Performance – 12 months to December 2021

Force

- Wiltshire Police recorded crime has been stable with a slight increase by 2.2% in the 12 months to December 2021 and continues to have one of the lowest crime rates in the country.
- Wiltshire Police has seen a 12.7% reduction in vehicle crime and a reduction of 11.2% in residential burglaries in the 12 months to December 2021.
- Our service delivery remains consistently good.
- In November 2021, we received:
 - 8,787 '999' calls, (answered within 8 seconds on average);
 - 10,035 '101' calls, (answered within 8 seconds on average);
 - 10,567 'CRIB' calls, (answered within 1 minute 36 seconds on average).
- In December 2021, we also attended 1,736 emergency incidents within 10 minutes and 12 seconds on average.

Stop and Search information for Chippenham CPT

During the 12 months leading to November 2021, 108 stop and searches were conducted in the Chippenham area of which 78.8% related to a search for controlled drugs.

During 79.6% of these searches, no object was found. In 19.4% of cases, an object was found. Of these cases 81.5% resulted in a no further action disposal; 18.5% resulted in police action being taken; 4.6% resulted in an arrest.

Of the stop and search subjects who defined their ethnicity:

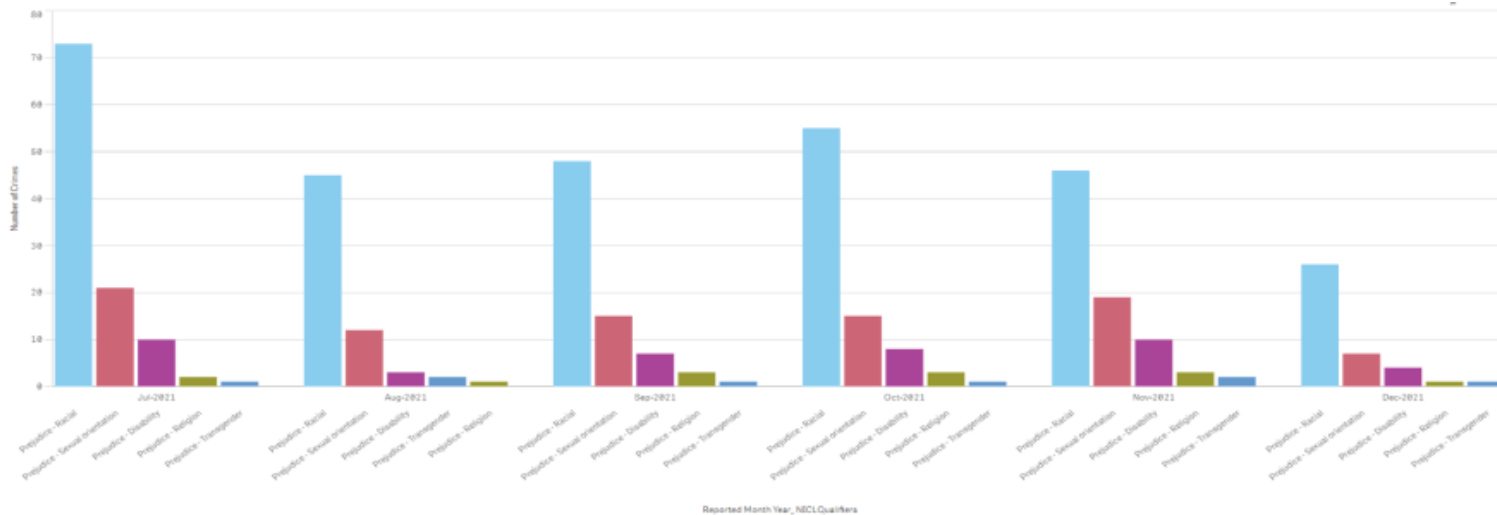
- White – 84 stop and searches.
- Mixed Ethnicity – 2 stop and searches
- Black or Black British – 7 stop and searches

Performance – Hate Crime overview

Force

- Hate Crime across force in December has reported a decrease with only 36 crimes reported split across all 5 strands (versus avg of 66.8 over 24 month period). The decrease is reflected in all crimes across force, possibly attributed to reduced activity across the festive period.
- Due to restrictions since Covid pandemic, seasonal trends have been skewed, however across Racial and Sexual orientation strands (strands with more notable volumes) are showing signs of returning to expected seasonal highs and lows.

Local Priorities & Updates

Priority	Update
The Pippin/ Pop up Park ASB	Reports of ASB are still occurring sporadically around the town particularly in the area of The Pippin and Pop up park. Reports have been made of damage to public toilets, use of laughing gas cannisters, rubbish and drug paraphernalia being left behind. Police and CCTV working together to identify suspects and problem solving pack to look at the environment (bins, lighting).
Community Speed Watch	Priority checks this month Oxford Road, Quemerford and East Tytherton. Day of enforcement 14/02/22.
ASB – Motor Vehicles (quad bikes and motorcycles) Stockley/ Heddington	Reports of damage to countryside and verges on bridleways between Stockley and Heddington caused by off-road motorcycles and quad bikes. Damage reported by Wiltshire Horse Watch. Patrols have been increased and problem solving pack created by PCSO Mark Cook.
Poaching/ Hare Coursing Yatesbury	Reports of damage to land possibly caused by poachers. A group of 6 poachers were arrested 03/02/22 following a pursuit. They were disrupted Broad Hinton and stopped Hackpen Hill/Beckhampton. All suspects from out of force area but likely to be responsible for hare coursing and poaching across the North of the county. Pro-active patrols continue by local officers, liaison with farmers.
