Performance - 12 months to July 2021

Force

- Wiltshire Police has had a decrease in the volume of recorded crime by 8.0% in the 12 months to July 2021 and continues to have one of the lowest crime rates in the country.
- Wiltshire Police has seen a 20% reduction in vehicle crime and a reduction of 36.4% in residential burglaries in the 12 months to July 2021.
- Our service delivery remains consistently good.
- In July 2021, we received:
- 10,020 '999' calls, (answered within 11 seconds on average);
- 11,714 '101' calls, (answered within 16 seconds on average);
- 12,304 'CRIB' calls, (answered within 2 minute and 14 seconds on average).
- In July 2021, we also attended 1,908 emergency incidents within 10 minutes and 11 seconds on average.

Stop and Search information for Royal Wootton Bassett CPT

During the 12 months leading to May 2021, 55 stop and searches were conducted in the Royal Wootton Bassett area of which 53.2% related to a search for controlled drugs.

During 72.7% of these searches, no object was found. In 27.9% of cases, an object was found. Of these cases 78.2% resulted in a no further action disposal; 21.8% resulted in police action being taken; 7.3% resulted in an arrest.

Of the stop and search subjects who defined their ethnicity:

- White 46 stop and searches.
- Mixed Ethnicity 3 stop and searches
- Black or Black British 4 stop and searches

Local Priorities & Updates

Priority	Update
ASB	We continue to actively patrol 'hot spot' areas in order to prevent incidents of ASB. We are working in partnership with the local schools to provide educational sessions to pupils and have been well supported by the Rise Trust who perform foot patrols and engage with young people.
Speeding	The Community Policing Team has been conducting speed checks at various locations around Malmesbury and the surrounding villages in order to improve road safety and target offenders.
Rural Crime	We are working in partnership with our Corsham Neighbourhood and Rural Crime Policing teams to prevent and investigate rural offences, particularly in regards to hare coursing and GPS thefts from farm vehicles.
