Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984

Temporary Closure of: A345 Countess Road (Part) and A345 The Centre, Amesbury (Ref: TTRO 6083)

Notice is hereby given that the Wiltshire Council has made an Order to close temporarily to all traffic:

- a) A345 Countess Road (Part), Amesbury; from its junction with A303 to its junction with A345 The Centre;
- b) A345 The Centre, Amesbury, from its junction with A345 Countess Road to its junction with Smithfield Street.

To enable: Tarmac to carry out carriageway resurfacing and associated maintenance works.

Alternative route Eastbound: via A303 – Porton Road – Pendragon Drive – Underwood Drive – Stockport Avenue – A345 (unaffected length).

Alternative route Southbound: via A345 (unaffected length) – Stockport Avenue – Underwood Drive – Pendragon Drive – Solstice Park Avenue – A303.

The closure and diversion route will be clearly indicated by traffic signs.

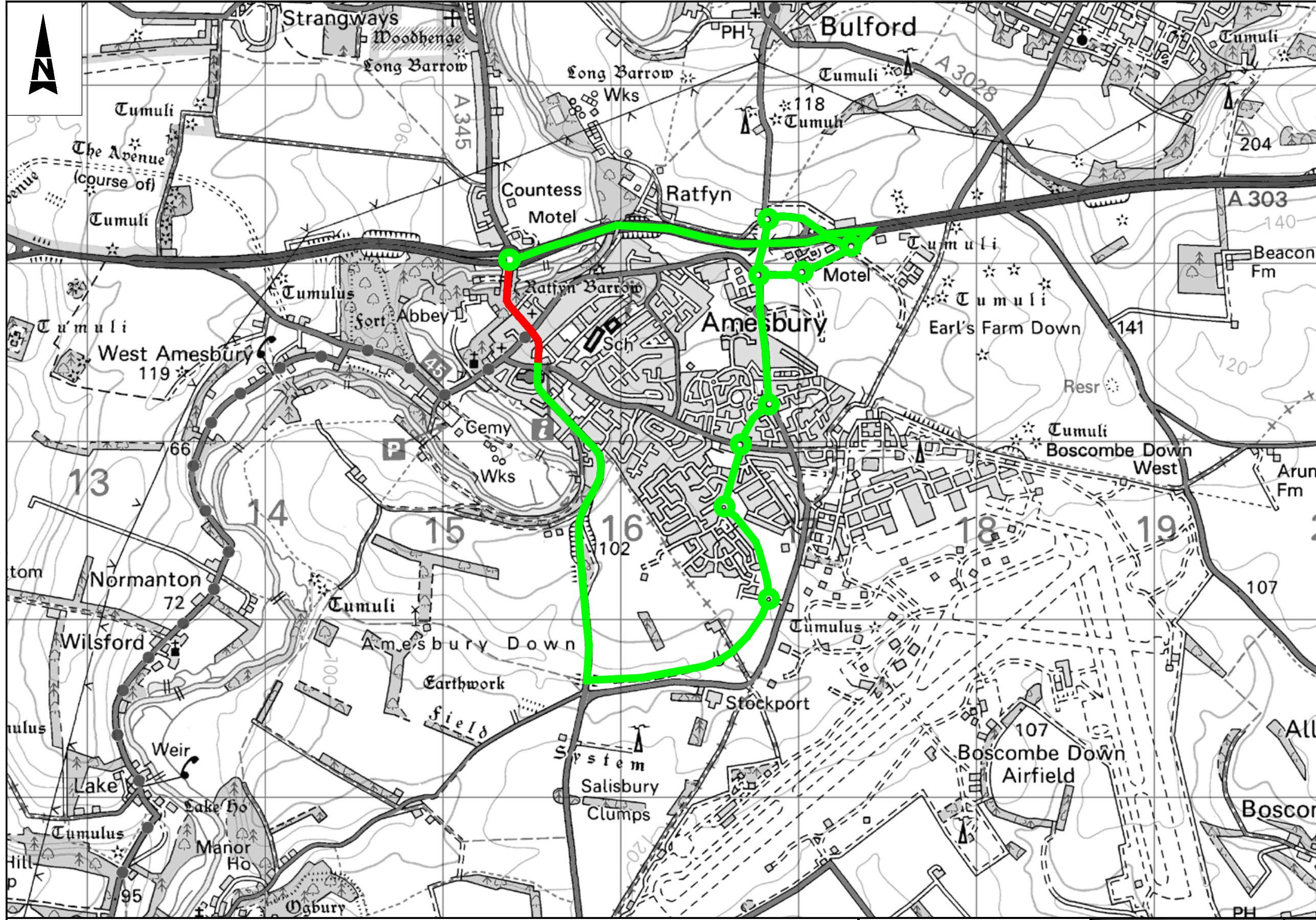
This Order will come into operation on 05 August 2019 and the closure will be required until 30 August 2019. It is anticipated that the works will take the stated duration to complete depending upon weather conditions. Access will be maintained for residents and businesses where possible, although delays are likely due to the nature of the works. The Order will have a maximum duration of 18 months.

Provision of Doctors and the Army
Basing Impact
July 2019

GP Services – Sarum North

- Current GP provision – across 6 practices:
 - St Melor House – Amesbury
 - Barcroft Medical Practice - Amesbury
 - Avon Valley Practice – Durrington & Upavon
 - Cross Plain Health Centre – Durrington & Larkhill
 - The Castle Practice – Tidworth & Ludgershall
 - Millstream Medical Centre – Salisbury
- Other practices bordering impacted area:
 - Till Orchard – Shrewton
 - Andover

Army Basing - Headlines

- 7,720 people from Germany (4,277 troops, 3,443 dependents)
- Internal UK moves impact too
- Approximately 500 moved so far
- Main moves August-September
- High level information received re age/sex/LTCs/safeguarding etc. and shared with relevant organisations
- All adds to area of highest population growth since 2016 (5.85%)

Army Basing - Headlines

- 957 new homes (Bulford, Ludgershall & Tidworth)
- Additional basing impact from within UK
- Transfers from Windsor, Stafford, Aldershot etc.
- Numbers and health impacts less defined
- Further military restructuring and establishment changes expected

Implications

- Additional school places provided – including new primary school in Larkhill
- New infrastructure – roads, bus routes etc.
- Increase in provision of DMS medical services – Bulford, Tidworth and Larkhill including new rehab/mental health facility
- Additional NHS provision required – dependents can choose to register with NHS
- Avon Valley (Durrington) extension complete
- Joint MoD/NHS Health Centre in Larkhill

Cross Plain Health Centre

- Significant recruitment issues led to restricted services and CQC requirements
- Joint working arrangements with Millstream Medical Practice
- Closure of Tidworth branch surgery
- Capacity available in Tidworth and Ludgershall from The Castle Practice
- Services continue in Durrington and Larkhill
- Joint NHS and MoD Health Centre from February in Larkhill

Larkhill

- Business case approved for new joint MOD/NHS Health Centre
- Replaces 2 surgeries (Cross Plain Health Centre in Durrington & Shrewton), and allows for some new growth (additional 199m²/2000 pts)
- Build in progress – due to complete January 2020
- Porta-cabin accommodation in use (Shrewton branch now closed)

Pump priming

- Proactive bid for resilience funds to recruit in advance of impact of basing
- CCG supported
- Recognises advance planning and uncertainty of numbers to each practice – may register with MoD

Next steps

- Data sharing as it becomes available
 - Information received on numbers of complex cases - LTC, CHC, Mental Health, EoL, IVF, maternity, 2° care pathway etc.
 - Shared with Primary, Secondary and Community Care Services
 - Further detail on location to follow
- SFT planning – pathways, maternity, trauma etc.
- Joint work on recruitment, training etc.

Next Steps

- Primary Care Network development
- GP Forward View and 10 year plan – new ways of working, more joined up working with community services, new staff, significant investment in primary care services
- Improved access to services
- Investment in technology and innovation
- Recruitment initiatives – International recruitment, more training practices, focus on retention
- Recruitment and training at scale
- Support and develop primary care workforce
