New request	a)	HIF ref:16-24-05 Additional street lighting – Bratton Road, West Ashton	As advised by the Street Lighting Engineers there is a gap in street lighting in a traffic calmed area it should be no more than 40-50m, The gap between Ashton Heights and Shepherds Drove is around 140m, so I would suggest 2 additional units would be required to match similar elsewhere. New request	b)	HIF ref:16-24-06 Street Lighting County Way bridge	Various members of the public have complained about poor lighting at either side of the footbridges from the Town Park to The Tesco Site. The poor lighting leads to people not feeling safe and avoiding using the footbridges at night.  Request for LHFIG to investigate how this could be improved. Potential for working with Tesco to replace the column near the petrol filling station to the same height as the one in the central reservation would help. New request	c)	HIF ref:16-24-07 Almond Grove/Hazel Grove, footway	The footpath (TROW107) between Hazel Grove and Almond Grove has some deep cracks in it. These present a trip hazard for residents, particularly children attending The Grove Primary School. They create particular risks for children in wheelchairs as well as those using bikes or scooters. The school would also be very grateful if the gassy area at the east end of the footpath could be paved over as the area experiences congestion when children are arriving and leaving and that area cannot be used in wet weather.	MB has inspected the path and his assessment is surface cracks only and is within tolerance therefore does not warrant immediate repair. MB will add this and other footpaths in the area to his maintenance list.  MB & JM shared some concerns with drainage at the requested paved area.
