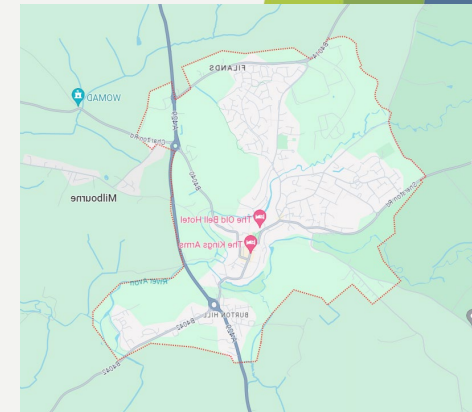

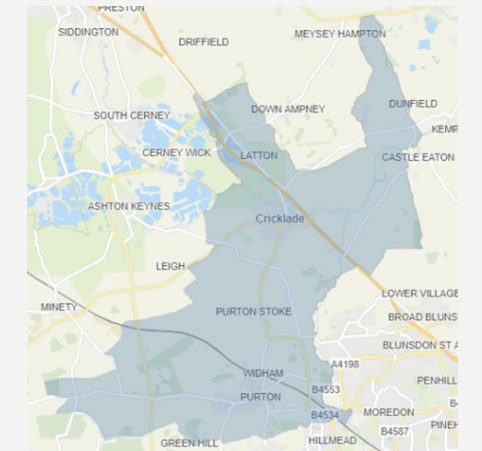

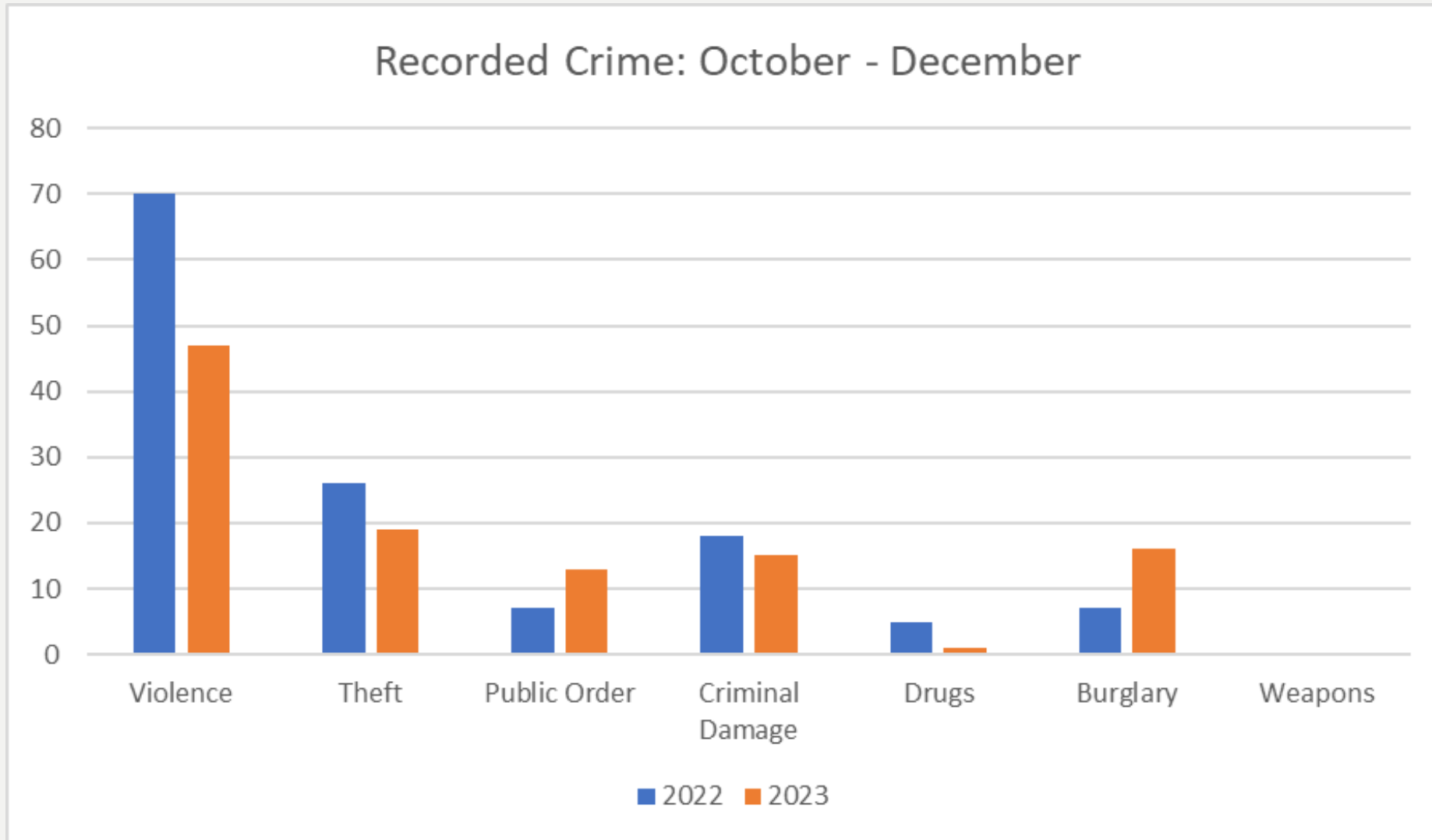

One of the largest forms of distractions is mobile phone use.

It's illegal to use a handheld mobile phone while driving a motor vehicle on the roads in the UK.

Even using a hands-free option can incur penalties if your driving is deemed to be dangerous.

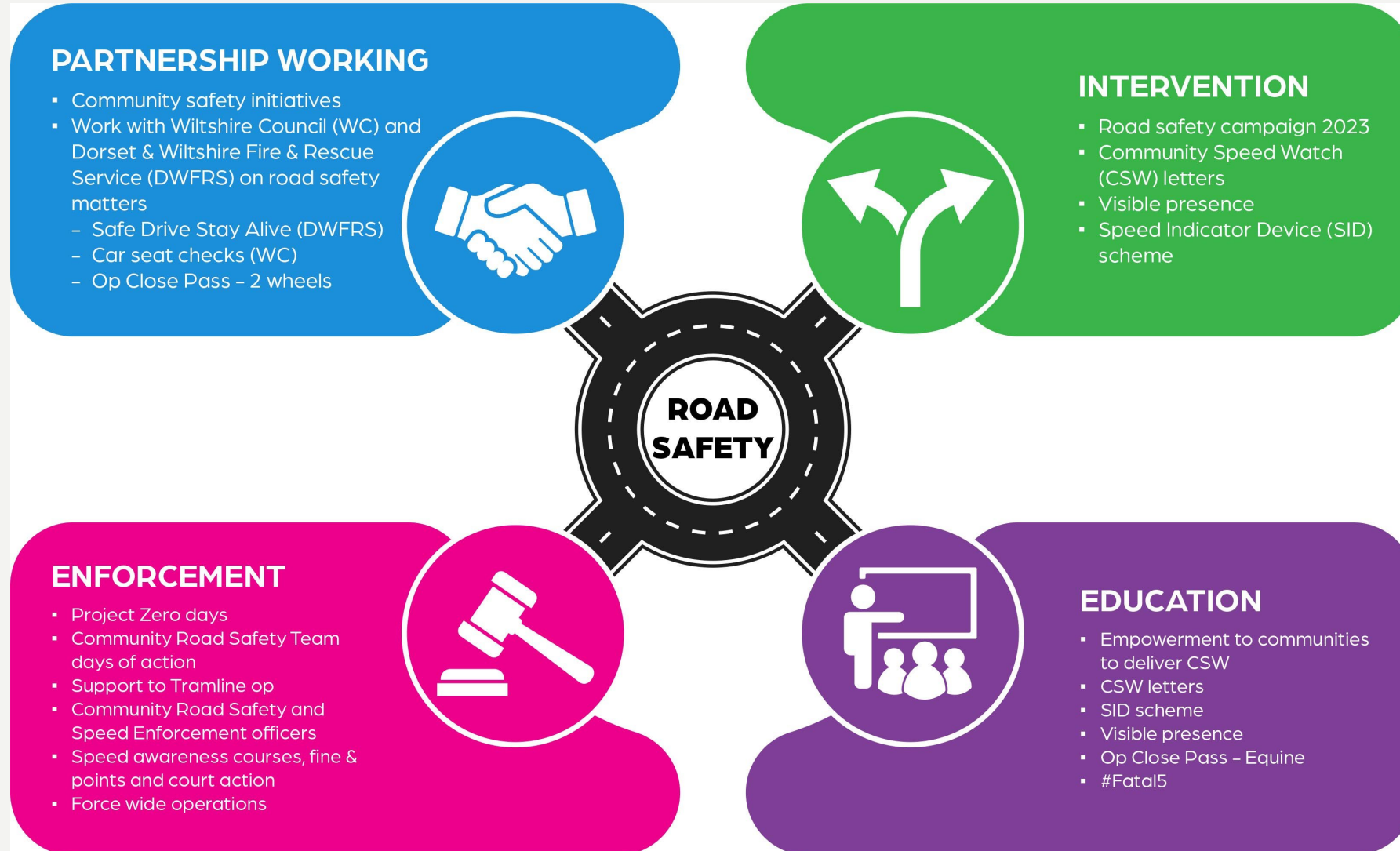
The police have the right to stop you if they think you're distracted and not in control of your vehicle, and you can be prosecuted.

You can use a hand-held phone when:

- you're safely parked and engine off
- you need to call 999 or 112 in an emergency and it's unsafe or impractical to stop
- you're making a contactless payment in a vehicle that is not moving, for example at a drive-through restaurant
- you're using the device to park your vehicle remotely

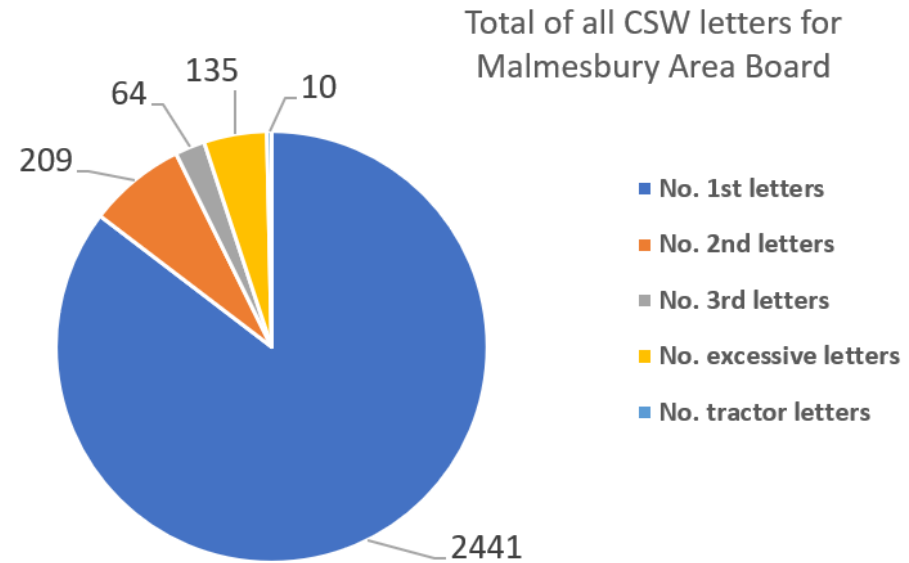
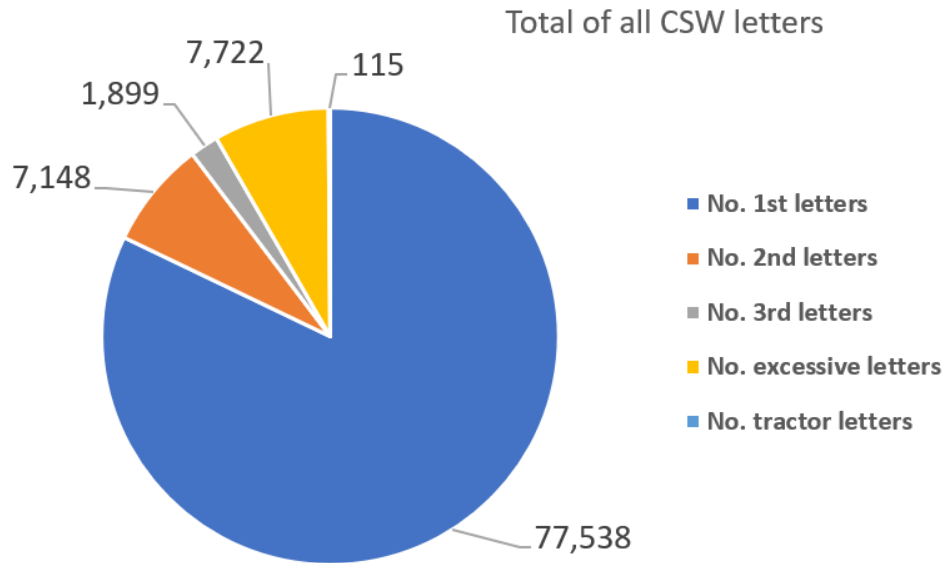

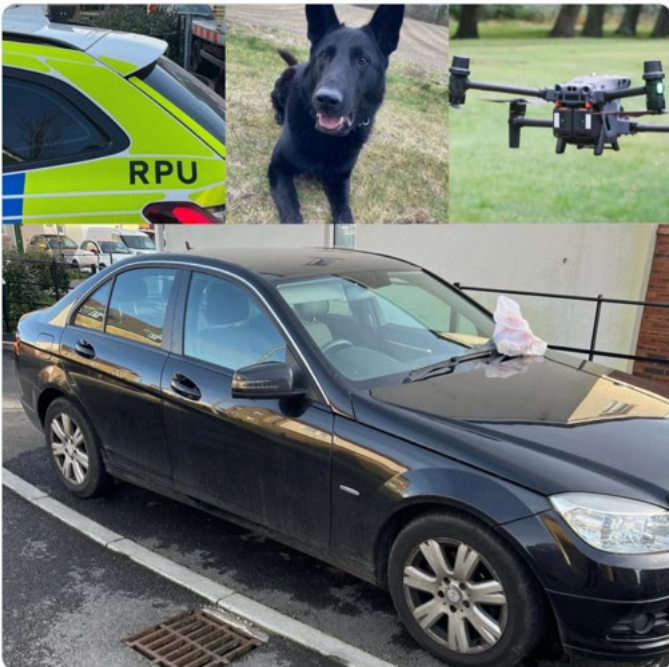

• Introduction to the Forensic Collision Investigation Unit (FCIU)



What do we do:

Investigation:

- Forensic investigation of all fatal and likely to prove fatal/life changing injury RTC's
- Support the Major Crime Investigation Team at homicide and major crime scenes.

We attend the scene of a fatal RTC to gather and record evidence by assessing and identifying relevant objects, marks and positions using techniques such as Laser Scanning, Vehicle Telematics downloads, Forensic Photography, Tachograph Analysis, CCTV/Dash Cam analysis, measurement of the coefficient of sliding friction of the road surface using accelerometers, Forensic Vehicle Examination and crush damage analysis. Detailed analysis takes place and a detailed Forensic Collision Reconstruction report and 3D model is prepared for any judicial or coronial proceedings.

Support road safety education with partnership working:

- Safe Drive, Safe Alive (DWFRS)
- Drink Drive Roadshows
- Survive the Drive (Military)
- Road Safety events

Support Road Safety change through engineering (In partnership with WC, SBC, National highways etc.)

- Conduct Road Safety Audits, Highway change proposals
- Provision of guidance and requirements for public and private events
- Management of planned events involving the highway

We attend approximately 90 RTC deployments (25-30 fatalities) per year



We are a small team of Forensic Collision Investigators and Forensic Vehicle Examiners who deploy 24/7 alongside Roads Policing Teams and are supported by the Vehicle Recovery Team and Traffic Management Office.

Library Wiltshire Council

Charlotte Latham advised us again of the Warm packs initiative, where people can get a basic pack from their local Library (as per previously circulated flyer) however she also mentioned that Libraries will also have a few enhanced packs which include more equipment, such as a radiator reflector. These are intended for those who are in real need of assistance, so if anyone comes across someone who would benefit from this, then please refer to personnel at the Library. Abi Mitchell also introduced the new Rethink Mental Illness sessions now held at Malmesbury Library.

Cartmell Community Minibus

Tolsey Surgery Sherston

There was an announcement by ICB of some intention to close the Tolsey Surgery and for the Sherston area patients to relocate to Malmesbury Primary Care. After some strong concerns were expressed the ICB withdrew its communication. On 13th February, the ICB will be explaining the situation and current position at the Malmesbury Area Board Meeting, which is hosted by the four Wiltshire Councillors who cover North Wiltshire. All are welcome to attend, this time it will be at Malmesbury Town Hall, 6.30pm for 7pm and the full agenda can be found here

3. LIST OF CONTACTS AND DETAILS OF ACTIVITIES TO ENCOURAGE SOCIALISATION

There was quite a lot of discussion as to the need for this and the forum referred to the draft copy, prepared by the Chair, Kim Power. This includes support type groups and events, but also those which are social and not just in Malmesbury, but around the whole Community Area. For example Gil Anies mentioned an extra art based group at Burnham Court which meets on some Thursdays, which others can go to, but is not specifically advertised publicly.

As discussed before, there is more going on and more services available locally in the Community Area, which we can point older and vulnerable people to, than we do currently. To this end, we agreed on the **following actions**, most of which have been discussed in previous meetings:

- Gather information of what's happening. Each member of the forum, will provide details of any groups and dated events they know about, with details such as those shown in the draft version.
- The Chair will request Andrew Jack, (Wiltshire Council Strategic Engagement and Partnerships Manager – Malmesbury, Marlborough and Royal Wootton Bassett & Cricklade Leisure, Culture and Communities), to write to all parishes in the Community Area to ask for the same information.
- Once the information has been gathered it will be put into printed leaflet format and distributed widely. (Refer to Riverside Community Centre Grant Application under 4.) It may be that Riverside Community Centre might have a dedicated web page with this info and links too, and the information will also be part of the Malmesbury Town Council What's On offering.
- Paul Davis and Nicola Steven of Orchard Court and Townsend Court have monthly newspapers and have offered to include relevant information.
- Sally Price advised she will arrange to populate the Primary Care Surgery Facebook page with information.

The intention is to try to achieve this within the next couple of months.
