view CCTV to confirm [REDACTED] movements. He contacted the Landlord via text message and I was informed that unfortunately we could not access the CCTV until the following Monday.

On the evening of Thursday 30th December 2021, I was on duty in full uniform with colleagues, PC 0441 PAGAN and PS 2671 BLISS when we were tasked to attend the NEW INN, Amesbury following a report from a barmaid that 4 people were fighting.

I arrived just prior to 23.00hrs and was approached by a female who introduced herself to me as being [Redacted], a barmaid at the pub. She informed me that she had declined to serve a female due to her suspected age. This female had used a photograph on her mobile phone as a means of identifying herself to [Redacted]. Various intoxicated patrons then began to involve themselves in this and it became heated. People inside began pushing and shoving and it spilled out onto the street with people fighting. As [Redacted] was explaining this to me, a male called "TAFF" whom I believe is Andrew CLARK came up to us. He was heavily intoxicated with red eyes, slurred speech and unsteady on his feet. Despite being stood several feet from me, I could smell intoxicating liquor on his breath. He began to berate [Redacted] for calling the police. She was already distressed and anxious because of people's behaviour towards her in the pub and it upset her further listening to TAFF chastising her for effectively doing her job. She pointed out that she was trying to establish the female's age to ensure she was atleast 18 years of age and [Redacted] implied it was TAFF that was one of those people challenging her. TAFF stated he was the owner of the pub and therefore decided if the police should become involved. At one point he said to her something similar to "LOOK WHAT HAPPENS WHEN YOU CALL THE POLICE!", again criticising her. He was clearly drunk, and I told him so, telling him to go away and that it was disgusting that as the owner he was behaving in this way.

Whilst this was taking place there were lots of very intoxicated young adults in the street, shouting, screaming and screeching at one another. There were no door staff to control this behaviour. TAFF continued to interfere and then returned inside the pub when PS BLISS informed him, we would be entering the pub. As we did so, TAFF and his friend a male, I now know to be [Redacted] stood in the doorway. [Redacted] was wearing a flat cap and a long woollen trench coat. He is approximately 6'02" tall and broad build. He stated to me "YOU HAVE NO RIGHT TO COME IN HERE" and they both blocked the doorway. We then proceeded to walk into the pub and TAFF slurred his speech, sarcastically said "COME IN GENTLEMAN, THE PUB IS EMPTY". PS BLISS then spoke with the designated supervisor, Hannah MUIRHEAD during which she said "I HAVE NO IDEA WHAT WAS GOING ON" and "TAFF". She also confirmed that TAFF was her father. Due to the noise in the pub and [Redacted] coming over to interfere, I could not hear everything that was being said but formed the impression that TAFF had interfered in the actions of [Redacted] and things had escalated. [Redacted] was also drunk sarcastically saying to us "ALRIGHT GENTLEMAN. ARE TEMPERS DOWN NOW? ARE WE DROPPING IT DOWN NOW?". It was necessary for MUIRHEAD to persuade [Redacted] to leave us alone.

It is clear that there were a lot of extremely intoxicated young adults, TAFF and [Redacted] were posturing, trying to impress and assert themselves and MUIRHEAD was not controlling what was taking place in the establishment and no control over the levels of intoxication of the patrons. Consequently, matters spilled out onto the street, with scuffles and arrests being made.

It is my view that the licensees of this premise lack control and permit people drinking to excess.

I gather a review of the New Inn Licence is about to be undertaken, please accept my comments on this particular public house in Amesbury.

a. The rowdy nature of the clients that are attracted to this property in the evenings causes considerable anxiety to the general public who might be in the vicinity. Foul language, drunken behaviour, occasional fights, vomit and urine and occasionally defecation appear on the street .

b. From the Public Safety viewpoint this is an alarming situation and does cause fear and distress when accessing the private homes within close proximity. Noise is also a major factor overall.

c. I cannot say specifically whether crimes have been committed, I've not witnessed these, however local residents have I believe suffered. Disorder is a common factor towards the evenings end of drinking time.

I highlight these factors not because I wish to see the establishment closed down, but rather to have the facility properly managed and exercising far more rigid control of customers before they become over intoxicated.

I trust you will take these aforementioned factors into full consideration when undertaking your Licencing Review of this establishment.

I fully support a Review of the Licence for The New Inn called for by the Police.

The Crime and Disorder, Public Safety, Public Nuisance and Child Protection categories of a Licence are **all** included in the Anti-Social Behaviour because of the poor New Inn management.

For a long time, residents have been reporting problems from this property in the middle of this old part of town which is both commercial (20%) and **Residential (80%)** (There should be my copious Diary notes filed with Public Protection)

Problems,

1. Music. Our house is about 50 yds from The New Inn property and we have suffered with their loud "music" long enough. The sound levels and the vibrations have been monitored by the council prior to this review. The sound limiters do not work, for whatever reason. eg. 24th Oct , 30th Oct , 20th November 2021. We could hear the "music" above our television in our double -glazed lounge, windows closed! Vibrations could be felt when touching the walls.

2. Street Noise is generated when customers leave, frequently behaving anti-socially eg. shouting, fighting, yelling in the street, using our doorway for urinating, vomiting , using the pavement and shop fronts to urinate, Breaking shop windows, Breaking plant pots and Playing with wheelie bins. (photos available) Their noise regularly wakes us up, especially Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights. The people can be out there until 3.30 am, after 2.0am closing time. They are often so drunk they don't seem to know where they are.

Our families are reluctant to stay at weekends knowing that it is fairly certain that they will be woken up in the early hours. The grandchildren have been woken and frightened by the noise and the drunks' vocabulary being shouted out, is not what you would want young children, or the general public, to hear.

3. Broken Glass in the streets is dangerous to people, children and adults. Apart from slipping on it, pieces get stuck in shoes and transferred indoors. Glass comes from broken glasses and broken windows. Pets i.e. dogs are in danger of cutting their feet on the fragments left by the revellers.

All this property damage is expensive for owners and not good for the day-time economy. Shoppers and visitors don't want to walk around glass and dollops of vomit on our streets; they will go elsewhere.

4. Transport. Not many of the customers live locally so as to be able to walk home and there is no provision for transportation of customers at 2.0am. There is very little parking for taxis or friends to wait while collecting the customers. All this adds to anti-social street noise at **1.0 and 2.0 am onwards.**

We need to have this Licence reviewed and the Times of Opening reduced so that the **streets can be quiet by midnight as appropriate to a small country town.** The Hours REDUCED so that the **residents can obtain the necessary sleep for good health and healthy functioning in our jobs** whether paid or unpaid! Streets quiet by mid-night!

It is not right that police should have to spend their time "nannying" inebriated people because of irresponsible publicans

I do not wish this licence to be passed to any of the existing staff of the New Inn as the philosophy of the present management is quite out of keeping with this small 'village' part of town, **the conservation area!**

I am in fully supporting Alistair Day, Police Licensing application for a review of the above license.

Of The New Inn Amesbury, and the reasons given.

Crime and disorder - there has been a constant problem with this establishment, to the detriment of other businesses in the area, Anti-social behaviour abounds every weekend, causing a disturbance to Amesbury residents and indeed hotel residents, also using most of our meagre police resources to maintain public order

Public safety - There has been a marked rise in the unsafe behaviour of the customers attending these premises. Members of the public and residents are experiencing threatening behaviour regularly when this premises close.

Public nuisance - there is constant public nuisance in the high street are from this establishment every weekend. The access sale of cheap alcohol encourages customers to consume more than necessary. The two hotels in High Street have suffered an increased lack of business due to comments on travel web sites from past customers who had no sleep due to the goings on outside in the street, well into the early hours of weekend mornings.

This review has been a long time coming as there has been constant effort between all the stakeholders involved to address all of the issues mentioned. Unfortunately to no avail.

As a [REDACTED] I have been privy to the outrageous happenings outside the premises, and really believe this license should be terminated. I am also sure that there will be constant applications to increase opening hours and music playing.

It should also be remembered this is a central establishment in a small town that has 45% residential properties including sheltered accommodation and gated housing communities for the elderly, many of which back onto, or are in near proximity to the named premises.

Therefore I ask that deep consideration of present and future consequences be observed.

Dear Sir or Madam,

I have read a Public Notice that a review of the New Inn Licence has been proposed and I wish to add my support to this.

I also recently submitted a Representation objecting to change of hours for playing music outside (now withdrawn) for the same reasons but my reasoning still applies in this case, namely:

1. Crime and Disorder
2. Public Safety
3. Public Nuisance

I write this through personal experience having been disturbed by music from the pub's High Street bar which bounces along the High Street. This is most prevalent with a live band playing as the drums and bass sounds travel easily from an unsound-proofed bar with single glazing even though there is supposed to be a sound limiter installed.

I have also had cause to go out into the street between 23:00 hrs and 03:00 hrs due to customer noise, shouting and foul language. I have seen fighting and even seen customers urinating in the streets. It would seem that the current management and "security" for the premises have no jurisdiction or concern once their drunk customers leave and the aftermath is for the Police and residents to clear up.

Obviously, there is a general lack of customer concern having had a night out and information signs of being in a residential area are of little help but Key Workers and families have regularly had disturbed nights.

I am also aware (via the Licensing Officers Report) regarding this review that drugs and drug dealing have been observed at the premises.

Although it would be shame for this establishment have its license revoked, myself and Amesbury Town Centre residents have really had enough of this kind of behaviour so perhaps a short sharp shock and review of management of the premises is what is required.

I am unsure whether the License could be "transferred" to a partner, family member or existing staff but a thorough review of new management needs to also be considered.

For many years Amesbury has had problems, with noise, and anti-social behaviour late at night. In some years there has been very few issues, and in other years, there has been significant problems. I hear about the problems first hand, as I have an interest in the properties at Beechwood Court.

One of the upsides of the current pandemic is that Amesbury has enjoyed a very quiet time during the night and especially at weekends. The quiet enjoyment has come and gone, and it appears that certain establishments, are making full use of our returned freedoms. Which is understandable, due to the pandemic.

Whilst I am not against people enjoying themselves, and going out. Landlords should be operating in a responsible and professional way, towards all parties that the premises can interact with.

It is very disappointing that licenced establishments cannot follow the licencing objectives, and should be servilely reprimanded for not doing so. The inability of licence holders not to follow the rules, then begins to effect the local neighbourhood and surrounding area. We have had people being sick, urinating in Beechwood Court. Smashed windows in the High Street, and as I understand, a lot of recent fighting in the town centre. All of the above information, covers three out of the four licencing objectives as listed below;

The Prevention of Crime and Disorder
The Prevention of Public Nuisance
Public Safety.

The Licensing Authority is in receipt of the review application by Wiltshire Police for premises licence LN/000043211 held by Keystone Public Houses Limited.

As the officer delegated to respond on behalf of the Licensing Authority, I am writing in support of the Police application. Having considered the review application and the evidence contained within, the Licensing Authority has a number of serious concerns relating to the management of the premises.

It is the view of the Licensing Authority that the premises licence holder has not demonstrated their ability to manage the premises in a sufficient manner to enable the promotion of the licensing objectives, The Prevention of Crime and Disorder, Public Safety, and the Prevention of Public Nuisance.

The Licensing Authority has significant concerns given the levels of consumption and indifferent management of intoxication that is associated with the current level of disorder and the impact it is having on the local community. The review highlights that on occasions the intoxication levels of patrons leaving the New Inn are excessive, the possible and increased vulnerability of those who have been permitted to consume too much alcohol undermines the licensing objective of public safety.

The Licence holder has demonstrated during their interactions with the Licensing Department that whilst comprehending the necessary requirements to operate a licensed premise under the Licensing Act 2003, that compliance can sometime be overlooked, and staff awareness of what the licence requirements are and need for conditions to be compiled with is lacking.

Earlier in the year Mr Muirhead created a new Jager bar in an area that was not covered by the premises licence. Mr Muirhead was unaware of the area covered on the licence and was also unaware of the licensable activities permitted in each area.

The Licensing Authority expects responsible licence holders to comply with their licence and not complain it's the fault of the authorities for not enforcing. Even during the period of consultation for the review the communication between staff and management does not demonstrate

effective management of a late night venue with high volumes of customers and worrying intoxication levels.

The Licensing Authority is aware that Police concerns have been growing in relation to the number of incidents linked to the New Inn which has also been subject to considerable concerns raised by the local community in the past few years in relation to noise break out from the premise and the lateness of the operating hours.

The accumulation of concerns and incidents which have led to this review application by the Police clearly demonstrate the licence holder's failure to ensure patrons safety, highlight a lack of compliance with the licence issued, poor management of customers intoxication levels effectively and a failure to promote the Licensing Objectives.


The Licensing Authority wrote a formal warning to the licence holder on the 15th November 2021, in relation to their failure to comply with the conditions attached to the premises licence, namely, "*The use of the external drinking area will cease at or before 23:30hrs*" at the premises.

The licencing authority, having considered the review application made, are supporting the application as the Licence holder has not demonstrated they are promoting the four licensing objectives therefore continuation of the current premises operating practices without intervention is likely to seriously undermine the prevention of public nuisance, prevention of crime and disorder and public safety.

The concerns raised by Wiltshire Police relating to drugs and consumption levels, leading to antisocial and sometime violent behaviour of their customers and the ineffectiveness of the licence holder to understand that their premises needs robust management to operate in the late night economy which leaves the Licensing Authority with no other conclusion than to support revocation of the licence.

New Inn High Street Amesbury – Licence Review

The Environmental Control and Protection Team are in receipt of the consultation on the Wiltshire Police application for review of premises licence LN/000043211 held by Keystone Public Houses Limited. I have covered the Amesbury area for investigation of noise complaints since July 2020 and supported colleagues covering the area for a number of years prior to that. I am therefore responding to the consultation on behalf of the Environmental Control and Protection Team. Our team is mainly concerned with the 'Prevention of a Public Nuisance' Licensing Objective.

Since 2018 we have been regularly involved with licence consultations and the investigating noise complaints about The New Inn. We have investigated complaints mainly in relation to noise from loud music emanating from the main pub, courtyard when music is played outside, and from the function room now known as 'The Stables'. Along with colleagues in the Licensing Team and Police we have also received complaints about noise and antisocial behaviour caused by members of the public in Amesbury Town Centre late and night and in the early hours of the morning.

The Licence holder has a Noise Management Plan (NMP) in place which has been developed over the years and amended when it has become apparent that changes to noise control are required. Adherence to the noise management plan has, at times, been inconsistent. There are also a number of conditions on the licence which relate to the control of noise from music. There is a condition which states: 'A noise limiter will be provided to limit the sound from both live and recorded music to prevent public nuisance.' During my involvement, until recently, there has been a noise limiter in the main pub to ensure compliance with this condition. The Live Music Act 2012 means certain conditions are disapplied before 23:00.

I will give a brief summary of our involvement with the premises in the last 12 months.

In February/March 2021 the function room, now called The Stables, was refurbished and sound insulation was installed. I was made aware the licence holder intended to apply for a full variation for regulated entertainment in there until 02:00. The Stables was already licenced to have regulated entertainment until 00:30. Given the history of our involvement, I suggested rather than apply for the variation straight away, they trial the 02:00 regulated entertainment using Temporary Event Notices and apply for the variation once that had shown music until 02:00 could take place without causing a public or statutory nuisance

I visited 23.03.2021 at 20:30 with Alastair Day to inspect The Stables and help set the noise limiter. The noise limiter at this time was not a standard noise limiter, it was a level that could be set on software so it could not be exceeded. The level could then be password protected. This was not ideal but we were assured by Mr Murihead that once the level was set it could not be changed unless the password was used. A PCSO went to the nearest resident's property and listened with the resident while Alastair and I stayed in The Stables with Mr Muirhead. The volume was adjusted so it was just below the level where it was audible inside the resident's property. We then set the software and password protected it from any changes, only myself and Alastair Day knew the password.

On 12th April 2021 outdoor venues such as pubs were permitted to re open and on 17th May up to 30 people were allowed to mix outdoors. On 21st June all legal limits on social were planned to be lifted but this relaxation was delayed until 19th July 2021.

I received noise complaints from a resident about music taking place outside at the New Inn on 22nd May and 29th May 2021. Advice was given to Mr Muirhead about control of music noise levels. Given the locality, regular events with music outside at the New Inn are not recommended because it is very difficult to play music at a level required for entertainment and not adversely impact at residential properties. Prior to Covid, outside music only took place 2 or 3 times a year for the 'music festivals'. However, considering the challenging time the hospitality industry had been through, that music noise level should have been restricted to avoid customers having to raise their voices and that outside music was only planned for once a week until restrictions were lifted we decided to apply a light touch to the plans for music outside for a couple of weeks. The most impacted resident was also able to accept this this given the circumstances.

Social distancing restrictions were then extended until 19th July. Mr Muirhead cancelled some planned events but intended to continue with outside music approximately once a week. I visited the evening of 3rd July 2021 to observe the noise levels at the nearest residential property. Our opinion of the music noise level that night was that if residents were regularly subject to noise at that level it would constitute a public nuisance and a statutory nuisance under the Environmental Protection Act 1990. We were also concerned about the music level for customers as we found it at a level significantly above that which would cause customers to have to raise their voices. In the 12 months prior to this a considerable amount of advice had been given to Mr Muirhead about music noise levels during the pandemic. Our experience on this evening was that this advice was not being followed. I forwarded these concerns to the Covid Compliance Officer.

After informing Mr Murihead of our observations on 3rd July he said he amended the schedule so the performances on 10th and 17th July would be quieter; they would be acoustic and a duo. We did not receive complaints about noise on these weekends. From 24th July, other than the planned music festival, music would be inside. A number of TENS for music in the Stables until 02:00 were applied for over the summer and autumn.

During the visit on 3rd July I was informed that, due to a power cut, we would need to reset the 'noise limiter' in The Stables. A standard noise limiter would not require this so I became more concerned about the suitability and effectiveness of the noise limiting provision.

On 6th August I visited with a colleague to make observations of the music noise level emanating from The Stables during an event with music inside. Given the noise limiter, music should not have been audible inside the dwelling, but it was. We went to the pub and found the doors to The Stables were propped open. We asked Mr Muirhead to close them and turn the bass down. He went off to do this and reported he had turned the bass down a quarter turn. We went back to the dwelling and the bass was quieter but still just about audible. I decided to investigate this further with a visit when the pubs were not open.

Up to this date the NMP stated '*Ensure that there are two doors between the regulated entertainment and outdoors.*' I had felt there was clear understanding that this meant the doors needed to be closed except for access and egress so as to create an 'acoustic lobby'. Given our observations on 6th August and subsequent conversations I asked Mr Muirhead to alter the NMP so it now read '*Ensure that there are two doors between the regulated entertainment and outdoors, both of which will remain closed unless in use for ingress/egress.*' Following this there were further reports of bass beats being audible inside the dwelling over the next few weekends. There are other businesses operating late at night in the town so it can, at times, be difficult to be certain where noise like this is coming from. I made a planned visit with colleagues on the evening of Monday 23rd August to make further assessment of the bass from The Stables and from another premises in the town. On that occasion it appeared that the noise limiters in both premises were working effectively. The weekends of 28th August and 3rd September were reported to be much quieter.

Mr Muirhead emailed on 30th August for advice regarding the variation he was planning to apply for. I advised that due to the unreliability of the noise limiter in The Stables we would ask him to install a more standard noise limiter if he was to apply for this variation. On 8th September Mr Muirhead sent me details of an Astrada SL2000 noise limiter he intended to purchase and I agreed it was acceptable. He confirmed it would be installed by 24th September, the next occasion he was hoping to have a TENS for the Stables until 2am. He also informed me the music system in The Stables had been replaced with a smaller system. I therefore did not object to his TENS applications.

On 23rd October I was advised by the nearest resident that they had not been impacted by music from the New Inn for the last few weekends. Unfortunately, that night they were then impacted by 'thumping bass' and again on the 30th October. I discussed this with Mr Muirhead and he said he would adjust the limiter level down.

I arranged to visit the pub in 17th November with Alastair Day and Sergeant Tina Osbourne to discuss the variation application and inspect the new noise limiter. I found the Astrada 2000 noise limiter had not been purchased and instead the noise limiter that had been in the pub had been moved to The Stables. This meant there was not limiter in the pub, as required by condition. Mr Muirhead thought this would be acceptable providing music in the pub stopped at 23:00. I explained to Mr Muirhead that although, due to the Live Music Act, he wouldn't be breaching licence conditions by doing this it was not in accordance with his own NMP and showed inconsistency and lack of a proactive approach towards control of music noise. On inspection of the noise limiter I had some concerns about its suitability in this location and, given the noise complaints, its reliability. One specific concern is that the microphone that measures the sound level is next to the limiter itself which is behind the stage and speakers. Noise limiters are usually designed to have their microphone in front of the speakers in the middle of the room.

The way the noise limiting device matter has been managed is indicative of the way noise management at the pub often seems to be approached. It falls to the authorities to notice matters that need attention for compliance rather than management having firm control over compliance and noise management.


There has appeared to be a willingness by the Licence holder to work with us and to put in place measures to control music noise. However, the practical application of these measures has been inconsistent which has results in disturbance for residents and a comparatively high level of involvement from this department over a number of years. I therefore support Wiltshire Police's concerns about the ability of the Licence holder to comply with the 'Prevention of a Public Nuisance' Licencing Objective.
