Project Summary:

The Friday Fun Youth Club is a weekly club running for approximately 48 weeks per year for 11 - 19 year olds and held in Westbury Parish Hall. The sessions are held on Friday evenings from 6:30pm - 8:30pm. The project is a partnership between All Saints' Church (Westbury PCC) and 4Youth (SouthWest).

Background
