LICENSING COMMITTEE

PROCEDURAL RULES FOR THE HEARING OF LICENSING ACT 2003 APPLICATIONS

1 Purpose

- 1.1 These rules have been prepared to facilitate proper consideration of licence applications, made under the Licensing Act 2003, by the Licensing Committee and its Sub Committees.
- 1.2 The rules set out a framework for how applications are to be heard and explain the role of the participants at the Hearing.

2 Definitions

- 2.1 The following definitions describe the participants at and the subject matter of a Hearing:
 - **"Applicant"** means the person who has submitted an Application for consideration by the Committee.
 - "Applicant's Premises" means premises subject to the Application.
 - "Applicant's Representative" means a person attending a Hearing to assist or represent an Applicant including a lawyer.
 - "Application" means an application for the Grant/Variation/Transfer/Review and any other decision to be made by the Committee/Sub-Committee in respect of a Licence.
 - "Chairperson" means the Member who is the Chairperson of the Committee for the particular Hearing.
 - **"Committee"** means the Council's Licensing Committee and includes any Sub Committee of the Licensing Committee.
 - "Committee Lawyer" means the Council's Lawyer (including an external Lawyer instructed by the Council's Legal & Democratic Services Manager) who is present at a Hearing to advise the Chairperson and the Members.
 - **"Committee Manager"** means the Council's Officer who is present at a Hearing to take minutes.
 - **"Committee Report"** means the Licensing Officer's written report to the Committee concerning an Application, a copy of which has been previously made available to the Applicant or their Representative, a Responsible Authority or their Representative or an Interested Party or their Representative.

- "Hearing" means a meeting of the Committee at which an Application is considered.
- "Licence" means a Licence which the Committee has the power or duty inter alia to grant, transfer, suspend or revoke.
- "Licensing Officer" means the Council's Licensing Officer(s) who is/are present at a Hearing to present reports in respect of an Application and to give technical advice in respect of an Application to the Committee when requested.
- "Licensing Authority" the Council in whose geographical area the subject matter of the Application relates to, and includes the Council's Licensing Committee, any Sub Committee of the Licensing Committee and a Licensing Officer.
- **"Member"** means a Member who is a Member of the Committee that is considering an Application.
- "Responsible Authority" means a person who is present at a Hearing to make representations in respect of an Application in their capacity as Responsible Authority and includes any person who is present to assist or make representations on behalf of the Responsible Authority including a Lawyer.
- "Interested Party" means a person who is present at a Hearing to make representations in respect of an Application in their capacity as an Interested Party, and includes any person who is present to assist or make representations on behalf of the Interested Party including a Lawyer.

3 Key Principles

- 3.1 The principles of 'natural justice', and Article 6 'Right to a Fair Trial', which is one of the Convention Rights in the Human Rights Act 1998, require that there is a fair Hearing of Applications.
- 3.2 Natural justice is an umbrella term for the legal standards of basic fairness. This will include that:
 - 3.2.1 the Applicant has an opportunity to make representations before a decision is
 - 3.2.2 those making representations have an opportunity to voice their representations before a decision is made;
 - 3.2.3 the Applicant has an adequate opportunity to consider and respond to any submissions made by a Responsible Authority/Authorities and/or an Interested Party/Parties;
 - 3.2.4 the Committee does not exclude an Applicant from a Hearing in order to consider submissions from a Responsible Authority/Authorities and/or an Interested Party/Parties.
- 3.3 It is also fundamental that there is an orderly presentation of submissions at a Hearing so that the relevant issues are properly understood, evidence is tested and that oral statements made at the Hearing are accurately recorded.
- 3.4 Ultimately the Chairperson determines the application of these rules, having regard to any submissions being made by those present and in particular the Committee Lawyer.

4 The Hearing

- 4.1 The Hearing shall take place in public.
 - 4.1.1 The Committee may exclude the public from all or part of the Hearing where it considers it to be in the public interest to do so and, in accordance with the Local Government (Access to Information) Act 1985, as amended. Public includes a party and any person assisting or representing a party.
 - 4.1.2 The Committee may require any person attending the Hearing who, in its opinion, is behaving in a disruptive manner, to leave the Hearing and may:
 - a refuse to permit them to return;
 - b permit them to return only on such conditions as the Committee may specify:
 - c in the event that a person is required to leave a Hearing that person may, before the end of the Hearing, submit to the Committee in writing any information which they would have given orally.
- 4.2 Prior to the Hearing commencing, the Chairperson shall advise the parties of the procedure it proposes to follow at the Hearing.
- 4.3 Where a party has previously requested permission for a person(s), other than their representative, to appear at the Hearing then the Committee shall consider whether to permit that request.
- 4.4 The Committee will allow the parties an equal maximum period of time in which to exercise their rights.
- 4.5 This equal maximum time may have been notified in advance of the Hearing;
- 4.6 Where there is a multiple of Interested Parties who have attended the Hearing to make the same representation then the Committee would normally require that a spokesperson be appointed by them to make the representations on behalf of all of those Interested Parties.

5 Presentation of Submissions

- 5.1 The Chairperson will introduce the Application.
- 5.2 In the event that the Licensing Authority has given notice to a party requiring clarification on a point(s) then that party shall respond to the points raised by the Licensing Authority.
- 5.3 Submissions shall be made in the following order unless the Chairperson directs otherwise:
 - 5.3.1 The Licensing Officer will orally present the Committee Report and will in particular advise the Committee as to:
 - a the options available to it;
 - b the considerations that are relevant in reaching its decision.
 - 5.3.2 The Applicant (or the Applicant's Representative) may orally present its submission which may include:

- a presenting their case in accordance with the papers, which will have been circulated with Agenda papers;
- b confirming key information and answer pertinent questions; and
- c calling witnesses in support of the Application (see paragraph 4.3).

A Responsible Authority/Authorities and/or an Interested Party/Parties will orally present their representations in turn which shall include:

- a the grounds of the representation to the Application; and
- b any condition(s) that the Responsible Authority/Authorities and/or an Interested Party/Parties would be happy to have the Application granted subject to which would cause the representation to be withdrawn.

6 Questioning of Submissions

- 6.1 The Chairperson will regulate the order in which questions are asked by Members.
- 6.2 The Chairperson and Members, voiced through the Chairperson, may question any party following the completion of their submission.
- 6.3 The Chairperson will normally permit the Applicant, a Responsible Authority/Authorities or an Interested Party/Parties to ask questions through them of the other parties
- 6.4 The Chairperson may direct that questions which are not relevant to the Application or one of the four Licensing Objectives are not formally put or answered.

7 Documentation

7.1 No party shall present new documentation to the Committee at the Hearing other than with the consent of all of the other parties. This does not preclude the Licensing Officer from correcting errors, providing updated information or an extract from a local map showing the Applicant's Premises in the context of the surrounding premises and any Interested Party's premises. If any party is granted permission to present supplementary papers at the Hearing they shall provide at least 10 copies at the start of their submission.

8 Intervention

The Chairperson shall permit the following interventions at any point in the Hearing:

- 8.1 The Committee Lawyer to advise the Committee on issues of law, procedure and relevant considerations on decision making. If necessary, the Chairperson may require the Committee, the Committee Lawyer and the Committee Manager to leave the Hearing so that advice can be given.
- 8.2 The Committee Manager to advise the Committee on procedure generally, or to request that statements made are repeated for reasons of clarity and so that they can be properly recorded.
- 8.3 The Licensing Officer to seek to clarify statements that have been made in light of information held on their file.

9 Failure of Parties to Attend Hearing

- 9.1 If a party has informed the Licensing Authority that it does not intend to attend or be represented at a Hearing, the Hearing may proceed in its absence.
- 9.2 If a party has not indicated that it does not intend to attend or be represented at a Hearing and fails to attend or be represented at the Hearing then the Licensing Authority may:
 - 9.2.1 where it considers it be necessary in the public interest, adjourn the Hearing to a specified date; or
 - 9.2.2 hold the Hearing in the party's absence.
- 9.3 Where the Licensing Authority holds a Hearing in the absence of a party, it shall consider at the Hearing the application, representations or notice made by that party.

10 Closing Submissions

10.1 The Chairperson shall allow first, the Responsible Authority/Authorities and the Interested Party/Parties to make a closing oral submission(s) and secondly invite the Applicant or the Applicant's Representative an opportunity to make an oral closing submission in support of the Application

11 Decision

- 11.1 The Committee, the Committee Lawyer and the Committee Manager, shall retire so that the decision may be considered in private, and to consider any legal issues raised by the Members.
- 11.2 The decision, and reasons for the decision, of the Committee shall be communicated orally by the Chairperson to the parties after the Committee has deliberated in private on the Application.
- 11.3 Written reasons shall be provided soon after the deliberations of the Application and in any event within the statutory time limits.

Hearing Procedure Summary

- 1. The Chairperson welcomes all those present and introduces the Application.
- 2. The Chairperson introduces the Applicant, Responsible Authority/Authorities and/or Interested Party/Parties.
- 3. The Chairperson outlines the Hearing Procedure.
- 4. The Licensing Officer presents the Committee Report.
- 5. The Applicant addresses the Committee.
- 6. Questions to the Applicant by Responsible Authority/Authorities and/or Interested Party/Parties.
- 7. Questions to the Applicant by Members of the Committee.
- 8. Comments by Responsible Authority/Authorities and/or Interested Party/Parties.
- 9. Questions by Applicant.
- Questions to Responsible Authority/Authorities and/or Interested Party/Parties by Members of the Committee.
- 11. Summing up by Parties who have made representations.
- 12. Summing up by Applicant.
- 13. Committee retires with the Committee Lawyer and Committee Manager to consider its decision.
- 14. Committee returns and the Lawyer gives a summary of any legal advice that may have been given to the Committee, and invites the parties present to make any comments on that advice.
- 15. The Chairperson either gives the decision with reasons, or advises that it will be released in writing with reasons within the statutory time limits.

1. Purpose of Report

1.1 To determine an application for a Premises Licence in respect of The Old Fire Station made by James Beanland.

2. Background Information

- 2.1 An application for a Premises Licence in respect of The Old Fire Station has been made by James Beanland for which relevant representations have been received.
- 2.2 Wiltshire Council (as the Licensing Authority) must hold a hearing to consider the application having regard to the representations. In accordance with Section 18 (3) of The Licensing Act 2003 the Licensing Sub Committee is required to take such of the steps listed in 2.4 below as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives. In considering the application and the relevant representations, the Sub Committee must also have regard to relevant Government guidance and the Council's Licensing Policy
- 2.3 The licensing objectives are:
 - i) The Prevention of Crime and Disorder;
 - ii) Public Safety:
 - iii) The Prevention of Public Nuisance; and
 - iv) The Protection of Children from Harm.

2.4 Such steps are:

- i) To grant the licence subject to such conditions as are consistent with those included in the operating schedule submitted with the application, modified to such extent as the Sub Committee considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives, together with any mandatory conditions required by the Licensing Act.
- ii) To exclude from the scope of the application any licensable activity.
- iii) To refuse to specify a person as the designated premises supervisor.
- iv) To reject the application.
- 2.5 On 6 May 2011 an application for a Premises Licence was received and accepted as a valid application.

2.6 The application as applied for is as follows:

- 2.7 This is a new business, which is not yet trading. The premises are not currently licensed for any activity. The application is to licence the first floor of the premises which is at present being occupied as a photographer's studio.
- 2.8 A location plan of the area to be licensed is attached as Appendix 6 to this report.
- 2.9 A copy of the plans submitted by the Applicant with the application, will be available at the hearing.

3. **Consultation and Representations**

3.1 The application process requires a public notice to be posted on the premises for a period of 28 days, in addition to a notice in a local publication. During the consultation period relevant representations have been received from one Responsible Authority and twenty-seven Interested Parties.

- 3.5 The relevant representations are attached as Appendix 2. Attached as Appendix 6 is a plan which shows the locations from where representations have been made from Interested Parties.
- 3.6 Following an exchange of correspondence between the Applicant and the Wiltshire Police during the application 28 day consultation period, Mr Beanland has offered to amend his application as follows:
 - 1. The premises capacity will be limited to 130 persons.
 - 2. Customers will not be permitted to smoke outside the front of the premises.
 - 3. CCTV will be installed to cover the public areas and all entrances/exits, the CCTV system will be in working order at all times. The system will be sufficient quality so as to produce images which enable identification. Images will be stored securely for a minimum of 30 days and will be made available to a police officer or an officer of the Council on request.
- 3.7 The Applicant has also offered the following, in relation to hours applied for:
 - (i) Revised hours for licensable activities (excluding Late Night Refreshment) Sunday, Wednesday & Thursday to 2300.

When a Sunday is followed by a public/bank holiday, the finish time on that Sunday will be 0200.

Monday, Tuesday, Friday & Saturday to remain as applied for.

- (ii) Revised hours for Late Night Refreshment Sunday, Wednesday & Thursday to 2330.When a Sunday is followed by a public/bank holiday, the finish time on that Sunday will be 0230.
 - Friday & Saturday to remain as applied for.
- 3.8 A copy of the email from the Applicant James Beanland amending his application, is attached as Appendix 3.
- 3.9 Copy of the letter from Licensing Wiltshire Council, sent to the Public Protection Officer and residents informing them of the Applicant's amendments, is attached as Appendix 4.
- 3.10 Copies of responses received, are attached as Appendix 5.

4. Legal Implications

- 4.1 This hearing is governed by the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations. These provide that hearings should be held in public unless the Licensing Authority considers that the public interest in excluding the public outweighs the public interest in the hearing taking place in public.
- 4.2 The Applicant, all Responsible Authorities and Interested Parties who have made representations have been informed of the date, time and location of the hearing and their right to attend and be represented.
- 4.3 At the hearing all those Responsible Authorities and Interested Parties who have made representations are entitled to address the Sub Committee and to ask questions of another party, with the consent of the Sub Committee.

5. Officer Recommendations

5.1 Officers are not permitted to make a recommendation – the decision is to be reached by the members of the Licensing Sub Committee.

6. Right of Appeal

- 6.1 It should be noted that the Applicant, the Responsible Authority and Interested Parties who have made representations, may appeal the decision made by the Licensing Sub Committee to the Magistrates Court. The appeal must be lodged with the Magistrates Court within 21 days of the notification of the decision.
- 6.2 In the event of an appeal being lodged, the decision made by the Licensing Sub Committee remains valid until any appeal is heard and any decision made by the Magistrates Court.
- A Responsible Authority or an Interested Party may apply to the Licensing Authority for a Review of a Premises Licence. Whether or not a Review Hearing takes place is in the discretion of the Licensing Authority, but if requested by an Interested Party, will not normally be granted within the first 12 months except for the most compelling circumstances.

OBJECTION TO THE APPLICATION FOR AN ALCOHOL AND BEVERAGE LICENCE FOR THE OLD FIRE STATION; THE CLOSE; WARMINSTER; BA12 9AL

I am writing on behalf of the residents of The Close; Warminster who are dismayed that a licensing application has been made to convert the Old Fire Station which is currently a photographers studio into a Wine Bar with opening hours until 0100 or 0200 hours in the morning 5 nights a week some few metres from our houses.

This incredibly insensitive application takes no account of the local residents. On the same side of the road as the proposed Bar there are family dwellings 2 metres away, a further 20 metres away is a group of 30 sheltered houses with mostly pensioners, many of whom are extremely vulnerable. Across the road the first of 4 houses in a row is some 10 metres away. The public nuisance to people from a Bar opened to early morning 5 night a as week is intolerable on our quality of life as families get ready for work and school.

This is essentially a quiet residential road in the evening when the daytime traffic calms. This ingress of the 'High Street' into The Close and will completely change the character of the road. The proposed trading times and application to play 'disco music' until the early hours is also absolutely contrary to the circular sent out by the applicant to the locals in The Close in which he stated that that the music would be 'background only and certainly not amplified club music'.

The extremely narrow and uneven pavement (less than 0'5 metre wide) directly outside the proposed Bar will force vulnerable locals off the pavement into the road when younger people are hanging around or queuing to get into the bar or indeed when commercial waste bins from the premises are placed outside the bar. This will impact particularly on the elderly residents of Kyngston Court who will be forced into the road which is particularly dangerous given some use walking frames and mobility tricycles.

We have been subject to anti-social disturbances from a 'Sports Bar' 50 metres to the rear of this new proposed Wine Bar. The patrons of this bar and the new proposed bar will turn The Close into a taxi rank in the early hours of the morning. The neighbours already have to pick up alcohol bottles and glasses that are left on the windows of the council building directly across from the Old Fire Station left by patrons leaving the Prestbury Sports Bar located some 50 metres to the rear of the

Old Fire Station. This proposed bar actually within this residential road will further exacerbate this public nuisance.

From a personal point of view my son who is diagnosed with Asperger's Syndrome will suffer further anxiety attacks as a result of the noise from patrons of this Wine bar 'spilling out' at closing time in the early hours. He currently suffers panic attacks when noisy often drunken patrons of the Prestbury Sports Bar end up in our road waiting on taxi's and lifts to take them home at a time when my family are attempting to sleep before school or work. My wife is now struggling to cope with the anxiety attacks my son suffers from and she herself is now seeing her doctor with stress. I am also keenly aware of the vulnerability of my elderly neighbours who will have to endure this all pervasive noise pollution. This will impact on the very many individuals of The Close and their right of peace, quiet at home and our sleep disturbance.

We have had correspondence with Andrew Murrison MP who well understands our concerns and agrees that we should resist the incursion of the commercial centre of the town into The Close where it will disturb the people living our lives, I hope the authority agrees with these sentiments?

I attach as an enclosure to this letter the names of the neighbours who universally are against the granting of this licence in the hope that the Executive Authority grasps the reality of our predicament.

We the residents of The Close in Warminster hereby affirm that we DO NOT WISH to see an alcohol licence granted for the The Old Fire Station in our road and see it turned into a Wine ----- Bar. We are extremely concerned about the consequences which are outlined below:

- On the same side of the road as the proposed Bar there are family dwellings 2
 metres away, a further 20 metres away is a group of 30 sheltered houses with mostly
 pensioners, many of whom are extremely vulnerable. Across the road the first of 4
 houses in a row is some 10 metres away. The public nuisance of people of a Bar
 opened to between 0100 to 0200 hours 5 night a as week is intolerable on our quality
 of life.
- This is essentially a quiet residential road in the evening when the daytime traffic calms. This is the ingress of the 'High Street' into The Close and will completely change the character of the road.
- There are double yellow lines throughout The Close except for two taxi berths further down the road. Cars will illegally park immediately outside our dwellings which on one side of the road has absolutely no pavement so will be up against our windows.
- Dropping off and picking up patrons will take place 7 nights a week until the early hours of the morning if this proposal is allowed, families with children of school age will be impacted enormously.
- The noise from Patrons awaiting taxis and lifts outside the bar in the early hours will mean that residents will be hugely disturbed. Employing door stewards will not stop public nuisance as they await lifts directly outside our houses.

We the residents of The Close in Warminster hereby affirm that we DO NOT WISH to see an alcohol licence granted for the The Old Fire Station in our road and see it turned into a Wine Bar. We are extremely concerned about the consequences which are outlined below:

RECEIVED 23 MAY 2011 On the same side of the road as the proposed Bar there are family dwellings 2 metres away, a further 20 metres away is a group of 30 sheltered houses with mostly pensioners, many of whom are extremely vulnerable. Across the road the first of 4 houses in a row is some 10 metres away. The public nuisance of people of a Bar opened to between 0100 to 0200 hours 5 night a as week is intolerable on our quality of life.

This is essentially a quiet residential road in the evening when the daytime traffic calms. This is the ingress of the 'High Street' into The Close and will completely change the character of the road.

- There are double yellow lines throughout The Close except for two taxi berths further down the road. Cars will illegally park immediately outside our dwellings which on one side of the road has absolutely no pavement so will be up against our windows.
- Dropping off and picking up patrons will take place 7 nights a week until the early hours of the morning if this proposal is allowed, families with children of school age will be impacted enormously.
- The noise from Patrons awaiting taxis and lifts outside the bar in the early hours will mean that residents will be hugely disturbed. Employing door stewards will not stop public nuisance as they await lifts directly outside our houses.
- We have been subject to anti-social disturbances from a 'Sports Bar' 50 metres to the rear of this new proposed Wine Bar. The patrons of this bar and the new proposed bar will turn The Close into a taxi rank impacting on us hugely.

The premises are situated right alongside residential property and there are other residential premises in the near vicinity. There is shown a small outdoor area, which seems to be enclosed by a wall and which I can see is proposed as a smoking area.

The proposal description is for "conversion of the ground floor, to provide a wine bar and disco".

I note that the hours proposed are up to 2am on three nights of the week and 1am for two others. I also note that the application is for live and recorded music to the same hours and that a dance floor is shown and a DJ booth mentioned.

The applicant is proposing amplified music but has provided no calculations to demonstrate that this can be undertaken without causing undue loss of amenity to neighbours or any proposals to avoid noise breakout. Whilst I acknowledge that there is some detail of various management controls proposed, these do not yet address the principle of the proposal.

I have major doubts as to whether this proposal is capable of taking place without causing public nuisance due to noise breakout. There are three dwellings within about 15 metres of the premises and others in the vicinity. In the absence of any more detailed proposals I must object to the proposal as it stands.

It is possible that my objection could be addressed by modifying the proposal to significantly reduce the music element in the proposal.





I am writing to object to the planning application on the above premises. I feel a drinking venue would be totally out of keeping within a residential area, especially next to sheltered housing.

Although our address is High Street the front door to our private accommodation and premises is in The Close. We are in fact the next building heading south from the Old Fire Station and our bedroom overlooks The Close at street level. As such we are already subject to abuse from drunken revellers not to mention broken windows and urinating on our property, including once, literally through the letter box.

As no smoking is allowed indoors I feel that groups of smokers would gather on the street causing an added traffic hazard, the pavement is extremely narrow at this point and The Close is already subject to illegal parking, especially on nights when the Athenaeum theatre is in use. The combination of illegally parked vehicles and people milling in the road would cause real danger, including blocking access for emergency vehicles and buses, not to mention the noise and litter levels. One only has to look outside some establishments in town to see the level of smoking related fouling on the pavements.

The licence application also states that it will be promoting live music, dancing and recorded music. If this is the case there will be considerable noise from the premises late into the night which is not acceptable in a clearly residential area. The square footage of the premises does not seem conducive with this aim and therefore I would consider this dangerous. Also significant sound proofing would need to be done, to ensure music and incessant drum beats were not heard or felt by neighbouring properties, reducing the quality of our living environment. Prevention of egress to smoking areas of this music and noise would also need to be considered.



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

When a Sunday is followed by a public/bank holiday, the finish time on that Sunday will be 0200.

Monday, Tuesday, Friday & Saturday to remain as applied for.

Revised hours for Late Night Refreshment

Sunday, Wednesday & Thursday 2300 - 2330

When a Sunday is followed by a public/bank holiday, the finish time on that Sunday will be 0230.

Friday & Saturday to remain as applied for.

- 2. The premises capacity will be limited to 130 persons.
- 3. Customers will not be permitted to smoke outside the front of the premises.
- 4. CCTV will be installed to cover the public areas and all entrances/exits, the CCTV system will be in working order at all times. The system will be sufficient quality so as to produce images which enable identification. Images will be stored securely for a minimum of 30 days and will be made available to a police officer or an officer of the Council on request.


