<p><b>The prevention of public nuisance</b></p>	<p>Alderbury PC objects to the licence application as currently stated. As there is no licence currently we cannot base our objections on evidence.</p> <p>It is believed the noise of music, whether live or recorded, will travel into the village.</p> <p>The licence has been submitted to ask for the maximum number of days and hours, which seems completely excessive in a small rural community where peace and quiet is valued by almost everyone.</p> <p>No attempt has been made to estimate how many times per week, month or even year the venue will be in use, so we have to consider the possibility that loud music could be played every week, sometimes more than once in the week.</p> <p>The applicant's answer at section M seem entirely perfunctory. No attempt has been made to say how the noise can be limited (as they claim it will) and clearly the statement that noise will be limited by only playing music in licencing hours is entirely irrelevant!</p> <p>At section H the applicant has also asked for permission for "anything of a similar description" to be allowed without giving any idea what this may mean. We cannot meaningfully comment on something so vague.</p>

**Please list below any suggested actions that you feel the applicant could take to address your concerns:**

We would encourage the applicant to come and talk to the parish council about what form of premises licence they could support, as councillors do not want to entirely discourage new enterprise in the area. The current wording is too excessive and lacks detail. At the very least more information is required.

If a hearing needs to be held to determine the Premises Licence Application, the Licensing Sub-committee will generally only be able to consider matters that have previously been disclosed. However, additional information in support of your Representation may be considered if all parties at the Hearing agree. We advise that you detail all matters that you wish to be considered on this initial Representation, attaching additional sheets if necessary.

If you do make a Representation you will be invited to attend the Licensing Sub-Committee Hearings and any subsequent appeal proceedings relevant to your Representation.

**All Representations in their entirety, including your name and address, will be disclosed to the Premises Licence applicant. A copy of Representations will be annexed to the Licensing Officer's report, which is a public document published on the Council's website and circulated to the Licensing Sub-Committee and to all those who have made relevant Representations.**
