1.	Action Notes of the meeting held on 15th July 2019 The action notes of the meeting held on 15 th July 2019 were agreed as an accurate record.	
2.	Budget update JT confirmed that the HWB budget comprised £6,700 with an additional £1,000 for the Older Persons /Carers' Champion role. A further £1,500 had been pledged from Carer Support Wiltshire and the Marlborough Area Board (23 rd July 2019) approved a bid for a further £1,500 for the post. It was understood that some unspent funds remained available to the Marlborough Health and Wellbeing budget from previous financial years.	
3.	Older Persons / Carers' Champion - update AD informed the Group that further to the initial planning and preparation that had been carried out, Wiltshire Council had revised its guidance to local communities and no longer supported the appointment of the 'Older Persons'/Carers Champion'. The presence of Wiltshire Council Local Area Co ordinators, the appointment of Social Prescribing Link Workers by local Clinical Commissioning Groups and potential inequity across the county were cited as the main reasons for the change of focus. The Group expressed its disappointment and sought clarification that the funding previously identified would remain available for use on initiatives to support carers and older people.	

	<p>AD proposed to invite Kate Blackburn from the Wiltshire Council Public Health Department to the next meeting of the Group to consider potential alternative uses for the funding including projects such as 'Share a pot' – falls prevention programme, seated sports, Mens' sheds, Bike Sheds, Contact teas, and 'Contact the elderly' . The Group agreed to the proposed invitation. Action AD.</p> <p>JP would confirm with Carer Support Wiltshire in respect of the £1,500 funding pledged.</p> <p>CA updated the Group on the appointment of the Kennet and Avon Medical Partnership Social Prescribing Navigator (interview - December) and the plans to identify the needs of older people (75+ years) under the auspices of the Transforming Care for Older People (TCOP) initiative. <p>4.</p>	<p>Market place event 2020 - update and planning</p> <p>Following the successful Health and wellbeing event in Devizes on 15th June, the Group gave further consideration to planning for an event in Marlborough in 2020 including potential attendees, sponsors and venue for the event.</p> <p>a) Planning. Action; JT would share the guidance notes from Devizes to assist in progressing this initiative.</p> <p>b) Venue. The Group considered various options including Priory Gardens possibly in collaboration with the Jubilee Centre, the Leisure Centre and the Town Hall. Following consideration of the pros and cons of each including location and accessibility, the Priory Gardens option was favoured. JT confirmed previously that this venue would be available during June /early July 2019.</p> <p>The cost of hiring a marquee with flooring for the event would be investigated.
