All Cannings is one of three rural primary schools in the Devizes Area that would like to set up a radio project to draw together pupils home and the local community. For pupils travelling from a variety of local villages as well as the edge of Devizes real engagement with families can be a challenge. We are also aware that some local residents feel isolated. The project would see pupils learning how to create and broadcast and then teaching this to community groups who would be able to do their own recordings.
