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LICENSING COMMITTEE

PROCEDURAL RULES FOR THE HEARING OF LICENSING ACT 2003 APPLICATIONS

1 Purpose

- 1.1 These rules have been prepared to facilitate proper consideration of licence applications, made under the Licensing Act 2003, by the Licensing Committee and its Sub Committees.
- 1.2 The rules set out a framework for how applications are to be heard and explain the role of the participants at the Hearing.

2 Definitions

2.1 The following definitions describe the participants at and the subject matter of a Hearing:

"Applicant" means the person who has submitted an Application for consideration by the Committee.

"Applicant's Premises" means premises subject to the Application.

"**Applicant's Representative**" means a person attending a Hearing to assist or represent an Applicant including a lawyer.

"**Application**" means an application for the Grant/Variation/Transfer/Review and any other decision to be made by the Committee/Sub-Committee in respect of a Licence.

"Chairperson" means the Member who is the Chairperson of the Committee for the particular Hearing.

"Committee" means the Council's Licensing Committee and includes any Sub Committee of the Licensing Committee.

"**Committee Lawyer**" means the Council's Lawyer (including an external Lawyer instructed by the Council's Legal & Democratic Services Manager) who is present at a Hearing to advise the Chairperson and the Members.

"**Committee Manager**" means the Council's Officer who is present at a Hearing to take minutes.

"Committee Report" means the Licensing Officer's written report to the Committee concerning an Application, a copy of which has been previously made available to the Applicant or their Representative, a Responsible Authority or their Representative or any person who has made a Relevant Representation or their Representative.

"Hearing" means a meeting of the Committee at which an Application is considered.

"Licence" means a Licence which the Committee has the power or duty inter alia to grant, transfer, suspend or revoke.

"Licensing Officer" means the Council's Licensing Officer(s) who is/are present at a Hearing to present reports in respect of an Application and to give technical advice in respect of an Application to the Committee when requested.

"Licensing Authority" the Council in whose geographical area the subject matter of the Application relates to, and includes the Council's Licensing Committee, any Sub Committee of the Licensing Committee and a Licensing Officer.

"**Member**" means a Member who is a Member of the Committee that is considering an Application.

"Person making a Relevant Representation" means a person who is present at a Hearing to make representations in respect of an Application and includes any person who is present to assist or make representations on behalf of that person including a Lawyer.

"**Responsible Authority**" means a person who is present at a Hearing to make representations in respect of an Application in their capacity as Responsible Authority and includes any person who is present to assist or make representations on behalf of the Responsible Authority including a Lawyer.

3 Key Principles

- 3.1 The principles of 'natural justice', and Article 6 'Right to a Fair Trial', which is one of the Convention Rights in the Human Rights Act 1998, require that there is a fair Hearing of Applications.
- 3.2 Natural justice is an umbrella term for the legal standards of basic fairness. This will include that:
 - 3.2.1 the Applicant has an opportunity to make representations before a decision is made;
 - 3.2.2 those making representations have an opportunity to voice their representations before a decision is made;
 - 3.2.3 the Applicant has an adequate opportunity to consider and respond to any submissions made by a Responsible Authority/Authorities and/or any person/s who have made a Relevant Representation;

- 3.2.4 the Committee does not exclude an Applicant from a Hearing in order to consider submissions from a Responsible Authority/Authorities and/or any person/s who have made a Relevant Representation.
- 3.3 It is also fundamental that there is an orderly presentation of submissions at a Hearing so that the relevant issues are properly understood, evidence is tested and that oral statements made at the Hearing are accurately recorded.
- 3.4 Ultimately the Chairperson determines the application of these rules, having regard to any submissions being made by those present and in particular the Committee Lawyer.

4 The Hearing

- 4.1 The Hearing shall take place in public.
 - 4.1.1 The Committee may exclude the public from all or part of the Hearing where it considers it to be in the public interest to do so and, in accordance with the Local Government (Access to Information) Act 1985, as amended. Public includes a party and any person assisting or representing a party.
 - 4.1.2 The Committee may require any person attending the Hearing who, in its opinion, is behaving in a disruptive manner, to leave the Hearing and may:
 - A refuse to permit them to return;
 - B permit them to return only on such conditions as the Committee may specify;
 - C in the event that a person is required to leave a Hearing that person may, before the end of the Hearing, submit to the Committee in writing any information which they would have given orally.
- 4.2 Prior to the Hearing commencing, the Chairperson shall advise the parties of the procedure it proposes to follow at the Hearing.
- 4.3 Where a party has previously requested permission for a person(s), other than their representative, to appear at the Hearing then the Committee shall consider whether to permit that request.
- 4.4 The Committee will allow the parties an equal maximum period of time in which to exercise their rights.
- 4.5 This equal maximum time may have been notified in advance of the Hearing;
- 4.6 Where there are a number of people who have attended the Hearing to make the same representation then the Committee would normally require that a spokesperson be appointed by them to make the representations on behalf of all of those who have made Relevant Representations .

5 Presentation of Submissions

- 5.1 The Chairperson will introduce the Application.
- 5.2 In the event that the Licensing Authority has given notice to a party requiring clarification on a point(s) then that party shall respond to the points raised by the Licensing Authority.
- 5.3 Submissions shall be made in the following order unless the Chairperson directs otherwise:
 - 5.3.1 The Licensing Officer will orally present the Committee Report and will in particular advise the Committee as to:
 - A the options available to it;
 - B the considerations that are relevant in reaching its decision.
 - 5.3.2 The Applicant (or the Applicant's Representative) will orally present its submission which may include:
 - A presenting their case in accordance with the papers, which will have been circulated with Agenda papers;
 - B confirming key information and answer pertinent questions; and
 - C calling witnesses in support of the Application (see paragraph 4.3).
 - 5.3.3 A Responsible Authority/Authorities and/or any person/s who have made a Relevant Representation will orally present their representations in turn which shall include:
 - A the grounds of the representation to the Application; and
 - B any condition(s) that the Responsible Authority/Authorities and/or any person/s who have made a Relevant Representation would be happy to have the Application granted subject to which would cause the representation to be withdrawn.

6 Questioning of Submissions

- 6.1 The Chairperson will regulate the order in which questions are asked by Members.
- 6.2 The Chairperson and Members, voiced through the Chairperson, may question any party following the completion of their submission.
- 6.3 The Chairperson will normally permit the Applicant, a Responsible Authority/Authorities or any person/s who have made a Relevant Representation to ask questions through them of the other parties.
- 6.4 The Chairperson may direct that questions which are not relevant to the Application or one of the four Licensing Objectives are not formally put or answered.

7 Documentation

7.1 No party shall present new documentation to the Committee at the Hearing other than with the consent of all of the other parties. This does not preclude the Licensing Officer from correcting errors, providing updated information or an extract from a local map showing the Applicant's Premises in the context of the surrounding premises and any person/s who have made a Relevant Representation . If any party is granted permission to present supplementary papers at the Hearing they shall provide at least 10 copies at the start of their submission.

8 Intervention

The Chairperson shall permit the following interventions at any point in the Hearing:

- 8.1 The Committee Lawyer to advise the Committee on issues of law, procedure and relevant considerations on decision making. If necessary, the Chairperson may require the Committee, the Committee Lawyer and the Committee Manager to leave the Hearing so that advice can be given.
- 8.2 The Committee Manager to advise the Committee on procedure generally, or to request that statements made are repeated for reasons of clarity and so that they can be properly recorded.
- 8.3 The Licensing Officer to seek to clarify statements that have been made in light of information held on their file.

9 Failure of Parties to Attend Hearing

- 9.1 If a party has informed the Licensing Authority that it does not intend to attend or be represented at a Hearing, the Hearing may proceed in its absence.
- 9.2 If a party has not indicated that it does not intend to attend or be represented at a Hearing and fails to attend or be represented at the Hearing then the Licensing Authority may:

9.2.1 where it considers it be necessary in the public interest, adjourn the Hearing to a specified date; or

- 9.2.2 hold the Hearing in the party's absence.
- 9.3 Where the Licensing Authority holds a Hearing in the absence of a party, it shall consider at the Hearing the application, representations or notice made by that party.

10 Closing Submissions

10.1 The Chairperson shall allow first, the Responsible Authority/Authorities and any person/s who have made a Relevant Representation to make a closing oral submission(s) and secondly invite the Applicant or the Applicant's Representative an opportunity to make an oral closing submission in support of the Application.

11 Decision

- 11.1 The Committee, the Committee Lawyer and the Committee Manager, shall retire so that the decision may be considered in private, and to consider any legal issues raised by the Members.
- 11.2 The decision, and reasons for the decision, of the Committee shall be communicated orally by the Chairperson to the parties after the Committee has deliberated in private on the Application.
- 11.3 Written reasons shall be provided soon after the deliberations of the Application and in any event within the statutory time limits.

- 1. The Democratic Services Officer will request nominations for a Chairman for the Hearing.
- 2. The Chairperson welcomes all those present and introduces the Application.
- 3. The Chairperson introduces the members of the Sub Committee and invites all parties present (Applicant, Responsible Authority/Authorities, any person/s who have made a Relevant Representation and Council Officers) to introduce themselves.
- 4. The Chairperson outlines the Hearing Procedure as set out in the Agenda, makes any relevant announcements and asks for any declarations of interest.
- 5. The Licensing Officer is asked to present their Committee Report.
- 6. The Applicant/their representative is invited to address the Sub Committee in support of their application.
- 7. Questions to the Applicant by Members of the Sub Committee.
- 8. Questions to the Applicant by Responsible Authority/Authorities and/or any person/s who have made a Relevant Representation which are to be directed through the Chairperson.
- 9. Any Responsible Authority/Authorities and/or any person/s who have made a Relevant Representation are invited to address the Sub Committee in support of their representations.
- 10. Questions to the Responsible Authorities/those who have made a Relevant Representation by Members of the Sub Committee.
- 11. Questions to the Responsible Authorities/those who have made a Relevant Representation by the Applicant, which are to be directed through the Chairperson.
- 12. Closing submissions by those Parties who have made a Relevant Representation in reverse order.
- 13. Closing submissions by the Applicant.
- 14. Sub Committee retires with the Committee Lawyer and Committee Manager to consider its decision.
- 15. Sub Committee returns and the Lawyer gives a summary of any legal advice that may have been given to the Sub Committee.
- 16. The Chairperson either gives the decision with reasons, or advises that it will be released in writing with reasons within the statutory time limits (5 working days).

1. Purpose of Report

1.1 To determine an application for a Premises Licence in respect of Calne Town Football Club made by Calne Town Football Club Committee.

2. Background Information

- 2.1 An application for a Premises Licence in respect of Calne Town Football Club has been made by Calne Town Football Club Committee for which six relevant representations have been received.
- 2.2 Wiltshire Council (as the Licensing Authority) must hold a hearing to consider the application having regard to the representations. In accordance with Section 18 (3) of The Licensing Act 2003 the Licensing Sub Committee is required to take such of the steps listed in 2.4 below as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives. In considering the application and the relevant representations, the Sub Committee must also have regard to relevant Government guidance and the Council's Licensing Policy
- 2.3 The licensing objectives are:
 - i) The Prevention of Crime and Disorder;
 - ii) Public Safety;
 - iii) The Prevention of Public Nuisance; and
 - iv) The Protection of Children from Harm.
- 2.4 Such steps are:
 - i) To grant the licence subject to such conditions as are consistent with those included in the operating schedule submitted with the application, modified to such extent as the Sub Committee considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives, together with any mandatory conditions required by the Licensing Act.
 - ii) To exclude from the scope of the application any licensable activity.
 - iii) To refuse to specify a person as the designated premises supervisor.
 - iv) To reject the application.

- 2.5 On 16th September 2019 an application for a new Premises Licence was received and accepted as a valid application.
- 2.6 The application as applied for is as follows:

2.7 Following consultation with the Environmental Health Officer on 5th September 2019 the application was amended to:

Live music / Recorded music / Performance of dance/ Anything of a similar description – Outdoors – Maximum of 2 events per year with Regulated Entertainment.	12:00hrs to 23:00hrs	Friday to Monday
Provision of late-night refreshment	23:00hrs to 23:30hrs	Monday to Sunday
Sale by retail of alcohol ON Sales	10:00hrs to 23:30hrs	Monday to Sunday

The following conditions were also added to Section M;

- Noise Management Plan is to be submitted to and agreed by the Licensing Authority/ Public Protection Environmental Control and Pollution Team at least 8 weeks prior to any event which includes regulated entertainment. Noise must be managed in accordance with the agreed Noise Management Plan.
- The number of attendees permitted in any event to a maximum of 500 persons.

A copy of the confirmation email is attached as **Appendix 2**.

3. Consultation and Representations

- 3.1 The application process requires the application to be advertised, by the Applicant, in a local news publication within 10 working days, starting on the day after the authority receives it and for a public notice (on pale blue paper) to be posted on the premises. In addition, the Licensing Authority advertises the application on its website, for a period of 28 consecutive days, starting the day after the authority receives the application.
- 3.2 During the consultation period six relevant representations have been received from six local residents.

4. Legal Implications

- 4.1 This hearing is governed by the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations. These provide that hearings should be held in public unless the Licensing Authority considers that the public interest in excluding the public outweighs the public interest in the hearing taking place in public.
- 4.2 The Applicant, and all persons who have made representations have been informed of the date, time and location of the hearing and their right to attend and be represented.
- 4.3 At the hearing all those who have made representations are entitled to address the Sub Committee and to ask questions of another party, with the consent of the Sub Committee.

5. Officer Recommendations

5.1 Officers are not permitted to make a recommendation – the decision is to be reached by the members of the Licensing Sub Committee.

6. Right of Appeal

- 6.1 It should be noted that the Applicant and those persons who have made representations may appeal the decision made by the Licensing Sub Committee to the Magistrates Court. The appeal must be lodged with the Magistrates Court within 21 days of the notification of the decision.
- 6.2 In the event of an appeal being lodged, the decision made by the Licensing Sub Committee remains valid until any appeal is heard and any decision made by the Magistrates Court.
- 6.3 A Responsible Authority or any person may apply to the Licensing Authority for a Review of a Premises Licence. Whether or not a Review Hearing takes place is in the discretion of the Licensing Authority, but, if requested by a person other than a Responsible Authority it will not normally be granted within the first 12 months except for the most compelling circumstances.





Re: Proposed licence application for calne FC.

This is an objection in reference to the application by Calne FC to Hold a licence for the sale alcohol and live music , recorded music performance of dance and other similar to description .

In addition to the points already raised in my previous letters i would like to raise the following concerns by way of formal objection.

1. Concentration of Licensed Premises local to the proposed application venue.

- There are 2 public houses on Bremhill View and one just off the street in close proximity to the proposed site.

- There are 2 shops selling alcohol nearby to Bremhill View .

 In addition to above there are numerous pubs close by which provide all which this licence is being applied for.

After leaving local public houses (and this venue if this application was granted) late at night the concern is that people will be drawn into the residential and conservation area on and near Bremhill View. Which will cause a noise nuisance for the residents of Bremhill View and surrounding areas. There is also potential overspill from events which are held at Bremhill View social club and the north star club such as weddings and parties that take place in a respectively some 1-2 minutes away from, and opposite, the site.

The addition of another licence being granted for the selling alcohol in this location, which is a conservation area and bounded by a children's play park and a children's nursery which hosts weekly regular young children's events, is inappropriate during daylight hours and after dark adds to concerns about breaches of the peace increasing in and around the site (as referred to below).

2. Crime and Disorder.

Granting this licence will draw unwelcome attention and increased footfall at unsociable hours to a residential and conservation area.

Noise, public nuisance, anti-social behaviour, low-level nuisance (non reportable crime inc. shouting, swearing, urination in public, littering) will be increased if this licence was granted .

The site is adjacent to North end play Park. Historically there have been incidents of regular gatherings of youths drinking alcohol and causing disturbances to residents of Bremhill View.

Police attention to this issue has somewhat lowered this, however, the site is acknowledged by the Police to be of concern for antisocial behaviour.

Recently there has an incident of malicious woundings on the exact premises of Bremhill view where this licence has been applied for. My concern being with added people and alcohol being served daily this could result again as people can become violent once alcohol has been consumed. I am wondering if this licence was approved will they run along with the licensing objectives to ensure a smooth running ... I have a huge doubt that this licence will not be managed correctly or accordingly with the licensing objectives.

3. Public Nuisance.

Licence for alcohol mon-sun 10:00-23:30hrs opening times in a quiet, residential, conservation area will draw people from different areas at unsociable hours.

Live music, recorded music performance of dance and other of a similar description Fri-mon 10:00-23:30hrs will cause a massive public Nuisance for the residents of Bremhill View and in the local area to Bremhill view this would cause a disturbance to daily living we already have to adjust our television volumes to counter act the noise already this will become worse if this licence for calne fc was approved.

I can imagine if this licence was approved events will be held on the site which will add to the additional draw of pedestrians and vehicles to the street we already have limited space for parking and the road is used daily by young children attending north end play park.

Noise, light pollution, traffic and traffic noise will all have a negative impact, as this is a residential area.

Additional traffic, to a small road will have serious public safety implications, Including the fire safety of residents in Bremhill View and near by as with increased traffic and limited space fire crews may struggle to gain access.

The proposed Calne fc site has a very small parking area The aforementioned Northstar site has several more, (not many more)approving this licence will attract considerably more traffic than the site can handle, leading to congestion.

4. The Protection of Children From Harm.

The licence conflicts with the amenities available to children in the local area, putting them at risk from anti-social behaviour, drunkenness, increased littering mainly cigarette butts, human infestations such as vomit urine and exposure to the marketing and sale of alcohol and of course the increased potential for road traffic incidents due to extra road traffic on a small road.

Dear Jemma,

I am writing to register my objection to the application made for licensing for calne FC.

The basis for this opposition is that granting a licence for these premises will not promote the licensing objectives. Particularly the prevention of crime , disorder and anti social behaviour.

Calne FC lies with in a residential area of eight houses mine being in centre to the entrance of calne FC. All eight houses are occupied by families with young children or OAPs. Enabling the premises of Calne FC to sell alcohol would be totally detrimental to its aims and objectives. The application proposes that alcohol will be sold for consumption on the premises Monday to Sunday 10:00hrs to 23:30hrs. By providing this licence this would provide a further source of alcohol with in an area already so heavily populated with licensed premises, that crime , disorder and public nuisance have already reached problem levels occasionally having to be resolved by the local police.

Residents in Bremhill View already suffer noise nuisance and anti social behaviour at all hours of the day and night from other licensed premises in the area. The application states live music, recorded music, performance of dance and other entertainment of similar description Friday to Monday 10:00hrs to 23:30hrs. Noise nuisance isn't just the problem the public who will be attending events held at the proposed premises leave in an anti social manner from consuming too much alcohol. Too many times the residents of Bremhill View have had criminal damage to their vehicles or private property from intoxicated individuals leaving the licensed premises already in this area.

Noise , public Nuisance , antisocial behaviour and low levels of crime such as shouting , swearing , urination in public and littering will all be increased if this licence for Calne FC was granted. There has recently been an incident in the particular premises in which this licence is being applied for of serious bodily harm, illustrating the reality of the local residents concerns. If this licence was granted this could result again and again.

I don't feel that the licence if granted will be managed correctly and in accordance with the licensing objectives.

I feel that the premises which are applying for the licence is not large enough to cater for up-to 499 people and two occasions yearly for over 500 people as the licence notification states. Granting this licence for Calne FC in a quiet , residential conservation area will unnecessarily draw people from a wider area at a unsociable hour.

Additional traffic , noise , light pollution and traffic noise will have a negative impact to note again in a conversation area with two already licensed establishments.

With additional traffic to a road with only one entrance and the same exit this could cause serious public safety implications. Not to mention fire safety.

If the licence for Calne FC was granted this will conflict with the local amenities for children, with a large children's play park situated just behind the premises of Calne FC potentially putting children at risk from antisocial behaviour, increased littering, human infestation such as vomit and urine, exposure to the marketing and sale of alcohol and most importantly the increased potential for road traffic incidents.

In view to all of the above , I would urge the licensing authority to refuse the application made for Calne FC.

I am objecting against this application for the all of the above.

My reasons being I feel that the space they have will not cater up for 499 people, football matches and practices prove difficult for parking already down the street as there's limited space at the moment let alone more vehicles to added if this was approved.

There's is a children's play park just behind the football ground with young children playing including my two children who love the park , children use Bremhill View road to access the park so children will be walking up and down the road which with more vehicles being attracted could cause accidents.

The grounds are often used by the air ambulance for the injured if there was an event on this would prove difficult for the air ambulance leaving the injured lives at risk.

Bremhill View already have two social drinking areas , Bremhill View social club and the North Star club

I don't see the need or want for any more. Beversbrook sports facility already caters for all that's being applied for.

The application states live music until 11:30pm, this will not be the case people don't want to leave that early so will most probably will be extended every event held, it's bad enough for noise from the other social clubs down the street let alone adding more to the equation.

I have two young children aged 4 & 2 who have already had to witness crime as back in November 2018 there was a stabbing in the carpark in which wasn't very nice for all down Bremhill View having the road isolated off while CID investigated. I feel having such events to cater for 499 people with drink fuel adults will cause the crime levels to rise significantly in which I do not what my children to have to witness or have to deal with. This is my biggest concern!

The signs that are notifying the pubic of the alleged applications are also hidden!! There not very noticeable so I don't think that everyone within this area are aware of the application.

You wouldn't plan to put a night club on a residential living area!! I feel this is would be just the same if not worse!

Please consider this as written notification that I object to the planning or application proposed for calne FC.

1. Concentration of Licensed Premises local to the proposed application venue.

- There are 2 public houses on Bremhill View and one just off the street in close proximity to the proposed site.

- There are 2 shops selling alcohol nearby to Bremhill View .

 In addition to above there are numerous pubs close by which provide all which this licence is being applied for.

After leaving local public houses (and this venue if this application was granted) late at night the concern is that people will be drawn into the residential and conservation area on and near Bremhill View. Which will cause a noise nuisance for the residents of Bremhill View and surrounding areas. There is also potential overspill from events which are held at Bremhill View social club and the north star club such as weddings and parties that take place in a respectively some 1-2 minutes away from, and opposite, the site.

The addition of another licence being granted for the selling alcohol in this location, which is a conservation area and bounded by a children's play park and a children's nursery which hosts weekly regular young children's events, is inappropriate during daylight hours and after dark adds to concerns about breaches of the peace increasing in and around the site (as referred to below).

2. Crime and Disorder.

Granting this licence will draw unwelcome attention and increased footfall at unsociable hours to a residential and conservation area.

Noise, public nuisance, anti-social behaviour, low-level nuisance (non reportable crime inc. shouting, swearing, urination in public, littering) will be increased if this licence was granted .

The site is adjacent to North end play Park. Historically there have been incidents of regular gatherings of youths drinking alcohol and causing disturbances to residents of Bremhill View.

Police attention to this issue has somewhat lowered this, however, the site is acknowledged by the Police to be of concern for antisocial behaviour.

Recently there has an incident of malicious woundings on the exact premises of Bremhill view where this licence has been applied for. My concern being with added people and alcohol being served daily this could result again as people can become violent once alcohol has been consumed. I am wondering if this licence was approved will they run along with the licensing objectives to ensure a smooth running ... I have a huge doubt that this licence will not be managed correctly or accordingly with the licensing objectives.

3. Public Nuisance.

Live music, recorded music performance of dance and other of a similar description Fri-mon 10:00-23:30hrs will cause a massive public Nuisance for the residents of Bremhill View and in the local area to Bremhill view this would cause a disturbance to daily living we already have to adjust our television volumes to counter act the noise already this will become worse if this licence for calne fc was approved.

I can imagine if this licence was approved events will be held on the site which will add to the additional draw of pedestrians and vehicles to the street we already have limited space for parking and the road is used daily by young children attending north end play park.

Noise, light pollution, traffic and traffic noise will all have a negative impact, as this is a residential area.

Additional traffic, to a small road will have serious public safety implications, Including the fire safety of residents in Bremhill View and near by as with increased traffic and limited space fire crews may struggle to gain access.


