<p>Project description: Protective fencing and restoring the duck population.</p> <p>Input from Community Engagement Manager:</p> <p>Alderton's duck pond, home to a collection of rare ducks, was recently very unfortunately ravaged with around forty birds being killed. The effect on this rare collection of ducks has been devastating and upsetting for local people and visitors.</p> <p>The Alderton Duck Pond charity began fundraising to improve the pond's protective fencing and towards the replacement of birds.</p> <p>Alderton's iconic duck pond is a wonderful asset enjoyed by many.</p> <p>It is expected to cost up to £1,000 to replace the ducks which were recently taken by wildlife from Alderton's Pond.</p> <p>The pond is home to more than twenty species of duck, some of which are expensive to replace. Amongst the breeds that were killed were Snow Geese, valued at £100 each; Tufted Bahama Pintails; European Widgeon; Crested Pochards; Northern Shoveler and many more.</p> <p><i>After the ducks are even better secured, restocking will begin with species being paired up, so they breed.</i></p> <p>Members of the Area Board were keen to support the restoration of the pond's collection and the decision was made to use officer delegated powers to award the sum of £250.00 to the appeal in between the March and May Area Board meetings.</p>

ID (hyper link)	1 st Sherston Scouts	Scout hut renovations	£2,500.00
<p>Project description:</p> <p>1st Sherston Scouts are planning a major, phased, renovation of the Scout hut to make it safer, warmer and more accessible to the Scouts, other local groups and the general community.</p> <p>The part of the project they are asking the Area Board to support us with is replacing the windows. They are likely to receive in the region of £20,000 from the North Legacy Fund held by Sherston Parish Council, which will be used for solar paneling, loft and cavity wall insulations, air source heating, replacement cisterns and plumbing, and floor rugs. This is all phase 1 of the project.</p> <p>Following this they will continue to fundraise for phase 2 - a new kitchen and phase 3 – additional storage to allow for a break out area. The Cubs and Scouts are planning and undertaking their own fundraising activities to raise money for the redecoration of the building and improving the acoustics of the building. Much of the labour to undertake the renovations will be donated through volunteer time.</p> <p>Input from Community Engagement Manager:</p> <p>The proposed project involves the Scout Hut undergoing major refurbishment to ensure the hut is warm and safe for the children and young people who use it, and to allow the Scout section to become financially independent by renting out the premises to other Scout groups, room hire for birthday parties etc. This would result in generating additional income to cover running costs and put towards residential camps and general activities, making this cheaper for Cubs and Scouts to attend, and therefore making them accessible to more of the children and young people in Sherston and neighbouring villages.</p>			
<p>Proposal That the Area Board determines the application from 1st Sherston Scouts for £2,500.00.</p>
