Supporting Local Concerns

To date, 150 issues have been reported on The Salisbury Area Board's Issues Log. Over 75% of these issues have been resolved.

The type of issues reported include potholes, speeding, anti-social behaviour, parking, market square developments, Park & Ride, empty shops, street lighting, pedestrian safety, supermarket trolleys, damaged bus shelters, overgrown pathways
