### Project description:

Purchase a nearly new bowls mat.

#### **Input from Community Engagement Manager:**

A rare opportunity has arisen for the club to purchase a nearly new bowls mat from the England Short Mat Bowling Association, previously used for national championships for £380, compared to the cost of a new mat of circa £900.

The club formed last year and inherited two old mats from Lee Bowls club which are now defunct and are inferior to the other mats of all the other short mat bowls clubs in the area. It is hoped that quality equipment will increase membership and potential to host events for area-based competitions.

The total project cost is £400, the remainder of which is being provided by the club's limited reserves.

Project description:			

Purchase new art materials for this newly-formed art wellbeing group.

### **Input from Community Engagement Manager:**

This is a new art wellbeing group being set up as a follow-on to the Artlift GP referral group running at the Malmesbury Primary Care Centre. The purpose of the group is to improve mental health and wellbeing by bringing people together. It enables those isolated by physical and mental health problems, loss, and old age to meet, make connections and find a new lease of life, via the simple and peaceful process of painting together. It seeks to improve wellbeing and so reduce the need for GP appointments, expensive prescriptions and overwhelmed health services.

The main benefit to the Artlift program is realised if participants move on to start their own groups to make room for new referrals to join the GP group.

This grant application is for a group that is moving on and will be available to subsequent participants moving on from future programs.

#### Project description:

Purchase of 2 powered speakers and stands for music and sound.

## **Input from Community Engagement Manager:**

The Last Baguette Theatre Company proposes to run a free theatre workshop at the Riverside Centre in Malmesbury for 20 young people aged 11 to 18 from Monday 3rd August for 5 days as part of Malmesbury Carnival. The workshop will culminate in a performance by the young people on Friday 7th August.

The project will explore themes around mental health and pressure at school. Participants will learn about performance, write scripts, direct scenes, create characters and devise their own show over the week.

The applicant is applying to support the purchase of a pair of speakers and speaker stands which will allow workshop participants to use music and sound in the production and will also benefit many other community events and activities.

If approved, the application should be awarded subject to remaining match-funding being confirmed as secured.

### Project description:

To purchase and install a cone climber (play equipment) ay Queen Elizabeth II Jubilee Playing Field.

## **Input from Community Engagement Manager:**

The Parish Council is seeking to expand the play facilities currently on the Jubilee Playing Field in order that it may expand the challenges to the youth of the parish in confidence, physical ability and general fitness.

A cone climber is a circular, cone-shaped, rotating climbing frame. The Cone Climber is great for multi-play as children climb to the top of the net whilst spinning at the same time.

The total project cost is £9,337.74, the remainder of which is being provided by fundraising, bank interest and parish council reserves.

### **Project description:**

To purchase and install a new climbing frame and sunken trampoline at Great Somerford play area.

#### **Input from Community Engagement Manager:**

The children's play area in Great Somerford was established in 1978 and has been used by many generations of children. Some equipment is now in need of renewal and updating and following a public consultation attended by 75 residents it was decided to have the following equipment installed; a sunken trampoline and a challenging 'pick up sticks' climbing frame.

The parish is planning for the future. There is currently planning consent for 58 new houses in the village, 38 of which are due to be built starting in early 2020. In addition, there are planning applications for more houses in the pipeline. All young children resident now and who will shortly be living in the Parish of Great Somerford and Startley and elsewhere will benefit from the new equipment.

These improved facilities will contribute to more exciting, modern and attractive use of the longestablished play area in the future and will encourage physical activity, social opportunities and community cohesion among children and their parents.

The total project cost is £21,900, the remainder of which is being provided by Community Landfill Trust, Jack Lane Charitable Trust, local fundraising and donations.

If approved, the application should be awarded subject to remaining match-funding being confirmed as secured.

That the Area Board considers the application from Great Somerford Parish Council for £2,500.
