It will support the establishment of a volunteer group at Cloatley Meadows nature reserve on the outskirts of Hankerton and carry out critical access improvements at the reserve reserve enabling greater use and enjoyment of this important community green space. Specifically it will provide tools and equipment for a volunteer group at the reserve enabling them to run regular sessions throughout the year including scrub clearance access improvements and biodiversity enhancement. carry out essential works on the car park increasing capacity and enabling public use throughout the year. install a community noticeboard at the site.</p> <p><b>Input from Community Engagement Manager:</b>            This exciting community volunteering project is aimed at enabling more people to engage with the outdoors. There is already a small team of volunteers (which is growing), led by a local man and over seen by the Reserves Manager keen to get started but need vital tools to help out. This is a very big site with plenty of activities to keep people busy and fit all kinds of interests. However, the first part of the site you see is the car park, which floods and has over grown, so they have decide this is there first project to make the site more accessible and friendly. This is a fantastic project for the outdoors, many local partners have been made aware to sign post those with mental health concerns as a place to visit or volunteer as a form of countryside therapy.</p>
