Project Summary:

Having carried out a community questionnaire, we are refurbishing our hall next to the church. We have already replaced the lighting with LED lights and have obtained a grant for £3,000 towards a new kitchen. The projects we are working on are new ceiling tiles, new flooring, replacement kitchen, new windows. This is phase one of the project. Phase two will be renovating the entrance to the hall to create a disabled access, reception area and treatment room. The community questionnaire showed that people in the area want a) a place to meet, have coffee; b) a treatment room which specialists can use; c) a large space where they can run exercise classes. In the past we have used the hall for exercise classes, children's parties, slimming club, training, schools and choirs for changing facilities. Going forward we would use the space for wedding receptions and funeral buffets. In renting out the hall in the future we are eager just to cover the cost of heating, lighting, etc

Project Summary:

We are the UKRAINIAN COMMUNITY "UNITED" (UCU) CIC, which was founded in January 2024, uniting Ukrainians who came to Great Britain due to the full-scale war in Ukraine. The objects of the Company are to develop and implement activities which will benefit the community and in particular (without limitation) the support and development of the Ukrainian community in Wiltshire. The company's activities will provide support and benefit to the Ukrainian community, through the organization and implementation of events, activities and projects aimed at integrating Ukrainians into the wider community where they are living. Through sharing and exchange of cultures and experiences, the company will facilitate improved mutual understanding in a multicultural environment. We plan to create a Ukrainian Cultural Space where we will be able to achieve our main goal. This space will be accessible to all age groups and will be a meeting place for multicultural exchange including children of older age (13-19 years old). We are already actively cooperating with Salisbury Community Hub for Ukraine and MUSE SW (MSW) CIC. We plan to actively collaborate with Stratford Social Club to hold joint activities and events to create a friendly environment between communities and better intercultural integration.

Background

- 3. Area Boards have authority to approve funding under powers delegated to them. Under the Scheme of Delegation Area Boards must adhere to the Area Board Funding and Grants Criteria. This document is available on the council's website.
- 4. Three funding streams are available to the Area Board, each with an annually awarded amount. These funding streams are as follows:

 - Older and Vulnerable People Grants (revenue)
- 5. The Area Board will be advised of the funding available prior to their first meeting of each financial year.

- 6. Councillors need to be satisfied that the applications meet the requirements as set out in the Area Board Funding and Grants Criteria and that the health and wellbeing and young persons funding guidelines have been adhered to.
- 7. Councillors must ensure that the distribution of funding is in accordance with the Scheme of Delegation to Area Boards.

Councillors need to consider any recommendations made by sub groups of the Area Boards.
