



# Salisbury Area Board - Youth grants report

The Salisbury Area Board’s youth panel met on Monday 6 June, including attendances from Karlene Jammeh (Community Engagement Manager for Salisbury), Cllr Ricky Rogers (Salisbury Area Board Lead Councillor for Children and Young People), Cameron Strawson (Youth Voice Support Worker) and the Salisbury Youth Councillors.

Grant applications were reviewed that provide positive activities for young people aged 13-19 or up to 25 with SEND and seek to address the local priorities for Salisbury:

- ❖ Youth engagement, employment and positive activity opportunities
- ❖ Addressing climate change
- ❖ Supporting positive mental health and wellbeing
- ❖ Supporting low income individuals and families
- ❖ Celebrating diversity



**The total amount in the Youth grants fund for 2022/23 is £24,422.**

Three Youth Area Board grant applications for Salisbury were presented to the group and the following recommendations have been made to the Salisbury Area Board:

Wiltshire Makers CIC - Wiltshire Makers Castle Street Opportunity	£9,000.00	£4,500.00	£0.00	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The Youth Councillors voted that this was not a high priority for young people and the project lacks the demonstration of how it would positively impact young people in the Salisbury community area</li> <li>Although there is an element of education and employment opportunities within the grant application, the grant would be mainly for the running costs of the shop and salary of the artists</li> <li>The panel agreed that this is a very niche market and the panel decided there were alternative sources of funding that would be more suitable</li> <li>With a high number of applications and a limited amount of funding in this pot for the amount of applications submitted, the panel recommend that this project would not be awarded funding</li> </ul>
