LICENSING COMMITTEE

PROCEDURAL RULES FOR THE HEARING OF LICENSING ACT 2003 APPLICATIONS

1 Purpose

- 1.1 These rules have been prepared to facilitate proper consideration of licence applications, made under the Licensing Act 2003, by the Licensing Committee and its Sub Committees.
- 1.2 The rules set out a framework for how applications are to be heard and explain the role of the participants at the Hearing.

2 Definitions

- 2.1 The following definitions describe the participants at and the subject matter of a Hearing:
 - **"Applicant"** means the person who has submitted an Application for consideration by the Committee.
 - "Applicant's Premises" means premises subject to the Application.
 - "Applicant's Representative" means a person attending a Hearing to assist or represent an Applicant including a lawyer.
 - "Application" means an application for the Grant/Variation/Transfer/Review and any other decision to be made by the Committee/Sub-Committee in respect of a Licence.
 - "Chairperson" means the Member who is the Chairperson of the Committee for the particular Hearing.
 - **"Committee"** means the Council's Licensing Committee and includes any Sub Committee of the Licensing Committee.
 - "Committee Lawyer" means the Council's Lawyer (including an external Lawyer instructed by the Council's Legal & Democratic Services Manager) who is present at a Hearing to advise the Chairperson and the Members.
 - **"Committee Manager"** means the Council's Officer who is present at a Hearing to take minutes.
 - **"Committee Report"** means the Licensing Officer's written report to the Committee concerning an Application, a copy of which has been previously made available to the Applicant or their Representative, a Responsible Authority or their Representative or an Interested Party or their Representative.

- "Hearing" means a meeting of the Committee at which an Application is considered.
- "Licence" means a Licence which the Committee has the power or duty inter alia to grant, transfer, suspend or revoke.
- "Licensing Officer" means the Council's Licensing Officer(s) who is/are present at a Hearing to present reports in respect of an Application and to give technical advice in respect of an Application to the Committee when requested.
- "Licensing Authority" the Council in whose geographical area the subject matter of the Application relates to, and includes the Council's Licensing Committee, any Sub Committee of the Licensing Committee and a Licensing Officer.
- **"Member"** means a Member who is a Member of the Committee that is considering an Application.
- "Responsible Authority" means a person who is present at a Hearing to make representations in respect of an Application in their capacity as Responsible Authority and includes any person who is present to assist or make representations on behalf of the Responsible Authority including a Lawyer.
- "Interested Party" means a person who is present at a Hearing to make representations in respect of an Application in their capacity as an Interested Party, and includes any person who is present to assist or make representations on behalf of the Interested Party including a Lawyer.

3 Key Principles

- 3.1 The principles of 'natural justice', and Article 6 'Right to a Fair Trial', which is one of the Convention Rights in the Human Rights Act 1998, require that there is a fair Hearing of Applications.
- 3.2 Natural justice is an umbrella term for the legal standards of basic fairness. This will include that:
 - 3.2.1 the Applicant has an opportunity to make representations before a decision is
 - 3.2.2 those making representations have an opportunity to voice their representations before a decision is made;
 - 3.2.3 the Applicant has an adequate opportunity to consider and respond to any submissions made by a Responsible Authority/Authorities and/or an Interested Party/Parties;
 - 3.2.4 the Committee does not exclude an Applicant from a Hearing in order to consider submissions from a Responsible Authority/Authorities and/or an Interested Party/Parties.
- 3.3 It is also fundamental that there is an orderly presentation of submissions at a Hearing so that the relevant issues are properly understood, evidence is tested and that oral statements made at the Hearing are accurately recorded.
- 3.4 Ultimately the Chairperson determines the application of these rules, having regard to any submissions being made by those present and in particular the Committee Lawyer.

4 The Hearing

- 4.1 The Hearing shall take place in public.
 - 4.1.1 The Committee may exclude the public from all or part of the Hearing where it considers it to be in the public interest to do so and, in accordance with the Local Government (Access to Information) Act 1985, as amended. Public includes a party and any person assisting or representing a party.
 - 4.1.2 The Committee may require any person attending the Hearing who, in its opinion, is behaving in a disruptive manner, to leave the Hearing and may:
 - a refuse to permit them to return;
 - b permit them to return only on such conditions as the Committee may specify:
 - c in the event that a person is required to leave a Hearing that person may, before the end of the Hearing, submit to the Committee in writing any information which they would have given orally.
- 4.2 Prior to the Hearing commencing, the Chairperson shall advise the parties of the procedure it proposes to follow at the Hearing.
- 4.3 Where a party has previously requested permission for a person(s), other than their representative, to appear at the Hearing then the Committee shall consider whether to permit that request.
- 4.4 The Committee will allow the parties an equal maximum period of time in which to exercise their rights.
- 4.5 This equal maximum time may have been notified in advance of the Hearing;
- 4.6 Where there is a multiple of Interested Parties who have attended the Hearing to make the same representation then the Committee would normally require that a spokesperson be appointed by them to make the representations on behalf of all of those Interested Parties.

5 Presentation of Submissions

- 5.1 The Chairperson will introduce the Application.
- 5.2 In the event that the Licensing Authority has given notice to a party requiring clarification on a point(s) then that party shall respond to the points raised by the Licensing Authority.
- 5.3 Submissions shall be made in the following order unless the Chairperson directs otherwise:
 - 5.3.1 The Licensing Officer will orally present the Committee Report and will in particular advise the Committee as to:
 - a the options available to it;
 - b the considerations that are relevant in reaching its decision.
 - 5.3.2 The Applicant (or the Applicant's Representative) may orally present its submission which may include:

- a presenting their case in accordance with the papers, which will have been circulated with Agenda papers;
- b confirming key information and answer pertinent questions; and
- c calling witnesses in support of the Application (see paragraph 4.3).

A Responsible Authority/Authorities and/or an Interested Party/Parties will orally present their representations in turn which shall include:

- a the grounds of the representation to the Application; and
- b any condition(s) that the Responsible Authority/Authorities and/or an Interested Party/Parties would be happy to have the Application granted subject to which would cause the representation to be withdrawn.

6 Questioning of Submissions

- 6.1 The Chairperson will regulate the order in which questions are asked by Members.
- 6.2 The Chairperson and Members, voiced through the Chairperson, may question any party following the completion of their submission.
- 6.3 The Chairperson will normally permit the Applicant, a Responsible Authority/Authorities or an Interested Party/Parties to ask questions through them of the other parties
- 6.4 The Chairperson may direct that questions which are not relevant to the Application or one of the four Licensing Objectives are not formally put or answered.

7 Documentation

7.1 No party shall present new documentation to the Committee at the Hearing other than with the consent of all of the other parties. This does not preclude the Licensing Officer from correcting errors, providing updated information or an extract from a local map showing the Applicant's Premises in the context of the surrounding premises and any Interested Party's premises. If any party is granted permission to present supplementary papers at the Hearing they shall provide at least 10 copies at the start of their submission.

8 Intervention

The Chairperson shall permit the following interventions at any point in the Hearing:

- 8.1 The Committee Lawyer to advise the Committee on issues of law, procedure and relevant considerations on decision making. If necessary, the Chairperson may require the Committee, the Committee Lawyer and the Committee Manager to leave the Hearing so that advice can be given.
- 8.2 The Committee Manager to advise the Committee on procedure generally, or to request that statements made are repeated for reasons of clarity and so that they can be properly recorded.
- 8.3 The Licensing Officer to seek to clarify statements that have been made in light of information held on their file.

9 Failure of Parties to Attend Hearing

- 9.1 If a party has informed the Licensing Authority that it does not intend to attend or be represented at a Hearing, the Hearing may proceed in its absence.
- 9.2 If a party has not indicated that it does not intend to attend or be represented at a Hearing and fails to attend or be represented at the Hearing then the Licensing Authority may:
 - 9.2.1 where it considers it be necessary in the public interest, adjourn the Hearing to a specified date; or
 - 9.2.2 hold the Hearing in the party's absence.
- 9.3 Where the Licensing Authority holds a Hearing in the absence of a party, it shall consider at the Hearing the application, representations or notice made by that party.

10 Closing Submissions

10.1 The Chairperson shall allow first, the Responsible Authority/Authorities and the Interested Party/Parties to make a closing oral submission(s) and secondly invite the Applicant or the Applicant's Representative an opportunity to make an oral closing submission in support of the Application

11 Decision

- 11.1 The Committee, the Committee Lawyer and the Committee Manager, shall retire so that the decision may be considered in private, and to consider any legal issues raised by the Members.
- 11.2 The decision, and reasons for the decision, of the Committee shall be communicated orally by the Chairperson to the parties after the Committee has deliberated in private on the Application.
- 11.3 Written reasons shall be provided soon after the deliberations of the Application and in any event within the statutory time limits.

Hearing Procedure Summary

- 1. The Chairperson welcomes all those present and introduces the Application.
- 2. The Chairperson introduces the Applicant, Responsible Authority/Authorities and/or Interested Party/Parties.
- 3. The Chairperson outlines the Hearing Procedure.
- 4. The Licensing Officer presents the Committee Report.
- 5. The Applicant addresses the Committee.
- 6. Questions to the Applicant by Responsible Authority/Authorities and/or Interested Party/Parties.
- 7. Questions to the Applicant by Members of the Committee.
- 8. Comments by Responsible Authority/Authorities and/or Interested Party/Parties.
- 9. Questions by Applicant.
- Questions to Responsible Authority/Authorities and/or Interested Party/Parties by Members of the Committee.
- 11. Summing up by Parties who have made representations.
- 12. Summing up by Applicant.
- 13. Committee retires with the Committee Lawyer and Committee Manager to consider its decision.
- 14. Committee returns and the Lawyer gives a summary of any legal advice that may have been given to the Committee, and invites the parties present to make any comments on that advice.
- 15. The Chairperson either gives the decision with reasons, or advises that it will be released in writing with reasons within the statutory time limits.

1. Introduction

Planning permission for the commercial use of the garden area of the Canal Trust Cafe was granted by the West Wiltshire District Council in 2004 under planning reference 04/02098/FUL. The permission included the following condition:

"No live or amplified music or any other amplified sound shall be produced so as to

be audible at the boundary of any inhabited premises in the vicinity of the site to which this permission refers".

It should be noted that the above is for information only and in connection with this application, does not predetermine the decision of the licensing committee.

Dear Sir

We wish to object most forcibly to every part of the application of the Canal Trust Café for the licence referred to above.

Present alcohol proposals.

The proposed addition of another outlet for alcohol is completely unjustified and the possibility of alcohol sales from 0900 until 2300, both on and off the premises, fills us with horror. It must be remembered that this is very much a residential area with houses placed directly adjacent to the canal banks.

Existing alcohol outlets.

This area is already well-stocked with alcohol providers as there are three existing licensed premises in the immediate vicinity. In fine weather householders are frequently disturbed and aggravated by noisy drinkers but especially so at night. Locals often find empty bottles and cans dumped in their front gardens. Any theoretical closing time tends to be completely ineffective as drinkers hang around the well lit bridge area often bawling and shrieking into the night.

Intended noise and music

The request to be permitted to create noise and music of all kinds from 1000 until 2300 is truly alarming to all local residents. The past disputes with the Kisioglu family are well documented in the files of the Environment and Licensing departments and clearly demonstrate their attitude to their neighbours.

The present 'truce' was only achieved by the intervention of Wadworths, the Public Protection Services, and a large meeting of aggrieved neighbouring residents. A Code of Practice was eventually agreed between the two parties and lodged with the Environment Department. When taking over the Canal Café Mrs Kisioglu assured us that they would not be seeking any further licence extensions. Bearing this in mind we find the present application insensitive and cynical.

Dance &c.

The very small internal area of the Café strongly implies that these events will have to be held outside. By their very nature partakers get excited and create even more noise which adds further to that of the music. Apparently there are no toilet facilities which could lead very unhygienic practices around the towpath area.

Adjacent housing.

The planners have permitted the building of houses in the infill areas which has resulted in the creation of St. Katherine's Quay (two blocks), Kennet Gardens (two blocks) and various infill areas in the Frome Road during the last few years. All these are extremely close to the Canal Café.

Kennet Gardens in particular is only a matter of yards away and will be subjected the most daunting effects of these activities. Most of the residents here are very elderly and sleep on the side of the house directly overlooking the café.

Houses directly opposite and on the other side of the canal will be detrimentally affected by these proposals as they are in the 'firing line' of the noise.

We would also like to point out that most of the local houses were here many years before the present trend to turn the wharf area into a canal theme park and tourist playground.

In our view there seems to be a direct contradiction between the planners understandable desire to permit more housing in the area, in contrast to the undermining effect of the creation of businesses which cause the erosion of living standards and general annoyance, in the same area.

We urge that the relevant authorities should only permit developments which properly respect the natural rights of those living in the vicinity.

That would need to be:- no noise and music, and no additional alcohol sales.

For these reasons we absolutely oppose all points in this licence application.

It is with dismay that we note an application to change the use of the Canal Trust Tea Rooms and we would be grateful if you would put on record our strongest opposition. It would appear that the cafe, housed in a small building on the canal towpath (originally the lock keepers small abode), is applying to sell alcohol and play music from 0900 to 2300 with a variety of other noise creating activities between 1000 and 2300.

The cafe is in a residential area far to well served by establishments selling drinks and making noise late into the night. People who live here are often woken by "drunks" walking along the towpath or loitering, noisily on the canal bridge after leaving the Canal Tavern, Lock Inn or Barge, all within a stones throw of each other. See map below.

The cafe, as it is now, is small inside and we cannot believe the noise of music, live or otherwise, would not spill out of the building, annoying many local residents. There are two blocks of OAP bungalows immediately behind the Canal Trust Tea-rooms, we hope they will be considered when this application is processed.

Please note that this application has been made by the same people who caused so much correspondence over their use of a music licence when running the Canal Tavern



I am writing to express a very strong objection to the application of a licence for the Kennet and Avon Canal Trust Café, 15 Frome Road.

The idea that this is even to be considered in such a building and location seems ridiculous, but I will quickly highlight the glaringly obvious factors from my point of view anyway-

<u>Very close proximity to areas of residence.</u> Most notably a row of bungalows built specifically for and occupied by old age pensioners, which look out immediately onto the Café, only metres away.

The position of the Café, on the side of a wide stretch of the canal, means any noise will carry well along the canal and over to the adjacent cottages on Frome Road, which have lived in relative peace for hundreds of years.

I doubt anyone will have missed the fact that the café is incredibly close indeed to 14 Frome Rd, my home. Any increase in noise from its current use will cause untold upset and disruption to the lives of anyone in this house, and the consideration of this licence shows no respect or feeling for anyone living there. In reality, no matter what conditions are made, or measures taken, a licensed bar in a residential area will cause significant disruption.

Very close proximity to existing licensed premises. Anyone with any knowledge of the local area will appreciate that there is simply no need for another drinking/music establishment. There are three others within a stone's throw – and any attention needs to be focused on policing existing problems with venues of this nature, and most certainly not on exacerbating the situation by creating a new one.

Structural unsuitability of premises. The cottage was designed as a small two-bedroom living residence with appropriate facilities and space. There is clearly no space for the amenities required for what is being proposed. The cottage is very significant in the history of the K&A canal, any attempt to modify it to cater for this usage would be a historical crime and very surprised anyone has allowed it even to be considered.

<u>Previous History of Canal Tavern.</u> I have experienced the problems at the Canal Tavern under the charge of its current landlords, who I believe are responsible for the application of the new licence at the Café. As I have lived at 14 Frome Road all my life, I have visited the pub many times. I would confidently say that the current managers have caused by far the greatest upset to the local area. They have agreed to keep the noise under control but continue to disappoint.

On a more personal level, my room at 14 Frome Road, my bedroom for the last 21 years (all my life) is the closest anyone has to sleep to the Canal Trust premises. Since the building became a café I have learnt to cope with the occasional lie in being disrupted by the opening up and setting out of seating. However the noise of an alcohol licensed, music-playing venue just metres from my window would make my life quite unbearable. I often have to wake early in the morning for both work and leisure, the notion of an early night or good nights sleep would become impossible.

I am confident anyone in an important decision making position will appreciate that the licensing of the trust tea rooms isn't sensible, cannot be justified and is not what the area needs.

I am writing to outline the reasons why I am opposed to granting an alcohol/live music licence to the café at 15 Frome Road, and why you should not take this decision lightly.

Firstly, the café is in the middle of a beautiful and tranquil area. This proposal, which includes selling alcohol to be consumed off the premises (ie. On the lock right outside my bedroom window) would have this spoiled, both for visitors and residents. The café as it is now, selling tea and cakes, is in keeping with the area and how we would very much like it to stay.

Apart from this, there is quite simply no need for another drinking establishment on Frome Road, with The Barge, The Canal Tavern and The Lock Inn serving nearby residents more than adequately. As it is, we are often woken up in the early hours by individuals leaving these premises and congregating on the lock for drunken behaviour.

Recently I can recall incidents such as a wheelie bin full of rubbish being thrown into the canal along with the ducks and swans, and also on more than one occasion people swimming in the canal at night. The safety implications of things like this must be taken into consideration especially as the café is on an unlit stretch of towpath.

My sister and I are both students, so obviously do not want this noise going on quite literally on our doorstep. The café is also just metres away from a row of retirement bungalows and the anguish and upset this would cause the residents would be considerable.

If this licence was granted it would only lead to much more of this unnecessary disruption. I sincerely hope that you will bear this in mind and come to the right decision over this.

I am writing to oppose most strongly the application of a premises licence for the Canal Trust Café. Firstly I would like to mention that notice of this was not placed in a very prominent place by the prospective landlords. It is tucked away in the corner of one of the windows, where there is a notice board nearby. Therefore please bear in mind any responses you receive represent a small proportion of neighbours who would be opposed, but whose attention has not been drawn to the notice (I have spoken to local residents who had no idea about the proposal.)

My family have lived next door to 15 Frome Rd for over 23 years now. When we purchased our property, this cottage was a residential dwelling and we thought we had found the ideal location overlooking the lock by the side of the canal. During these years, we have always supported any events held by the K&A Canal Trust, particularly the annual Wharf Show, which took place for many years over one weekend in September. When it was decided by the trust several years ago to turn the cottage into tea rooms, we naturally had some concerns regarding unauthorised traffic, noise and litter along the towpath. This has on occasions been a problem, but we raised no objections.

However, the prospect now of contending with live music and the sale of alcohol on and off the premises from 0900-2300 is totally abhorrent to us and would certainly shatter any peace and security we have in our home and garden. We as local residents know from experience that these live music events can go on till after midnight, as they did on Tuesday December 28th, when the Kisiogus were responsible for the running of the Canal Tavern. This is despite meetings between the prospective landlords of the café and local residents.

The granting of this licence would be utterly unacceptable to us and our neighbours, particularly the elderly people whose cottages overlook these premises, many of whom have failing health and are house-bound.

Finally, there is a plaque on the bench overlooking the lock, where I often sit with my dog as the day draws to a close, with a quotation from Aldous Huxley:

'And here we sit in peaceful calm....'

I have to express my outright objection to every aspect of the proposal for a licence for no. 15 Frome Road.

We have lived here as a family of five for almost 25 years since buying our listed home (number 14) from British Waterways. The sale was covered by several conditions – not to run a business, alter it in any way or subdivide – all of which I agree with. The house has been restored over the years, always with regard to the historic importance of the upper wharf area, which remains largely unspoilt at the moment.

Next door to us is number 15, which was an unaltered lock keeper's cottage and family home until recently, when the K&A Trust started a souvenir shop/café. We had concerns over this, and the thought of this little cottage being granted any sort of licence fills me with despair. It is simply not suitable; far too small to contain any of the proposed uses, meaning events would end up spilling out onto the unlit towpath (which in itself ought to be considered as a health and safety issue.) I imagine gazebos and marquees gradually becoming a permanent fixture and an eyesore in the canal lock area which we have always tried to preserve.

Anyway, there can be no justification for further licensed premises. We already have three within a few yards, and have had to put up with worsening disruption from these.

Please do give careful consideration to my objections as I do not want to see this area degenerating into the situation to be found on the lower wharf.

We wish to object most forcibly to every part of the application of the Canal Trust Café for the licence referred to above.

Present alcohol proposals.

The proposed addition of another outlet for alcohol is completely unjustified and the possibility of alcohol sales from 0900 until 2300, both on and off the premises, fills us with horror. It must be remembered that this is very much a residential area with houses placed directly adjacent to the canal banks.

Existing alcohol outlets.

This area is already well-stocked with alcohol providers as there are three existing licensed premises in the immediate vicinity. In fine weather householders are frequently disturbed and aggravated by noisy drinkers but especially so at night. Locals often find empty bottles and cans dumped in their front gardens. Any theoretical closing time tends to be completely ineffective as drinkers hang around the well lit bridge area often bawling and shrieking into the night.

Intended noise and music

The request to be permitted to create noise and music of all kinds from 1000 until 2300 is truly alarming to all local residents. The past disputes with the Kisioglu family are well documented in the files of the Environment and Licensing departments and clearly demonstrate their attitude to their neighbours.

The present 'truce' was only achieved by the intervention of Wadworths, the Public Protection Services, and a large meeting of aggrieved neighbouring residents. A Code of Practice was eventually agreed between the two parties and lodged with the Environment Department. When taking over the Canal Café Mrs Kisioglu assured us that they would not be seeking any further licence extensions. Bearing this in mind we find the present application insensitive and cynical.

Dance &c.

The very small internal area of the Café strongly implies that these events will have to be held outside. By their very nature partakers get excited and create even more noise which adds further to that of the music. Apparently there are no toilet facilities which could lead very unhygienic practices around the towpath area.

Adjacent housing.

The planners have permitted the building of houses in the infill areas which has resulted in the creation of St. Katherine's Quay (two blocks), Kennet Gardens (two blocks) and various infill areas in the Frome Road during the last few years. All these are extremely close to the Canal Café.

Kennet Gardens in particular is only a matter of yards away and will be subjected the most daunting effects of these activities. Most of the residents here are very elderly and sleep on the side of the house directly overlooking the café.

Houses directly opposite and on the other side of the canal will be detrimentally affected by these proposals as they are in the 'firing line' of the noise.

We would also like to point out that most of the local houses were here many years before the present trend to turn the wharf area into a canal theme park and tourist playground.

In our view there seems to be a direct contradiction between the planners understandable desire to permit more housing in the area, in contrast to the undermining effect of the creation of businesses which cause the erosion of living standards and general annoyance, in the same area.

We urge that the relevant authorities should only permit developments which properly respect the natural rights of those living in the vicinity.

That would need to be:- no noise and music, and no additional alcohol sales.

For these reasons we absolutely oppose all points in this licence application.



It is with dismay that we note an application to change the use of the Canal Trust Tea Rooms and we would be grateful if you would put on record our strongest opposition. It would appear that the cafe, housed in a small building on the canal towpath (originally the lock keepers small abode), is applying to sell alcohol and play music from 0900 to 2300 with a variety of other noise creating activities between 1000 and 2300.

The cafe is in a residential area far to well served by establishments selling drinks and making noise late into the night. People who live here are often woken by "drunks" walking along the towpath or loitering, noisily on the canal bridge after leaving the Canal Tavern, Lock Inn or Barge, all within a stones throw of each other. See map below.

The cafe, as it is now, is small inside and we cannot believe the noise of music, live or otherwise, would not spill out of the building, annoying many local residents. There are two blocks of OAP bungalows immediately behind the Canal Trust Tea-rooms, we hope they will be considered when this application is processed.

I have recently found out that a notice was placed in the Canal Trust Café applying for a premises licence. I can't think of a worse place to allow it to happen! The canal attracts lots of visitors who come for the picturesque and tranquil qualities of Bradford on Avon, local families enjoy frequent strolls along the canal who may think twice about taking their children along the tow-path in fear of them picking up hypo needles and splashing through puddles of sick which, no doubt having a licence in a quiet area like this, would attract the sort of people who would leave these things behind.

The café is only small so all events would have to take place outside, does Bradford on Avon really want loud music on from 9am until 11pm? Were you aware that there are OAP bungalows behind the café or does this not matter to the council? The council some years ago showed they were not interested in the older generation when they took over St Margaret's hall, which the OAP club used on a Wednesday afternoon, only to charge extortionate rates so that they were no longer able to afford to use it and the club had to shut down.



The building concerned has operated for a number of years as a tea-room, with a small number of tables inside – the space is very limited – and a number of tables outside in good weather. The garden is prize-winning and recently the surrounding area has been paved and could accommodate more tables than previously. As such, the tea-rooms have become a real asset to the upper wharf area of the canal, providing a different, (alcohol-free), service to the area than that already available from the Barge Inn, The Canal Tavern and the Lock Inn Licensed Café.

The area surrounding the tea-rooms is largely residential, with a private residence immediately bordering it along the tow path and a grouping of old people's bungalows immediately behind. (The bungalows are elevated from the site of the tea-rooms). Further my telephone to Maggie in your department yesterday, I am putting my objections to the above application in writing and am delivering by hand to yourselves on 27th January 2011.

I believe I come under the category of 'Interested Party' as I live within the vicinity of the premises applying for the license.

My property abuts the canal bank in Bradford on Avon just down from the Canal Trust shop. It is a very quiet, beautiful area and is wildlife corridor between Trowbridge and Bradford on Avon. We have an abundance of wildlife which even include Kingfishers and Bats and have even seen Water Voles swimming and nesting on the bank both by our house and also near to the Canal Trust Shop.

Noise travels very easily across water, this is a residential area and any music played outside the shop would certainly cause a public nuisance for us all who live here.

Many visitors from both here and overseas have commented on how nice and peaceful it is here, we used to run a B&B business and that is one of the things people commented on. There are many species of birds and bats, we have some in our loft, all of these would be affected. The bats can be seen flying on the opposite side of the canal (same side as the Trust shop) do we want really want to risk these disappearing?

Bradford town centre itself has no loud outside music playing so why should we have to put up with this in the rural area? I went to speak to the lady at the Canal Trust shop and enquired when exactly she planned to play the music and was told "whenever I want to" I said what would happen if we complained should she get permission, and she replied "by the time you complain to the council, the function will be over and they won't be able to do much about it by then".

We have always worked closely with the local Boat Hire people, as occasionally there is a "hen or Stag" party on a boat, and they immediately call the people to ask them to turn down the noise, they also appreciate the fact it is a residential area and as I have already stated sound carries over water. I got the feeling that the owner did not share this view as she told me it was none of my business how she ran her "tea Shop".

I understand, to the best of my knowledge, that few or no objections were raised for their Tea Shop application which is a fitting business for the canal bank, but is this what it was really leading to? Apparently, wedding receptions and birthday parties will be catered for and she told me she fully intends to carry on until 11.00 at night and will then apply for a later licence for certain functions if she so wishes! She also said that horse racing (betting on videos of racing) would be shown outside, I cannot imagine how much noise this will create!

Although they have complied with your rules by displaying the planning application in their window, their shop is on the Towpath and unlikely to be seen by the residents unless they go and look in the window. Some residents in Spencers Orchard knew nothing of the application even though we will all be affected, I was only told on Sunday afternoon after happening to meet someone in Sainsbury's and I will be really affected by the noise if they get permission.

There are also other drinking establishments within the area, and with this financial recession do we really need another one? It just spreads the potential takings for each establishment even further, which does not give support to those who have been trading for many years, and have given us no cause to complain. Another very important fact, are you familiar with the position of the premises, it is right next to the open lock, easy to fall into and extremely difficult to get out of, especially if under the influence, although there is a life belt available, this sometimes goes missing! Are they prepared to provide adequate safety measures? The licensed premises near to them do not have this particular problem as they are on the other side of the lock which would make it far easier for them to rescue someone.

We would be more than happy to come and air our grievances to yourselves if required, so please do not hesitate to contact us.



We have written this presentation to give a quick insight of the Canal Trust Café in the support of the premises licence application.

The Kennet & Avon Canal Trust was formed in 1962 by a group of canal enthusiasts to restore the then closed kennet & Avon Canal from Reading to Bristol as a 'through' navigation as a public amenity. The trust now has over 5,000 members and since the canal was officially reopened by HRH the Queen in 1990 its role has been to raise awareness of the great significance of the waterways and contribute funds towards its continuing maintenance!

There are 6 shops/café along the Kennet and Avon canal and ours is situated on lock 49 in a very picturesque setting. The Café was originally the Lock Keepers Cottage and was opened as a café by The Prince of Wales in May 2003. Since then it has been very popular with locals, the boating community and visitors to the area. The photo below gives you an idea of the location of the café as it is set just back from the tow path after the lock.






My husband and I have been running the café for just over a year now. When we first arrived it was tired and dated so we have invested a lot of time and money to upgrade the building, inside and out. We have recently installed a prep room upstairs in order to meet the high demands of food orders in the summer months.

The cafe is a small downstairs area which seats 24 people, there is a small open plan kitchen and a pretty garden to the side, there is room for a few tables to the front of the building and a few to the patio area. Upstairs is a prep room, staff toilet and an office. The garden is maintained by the volunteers throughout the summer and has always won awards.

Last season when we were open during the summer months, we noticed a gap in the market to sell a small range of alcoholic beverages. A lot of customers were asking for a local alc or cider and we were having to turn custom away. This was one of the main reasons why we decided to apply for a licence.

Originally we ran a local pub called The Canal Tavern, just a few yards away. Our plan was to come out of the pub and run the café full time. We handed over the pub to the new tennants in January and see the Cafe now as our main priority.

When applying for a premises licence, it is quite a costly procedure and we thought it necessary to apply for the entertainment that could be possibly required in the future. I expressed deeply in my main application that there will be no regular music or entertainment and that we won't be staying open till late.

However, when the notice went up in the window, it caused a lot of upset with the neighbours close by and they have strongly expressed there to be no disturbance from music or late night opening. I feel the main application justifies our plans and it must be acknowledged that we never intend to be a bar or a pub, I can't express enough how important it is to know that it is a small café with no cellar facilities, just a few rows of local ale/cider etc in the fridge to meet the demand of the summer trade.

When reading the representations I was quite shocked that so many people were worried about the music issues, people had heard some very odd ideas; one lady for example said we were planning on showing video horse racing outside! I even sent a letter to everyone apologizing for the confusion (see appendix 1). I felt a lot of people were comparing us to the Canal Tavern where we did have a few noise issues in the past but we invited the residents to the pub and came up with an agreement. It was quite harsh some of the things people wrote in their letters and if you refer to appendix 2 for example this letter should be dismissed as none of the words that I apparently quoted came from me. I felt hurt that people would view me in that manner.

Noise pollution is a very delicate subject in this local area; I can truly understand people do not want to be disturbed by other people's noise in their own back garden. There are 3 pubs very close by and we do not want to be associated or thought to be making noise, that is why it is necessary to perhaps withdraw any live music and gain the trust of the residents that the café will continue as normal and no extra nuisance will be generated from the café having an alcoholic licence.

If granted our main revenue will still be from tea & coffee/food/ice creams. We will be selling local beer to promote local industries but again there is not much room for a lot, it is just so we don't miss out on custom. We had a table for 6 for example last year, 2 of them wanted a beer so they left and went to the pub across the road. We also sell the boat trip tickets and the souvenirs for the Trust.

We have full support of The Canal Trust in our application (see appendix 3) and also our local customers have supported us as well as staff. We have talked to the local businesses near by and we also have their blessing. Many of the local neighbours have come in to show us the petitions and letters that have been sent round and understand why we are applying for a licence.

We are very experienced in the licence trade and it is only when you let people miss use alcohol that it becomes a problem. Our aim is not to have the pub trade but have the option available to our customers if required. It would be nice for people to take advantage of the surrounds and of an early evening, enjoy a glass of wine and a bowl of olives for example, that is the impression we'd like to give out: not larger louts and stag dos!

I'd like to conclude by expressing again that we do not intend on generating any more traffic to the area, we have no intention on having late nights. We are a young family with 3 children; a café is more suitable with our life style. The café is very small, there is no room for in door entertainment and there will be no out door amplified music. The purpose of applying for the licence is to have that option available and not miss out on opportunities. We are both very considerate people and understand people's worries and concerns over noise. If granted a licence, the residents will not be disturbed from us selling alcohol.

I write firstly, to sincerely apologise for the misunderstanding I may have caused with regards to the licence application for the café. It was very insensitive of me not to come and visit you before the notice went up to put your minds at rest. You may not know that our family has just moved out from the Canal Tavern so my mind has been a bit pre occupied! I really do apologise once again.

I also write to let you know that I don't intend on having any live music, whether it be indoors or out! I also certainly won't be staying open till all hours of the evening! We came out of the pub to concentrate on being a family and spend more quality time together. My husband is a manager at Centre Parcs and running a small seasonal café, fits in with my family life.

When applying for a licence, it is quite a costly affair and it was advised to apply to the items that I may want to use. The only time I can think of having out door music is during the Fringe festival, which would be a Sunday Afternoon! I will not be creating any more custom at the café by having a licence, it is just meeting the demand and giving my guests more options. I feel sitting in the garden with a glass of wine perhaps, on a summer's afternoon, or early evening is quite appealing to all. I really appreciate the concern for noise but there will be no extra from us. I would be just the same if I thought I was having a pub thrown at me at the bottom of the garden!

I am a very responsible person, and feel quite hurt from some of the comments made, when there were issues in the past from the Canal Tavern, I invited everyone to my home and came up with an agreement. It wasn't just the Canal Tavern that had music or noise.

I would like to finish off by again stressing that this is a small ground floor pretty tea room/café and by having an alcohol licence, will not disturb my neighbours in any way. There is no room for a cellar, so a row or two of alcohol drinks in the fridge will not be a major part of my business. I am just creating more choice for my customers; the tea rooms will never be a bar or a public house and daily music will continue to be in the form of light back ground radio music or classical c.ds.

I hope I have put your minds at rest, I really do appreciate everyone's concerns and worries. Please feel free to come and see me over at the café, during the winter it is open Fri, Sat, Sun, Mon from 9.30am till no later than 4pm.

LICENSING TEAM - CANAL TRUST TEA SHOP BRADFORD ON AVON

Further my telephone to Maggie in your department yesterday, I am putting my objections to the above application in writing and am delivering by hand to yourselves on 27th January 2011.

I believe I come under the category of 'Interested Party' as I live within the vicinity of the premises applying for the license.

My property abuts the canal bank in Bradford on Avon just down from the Canal Trust shop. It is a very quiet, beautiful area and is wildlife corridor between Trowbridge and Bradford on Avon. We have an abundance of wildlife which even include Kingfishers and Bats and have even seen Water Voles swimming and nesting on the bank both by our house and also near to the Canal Trust Shop.

Noise travels very easily across water, this is a residential area and any music played outside the shop would certainly cause a public nuisance for us all who live here.

Many visitors from both here and overseas have commented on how nice and peaceful it is here, we used to run a B&B business and that is one of the things people commented on. There are many species of birds and bats, we have some in our loft, all of these would be affected. The bats can be seen flying on the opposite side of the canal (same side as the Trust shop) do we want really want to risk these disappearing?

Bradford town centre itself has no loud outside music playing so why should we have to put up with this in the rural area? I went to speak to the lady at the Canal Trust shop and enquired when exactly she planned to play the music and was told "whenever I want to" I said what would happen if we complained should she get permission, and she replied "by the time you complain to the council, the function will be over and they won't be able to do much about it by then".

We have always worked closely with the local Boat Hire people, as occasionally there is a "hen or Stag" party on a boat, and they immediately call the people to ask them to turn down the noise, they also appreciate the fact it is a residential area and as I have already stated sound carries over water. I got the feeling that the owner did not share this view as she told me it was none of my business how she ran her "tea Shop".

I understand, to the best of my knowledge, that few or no objections were raised for their Tea Shop application which is a fitting business for the canal bank, but is this what it was really leading to? Apparently, wedding receptions and birthday parties will be catered for and she told me she fully intends to carry on until 11.00 at night and will then apply for a later licence for certain functions if she so wishes! She also said that horse racing (betting on videos of racing) would be shown outside, I cannot imagine how much noise this will create!

Although they have complied with your rules by displaying the planning application in their window, their shop is on the Towpath and unlikely to be seen by the residents unless they go and look in the window. Some residents in Spencers Orchard knew nothing of the application even though we will all be affected, I was only told on Sunday afternoon after happening to meet someone in Sainsbury's and I will be really affected by the noise if they get permission.

There are also other drinking establishments within the area, and with this financial recession do we really need another one? It just spreads the potential takings for each establishment even further, which does not give support to those who have been trading for many years, and have given us no cause to complain. Another very important fact, are you familiar with the position of the premises, it is right next to the open lock, easy to fall into and extremely difficult to get out of, especially if under the influence, although there is a life belt available, this sometimes goes missing! Are they prepared to provide adequate safety measures? The licensed premises near to them do not have this particular problem as they are on the other side of the lock which would make it far easier for them to rescue someone.

We would be more than happy to come and air our grievances to yourselves if required, so please do not hesitate to contact us.

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
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
