a)	4966 – Seend High Street - crossing facility Phase 2 – request for coloured surfacing and / or bollards to highlight the crossing point	A design and estimate has been issued to the Parish Council for consideration (see Appendix 3).  The estimate to provide the coloured surface and bollards is £1350 or to provide the coloured surface only, £795.  The CATG has already agreed to contribute £600 (the previous underspend on Phase 1).  The Parish Council have considered these options and wish to proceed with the coloured surfacing work only. The Parish are generally satisfied with the work which has taken place. Concerns were raised about visibility issues to the Give Way sign on approach from Bollands Hill. The issue is caused by a protruding hedgerow and discussions are to take place with the Area Highways team to address this.
