- 3.(and yet...) We have rising numbers of youth unemployment
- 4.We have pockets of generational deprivation
- 5.We have some of the highest property prices in the county and many struggle to get on the property ladder
- 6.Crime rates are statistically low, but many residents remain concerned about speeding and rural crime in particular
- 7. Young people find it difficult to access activities and employment because of a lack of transport
- 8. We have weak broadband in some villages
- 9. We have high incidents of fly tipping



Area Board's Finger Post Initiative

- The Members of South West Wiltshire Area Board recognise the contribution of finger posts to the area and our communities.
- In 2020-2021 the Board is considering making funds available to each Parish Council which wants to upgrade a finger post in disrepair.
- The Area Board will use community funds to subsidise up to £400 of the cost of each post. Parishes will be obliged to provide a meaningful contribution.
- The work must be carried out to the Wiltshire Council specification, a detailed work plan & target
 timeline must be submitted with each grant application, including a before photograph, invoices and a
 photograph of the new post in place. Timber is to be from renewable sources, letters & figures on the
 finger post will be standard and Wiltshire Council will point parishes towards a suitable source. No
 changes of names on the finger posts will be countenanced (any changes etc need Gazetting to
 comply with regulations)
- Specifications will be available at www.wiltshire.gov.uk/highways/fingerposts
- Funding requests need to be submitted to <u>karen.linaker@wiltshire.gov.uk</u> 6 weeks before the area board meeting.
