The gazebos, although great for garden bbq's, do not offer the protection for prolonged periods of cooking in often exposed fields for a group of 20-30 people. They don't have the strength in winds or the side walls to protect from rain. By purchasing a 2nd hand mess tent which would include walls, cooking is no longer uncomfortable but effective, the mess tent can be used time and time again including for protection from rain or sun at fundraising events like Burbage village fete where we make bird boxes and the Church Christmas tree sale where we sell soup to raise awareness and raise funds.</p>
