## Salisbury Market Square Survey

Salisbury Vision is seeking to develop parts of the City to meet the needs of residents, shoppers, traders and tourists in the 21st century. It wants to do so in a way that is sensitive to Salisbury's medieval roots. The Vision covers the whole of Salisbury, not just the City centre and will later be key in redeveloping the Maltings, Central Car Park and the Churchfields Industrial Estate among other sites. The Market Square is the first project it is looking at.

With the rise in internet shopping and retail centres around us keen to draw in shoppers, we need to make visiting Salisbury an enjoyable experience, one which offers more than other alternatives. We have so many fantastic attractions which we could and should utilise even more. The Cathedral, The Close, the Market Square, Guildhall and all the wonderful medieval architecture the City boasts. The challenge is to find a way to improve the experience of Salisbury while retaining its unique character. The initial design for the Market Square was chosen from a competition where six different designs were considered. The winning design, chosen in 2008, has since been modified and recently many residents have raised concerns about aspects of the design.
