#### **Project Summary:**

Our independent surveyors report has identified significant cracking in the mortar joints of the lightweight blockwork inner leaf, and significant movement in the North upper gable wall. These defects are as a result of poor construction methods from when the Hall was first built in the 1970s and specifically, with regard to the gable end, the absence of diagonal bracing members and GMS lateral restraint straps. There are also defects in the paved areas. Because these faults relate to poor construction and gradual degradation since then, they are not covered by insurance. This has been confirmed by our insurance broker. The Project is to arrest the movement on the gable end, repair the cracking in the mortar joints, and repair the external paving as follows: • Gable end - remove the existing gable down to ceiling joist level, provide wind bracing and binder together with lateral restraint straps to the small extension roof, rebuild the gable in a vertical plane and rebed the verge. • Mortar Joints - repoint the major cracking in the existing stonework. • External Paving - remove defective paving and relay with slabs or concrete as necessary. • Cleaning and decoration – tidy the site and decorate as necessary after the works are complete.

## 1. Background

Area Boards have authority to approve funding under powers delegated to them. Under the Scheme of Delegation Area Boards must adhere to the Area Board Funding and Grants Criteria. This document is available on the council's website.

Three funding streams are available to the Area Board, each with an annually awarded amount. These funding streams are as follows:

- Community Area Grants (capital)
- Young People (revenue)
- Health and Wellbeing (revenue)

The Area Board will be advised of the funding available prior to their first meeting of each financial year.
