		Officers reported that studies to date had incurred charges in the region of £850. A full report had not yet been compiled, but was likely to incur further significant charges.  Officers were asked if it was possible to avoid extra charges by not producing a full report. It was felt that, while this was not the accepted approach, giving the low pedestrian count and on a one off basis, this might be possible.  The Parish rep would report back to Calne Without PC and recommend closure of the issue.  Highways to invoice the PC for their 30% contribution equating to £255.		
e)	Issue 5751 – C15 at Lower Compton Speed Limit and Clearway TROs.	An initial study has suggested a 40 mph be installed from the A4 to a point just east of Winterbrook House. The CATG suggests the Area Board approves the recommendations outlined in the report and, in addition recommends the Area Board includes 'no through road' signage in the scheme in response to issue #6655 below. Calne Town Council had discussed this issue at TD&P on 22 <sup>nd</sup> August and had reported their view that there should be further investigation into amended signage to help divert traffic from the town centre and improve road markings.  Could current signage (weight limit and parking) be changed to remove the parking element, which might help reduce non essential traffic?  The CATG discussed that these observations did not specifically address the matters highlighted on the issues sheet.  The Town Council would be asked to submit a further issue relating to signage and to comment on the placing of bollards to prevent vehicles mounting the pavement.	Area Board to note	AH
