LICENSING COMMITTEE

PROCEDURAL RULES FOR THE HEARING OF LICENSING ACT 2003 APPLICATIONS

1 Purpose

- 1.1 These rules have been prepared to facilitate proper consideration of licence applications, made under the Licensing Act 2003, by the Licensing Committee and its Sub Committees.
- 1.2 The rules set out a framework for how applications are to be heard and explain the role of the participants at the Hearing.

2 Definitions

- 2.1 The following definitions describe the participants at and the subject matter of a Hearing:

“Applicant” means the person who has submitted an Application for consideration by the Committee.

“Applicant’s Premises” means premises subject to the Application.

“Applicant’s Representative” means a person attending a Hearing to assist or represent an Applicant including a lawyer.

“Application” means an application for the Grant/Variation/Transfer/Review and any other decision to be made by the Committee/Sub-Committee in respect of a Licence.

“Chairperson” means the Member who is the Chairperson of the Committee for the particular Hearing.

“Committee” means the Council’s Licensing Committee and includes any Sub Committee of the Licensing Committee.

“Committee Lawyer” means the Council’s Lawyer (including an external Lawyer instructed by the Council’s Legal & Democratic Services Manager) who is present at a Hearing to advise the Chairperson and the Members.

“Committee Manager” means the Council’s Officer who is present at a Hearing to take minutes.

“Committee Report” means the Licensing Officer’s written report to the Committee concerning an Application, a copy of which has been previously

made available to the Applicant or their Representative, a Responsible Authority or their Representative or an Interested Party or their Representative.

“Hearing” means a meeting of the Committee at which an Application is considered.

“Licence” means a Licence which the Committee has the power or duty inter alia to grant, transfer, suspend or revoke.

“Licensing Officer” means the Council’s Licensing Officer(s) who is/are present at a Hearing to present reports in respect of an Application and to give technical advice in respect of an Application to the Committee when requested.

“Licensing Authority” the Council in whose geographical area the subject matter of the Application relates to, and includes the Council’s Licensing Committee, any Sub Committee of the Licensing Committee and a Licensing Officer.

“Member” means a Member who is a Member of the Committee that is considering an Application.

“Responsible Authority” means a person who is present at a Hearing to make representations in respect of an Application in their capacity as Responsible Authority and includes any person who is present to assist or make representations on behalf of the Responsible Authority including a Lawyer.

“Interested Party” means a person who is present at a Hearing to make representations in respect of an Application in their capacity as an Interested Party, and includes any person who is present to assist or make representations on behalf of the Interested Party including a Lawyer.

3 Key Principles

- 3.1 The principles of ‘natural justice’, and Article 6 ‘Right to a Fair Trial’, which is one of the Convention Rights in the Human Rights Act 1998, require that there is a fair Hearing of Applications.
- 3.2 Natural justice is an umbrella term for the legal standards of basic fairness. This will include that:
 - 3.2.1 the Applicant has an opportunity to make representations before a decision is made;
 - 3.2.2 those making representations have an opportunity to voice their representations before a decision is made;

- 3.2.3 the Applicant has an adequate opportunity to consider and respond to any submissions made by a Responsible Authority/Authorities and/or an Interested Party/Parties;
- 3.2.4 the Committee does not exclude an Applicant from a Hearing in order to consider submissions from a Responsible Authority/Authorities and/or an Interested Party/Parties.
- 3.3 It is also fundamental that there is an orderly presentation of submissions at a Hearing so that the relevant issues are properly understood, evidence is tested and that oral statements made at the Hearing are accurately recorded.
- 3.4 Ultimately the Chairperson determines the application of these rules, having regard to any submissions being made by those present and in particular the Committee Lawyer.

4 The Hearing

- 4.1 The Hearing shall take place in public.
 - 4.1.1 The Committee may exclude the public from all or part of the Hearing where it considers it to be in the public interest to do so and, in accordance with the Local Government (Access to Information) Act 1985, as amended. Public includes a party and any person assisting or representing a party.
 - 4.1.2 The Committee may require any person attending the Hearing who, in its opinion, is behaving in a disruptive manner, to leave the Hearing and may:
 - a refuse to permit them to return;
 - b permit them to return only on such conditions as the Committee may specify;
 - c in the event that a person is required to leave a Hearing that person may, before the end of the Hearing, submit to the Committee in writing any information which they would have given orally.
- 4.2 Prior to the Hearing commencing, the Chairperson shall advise the parties of the procedure it proposes to follow at the Hearing.
- 4.3 Where a party has previously requested permission for a person(s), other than their representative, to appear at the Hearing then the Committee shall consider whether to permit that request.
- 4.4 The Committee will allow the parties an equal maximum period of time in which to exercise their rights.
- 4.5 This equal maximum time may have been notified in advance of the Hearing;
- 4.6 Where there is a multiple of Interested Parties who have attended the Hearing to make the same representation then the Committee would normally require

that a spokesperson be appointed by them to make the representations on behalf of all of those Interested Parties.

5 Presentation of Submissions

5.1 The Chairperson will introduce the Application.

5.2 In the event that the Licensing Authority has given notice to a party requiring clarification on a point(s) then that party shall respond to the points raised by the Licensing Authority.

5.3 Submissions shall be made in the following order unless the Chairperson directs otherwise:

5.3.1 The Licensing Officer will orally present the Committee Report and will in particular advise the Committee as to:

- a the options available to it;
- b the considerations that are relevant in reaching its decision.

5.3.2 The Review Applicant (or the Applicant's Representative) will orally present its submission which may include:

- a presenting their case in accordance with the papers, which will have been circulated with Agenda papers;
- b confirming key information and answer pertinent questions; and
- c calling witnesses in support of the Application (see paragraph 4.3).

A Responsible Authority/Authorities and/or an Interested Party/Parties will orally present their representations in turn which shall include:

- a the grounds of the representation to the Application; and
- b any condition(s) that the Responsible Authority/Authorities and/or an Interested Party/Parties would be happy to have the Application granted subject to which would cause the representation to be withdrawn.

The Premises Licence Holder and/or their representative will orally present their representations which shall include;

- a The response to the representations made by the Review Applicant, a Responsible Authority/Authorities and/or an Interested Party/Parties; and
- b Whether they would be happy to accept any modifications to the Licence as suggested by the Review Applicant, a Responsible Authority/Authorities and/or an Interested Party/Parties.

6 Questioning of Submissions

6.1 The Chairperson will regulate the order in which questions are asked by Members.

- 6.2 The Chairperson and Members, voiced through the Chairperson, may question any party following the completion of their submission.
- 6.3 The Chairperson will normally permit the Applicant, a Responsible Authority/Authorities or an Interested Party/Parties to ask questions through them of the other parties.
- 6.4 The Chairperson may direct that questions which are not relevant to the Application or one of the four Licensing Objectives are not formally put or answered.

7 Documentation

- 7.1 No party shall present new documentation to the Committee at the Hearing other than with the consent of all of the other parties. This does not preclude the Licensing Officer from correcting errors, providing updated information or an extract from a local map showing the Applicant's Premises in the context of the surrounding premises and any Interested Party's premises. If any party is granted permission to present supplementary papers at the Hearing they shall provide at least 10 copies at the start of their submission.

8 Intervention

The Chairperson shall permit the following interventions at any point in the Hearing:

- 8.1 The Committee Lawyer to advise the Committee on issues of law, procedure and relevant considerations on decision making. If necessary, the Chairperson may require the Committee, the Committee Lawyer and the Committee Manager to leave the Hearing so that advice can be given.
- 8.2 The Committee Manager to advise the Committee on procedure generally, or to request that statements made are repeated for reasons of clarity and so that they can be properly recorded.
- 8.3 The Licensing Officer to seek to clarify statements that have been made in light of information held on their file.

9 Failure of Parties to Attend Hearing

- 9.1 If a party has informed the Licensing Authority that it does not intend to attend or be represented at a Hearing, the Hearing may proceed in its absence.
- 9.2 If a party has not indicated that it does not intend to attend or be represented at a Hearing and fails to attend or be represented at the Hearing then the Licensing Authority may:
 - 9.2.1 where it considers it be necessary in the public interest, adjourn the Hearing to a specified date; or

9.2.2 hold the Hearing in the party's absence.

9.3 Where the Licensing Authority holds a Hearing in the absence of a party, it shall consider at the Hearing the application, representations or notice made by that party.

10 Closing Submissions

10.1 The Chairperson shall allow first, the Responsible Authority/Authorities and the Interested Party/Parties to make a closing oral submission(s) and secondly invite the Applicant or the Applicant's Representative an opportunity to make an oral closing submission in support of the Application.

11 Decision

11.1 The Committee, the Committee Lawyer and the Committee Manager, shall retire so that the decision may be considered in private, and to consider any legal issues raised by the Members.

11.2 The decision, and reasons for the decision, of the Committee shall be communicated orally by the Chairperson to the parties after the Committee has deliberated in private on the Application.

11.3 Written reasons shall be provided soon after the deliberations of the Application and in any event within the statutory time limits.

Review Hearing Procedure Summary

1. The Chairperson welcomes all those present and introduces the Application.
2. The Chairperson invites the Sub-Committee Members, Council Officers, the Review Applicant and/or their representative, any Responsible Authorities and/or Interested Parties and the Premises Licence Holder and/or their representative to introduce themselves.
3. The Chairperson outlines the Hearing Procedure.
4. The Licensing Officer presents the Committee Report and outlines the application.
5. The Review Applicant and/or their representative address the Sub-Committee to present their case.
6. Questions to the Review Applicant by Members of the Sub-Committee, any Responsible Authorities and/or Interested Parties and the Premises Licence Holder.
7. Responsible Authorities and/or Interested Parties who have made relevant representations address the Sub-Committee.
8. Questions to any of the Responsible Authorities and/or Interested Parties by Members of the Sub-Committee, the Review Applicant and the Premises Licence Holder.
9. The Premises Licence Holder and/or their representative address the Sub-Committee to present their case.
10. Questions to the Premises Licence Holder by Members of the Sub-Committee, any Responsible Authorities and/or Interested Parties and the Review Applicant.
11. Summing up by the Responsible Authorities and/or Interested Parties who have made relevant representations.
12. Summing up by the Premises Licence Holder.
13. Summing up by the Review Applicant.
14. The Sub-Committee retires with the Committee Lawyer and Committee Manager to consider its decision.
15. Sub-Committee returns and the Lawyer gives a summary of any legal advice that may have been given to the Sub-Committee, and invites the parties present to make any comments on that advice.
16. The Chairperson either gives the decision with reasons, or advises that it will be released in writing with reasons within the statutory time limits.

**Application for Review of a Premises Licence; Black Pearl 5a Church Street
Trowbridge BA14 8DR
Premises Licence Holder Tammatha Newbury**

1. Purpose of Report

- 1.1 To determine an application for a Review of a Premises Licence in respect of the Black Pearl 5a Church Street, Trowbridge, made by the Wiltshire Police.

2. Background Information

- 2.1 An application for the Review of the Black Pearl's Premises Licence for the supply of alcohol and regulated entertainment, has been made by Wiltshire Police. Following advertisement of the application, no additional representations from responsible authorities or interested parties have been received.
- 2.2 Wiltshire Council (as the Licensing Authority) must hold a hearing to consider the application having regard to the representations. In accordance with Section 52 (3) of The Licensing Act 2003, the Licensing Sub Committee is required to take such steps as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- 2.3 The licensing objectives are:
- i) The Prevention of Crime and Disorder;
 - ii) Public Safety;
 - iii) The Prevention of Public Nuisance; and
 - iv) The Protection of Children from Harm.
- 2.4 Such steps are:
- i) To modify the conditions of the licence.
 - ii) To exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence.
 - iii) To remove the designated premises supervisor.
 - iv) To suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months.
 - v) To revoke the licence.
 - vi) To determine that no steps are necessary

Government Guidance issued under s.182 of the Licensing Act states that:

“Licensing Authorities should also note that modifications of conditions and exclusions of licensable activities may be imposed either permanently or for a temporary period of up to three months. Temporary changes or suspension of

the licence for up to three months could impact on the business holding the licence financially and would only be expected to be pursued as a appropriate means of promoting the licensing objectives. So, for instance, a licence could be suspended for a weekend as a means of deterring the holder from allowing the problems that gave rise to the review to happen again. However, it will always be important that any detrimental financial impact that may result from a licensing authority's decision is appropriate and proportionate to the promotion of the licensing objectives.”

- 2.5 A new premises licence was granted to Ms Newbury at a hearing of her application on the 20 March 2012. The hearing was called following representations received to the application, from the following Responsible Authorities:
- 2.5.1 Wiltshire Police on the grounds of crime and disorder, public safety and protection of children from harm.
- 2.5.2 An officer of Wiltshire Council, with responsibility for environmental health, on the grounds of public nuisance.
- 2.5.3 A copy of the hearing decision notice issued on the 20 March 2012 is attached as **Appendix 1**.
- 2.5.4 A copy of the current Premises Licence is attached as **Appendix 2**.

3. Details of the Grounds for Review

- 3.1 On the 1 May 2012, an application for a review of the Premises Licence was served on the premises and the Licensing Authority. The review of the licence has been requested by Wiltshire Police on the following grounds:

3.1.2 Crime and Disorder

Incidents of violence and disorder have taken place on the premises.

3.1.3 Public Safety

Members of the public involved in disorder at the premises have sustained injuries which required hospital treatment.

3.1.4 Protection of children

Children have been present on the premises and exposed to a serious incident of violence and disorder.

- 3.1.5 In addition, there have been numerous breaches of the premises licence and other concerns in respect of the management of the premises, which together further undermine the above licensing objectives.

- 3.2 Further detail of the grounds for review, together with back ground and incident detail is given as follows:

- 3.2.1 Tammatha Newbury has until recently been the licence holder and designated premises supervisor (DPS) at The Carpenters Arms, Roundstone Street. She held this position for twelve months. During this period the premises was the subject of violence, disorder and anti social behaviour.
- 3.2.2 In December 2011 Ms Newbury was cautioned for offences under the Licensing Act 2003. In addition she was dealt with formally by Wiltshire Fire and Rescue and Wiltshire Council Environmental Health Officers.
- 3.2.3 The landlord of The Carpenters gave notice for her to quit the premises on 29th of March 2012.
- 3.2.4 At the same time Ms Newbury made application to take over the premises formerly known as PEEWEES, Church Street, Trowbridge. Police objected to this application and her taking the role of DPS.
- 3.2.5 On the 20th of March 2012 Wiltshire Council Licensing Committee granted the Licence following negotiation between Police and the applicant.
- 3.2.6 Ms Newbury moved the DPS position to a Steven Phillip JAMES. The premises opened as the Black Pearl on or around 30th of March 2012.
- 3.2.7 On granting the licence the Committee attached twelve conditions. Each condition addressed specific concerns Police had in relation to in particular the 'the prevention of crime and disorder' and 'public safety'. Police find that there have been several breaches of one or more of these conditions.
- 3.2.8 Since opening there have been a number of incidents of disorder, including two incidents of serious violence at the premises, one on the 13th of April 2012 (log 0280 refers) which involved three males fighting on the premises, injuries were sustained including a deep laceration which required stitches and a broken nose, this was witnessed by five children on the premises. At least one person involved is named on the Trowbridge Pubwatch ban list.
- 3.2.9 On the 19th of April 2012 (log 0354 refers) two males were involved in a fight on the premises; injuries were sustained including a cut to the face and a laceration to the wrist. Police believe glass or bottles were used as weapons in this fight.
- 3.2.10 On the 20th of April 2012 Police were advised that the DPS had left the premises. On the same day the Police Licensing Officer attended the premises and Ms Newbury was spoken to under caution regarding the unlawful sale of alcohol since the departure of the DPS.
- 3.2.11 On the 25th of April 2012 Police attended the premises to retrieve CCTV footage and carry out of licensed premises check. The premises licence holder was not available due to sickness, but her partner who is involved in the day to day running of the premises was able to provide details, which highlighted a number of further breaches of the premises licence.
- 3.2.12 On the 25th of April 2012 an Ann ROBSON applied to become the Designated Premises Supervisor. Police interviewed Ms ROBSON and found that there

were no grounds to object to her application, advice was given in relation to the premises licence, it was explained the full compliance was essential. We emphasised that she should be present during all key trading times and that she would be required to familiarise herself with the premises licence.

- 3.2.13 On the 29th of April 2012 at 02.00 hours Police attended the premises and found that regulated entertainment was in progress, music was being played through amplification and patrons were dancing. At hearing the Licensing Committee restricted these activities to a terminal hour of midnight.
- 3.2.14 On the 30th of April 2012 Police contacted Ms Newbury to remind her that she was due to meet with Police in the afternoon of the same date, she failed to attend this meeting.
- 3.3 The application for Review is attached as **Appendix 3(a)**. The evidence relied upon by the Police in support of the application is contained within **Appendices 3(b)**.
- 3.4 A location map of the premises and surrounding area is attached as **Appendix 4**.

4. Consultation and Representations

- 4.1 The review process requires a public notice to be posted on the premises for a period of 28 days, together with a copy of the notice posted at the offices of Wiltshire Council, 165 Bradley Road, Trowbridge, Wiltshire, BA14 0RD. During the consultation period no additional relevant representations have been received.
- 4.2 The Sub Committee can take into account documentary or other information presented at the hearing with the consent of all other parties.

Note: The Police may not raise matters at the hearing unless they have already referred to them in the review application. The Licensing Authority may nevertheless take into account documentary or other information produced by the Police in support of their application, if it is provided to the Licensing Authority before the hearing, or at the hearing with the consent of all the other parties.

- 4.3 The Police have specified the following reasons for calling the Review:
- 4.4 Police have grave concerns regarding the fitness and suitability of this premises licence holder to promote the licensing objectives. The lack of regard for conditions specifically designed to reduce disorder, violence and injuries demonstrates a blatant disregard for the Licensing Act 2003.
- 4.5 Police have concluded that although the premises has only been open a short time the level of risk to public safety requires them to act swiftly in calling for a review of the premises licence.

4.6 Having reviewed the previous licensing history of this premises licence holder and having reviewed the incidents at The Black Pearl, Police find that only the revocation of the licence would now fully promote the licensing objectives.

5. Legal Implications

5.1 This Hearing is governed by the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations. These provide that hearings should be held in public unless the Licensing Authority considers that the public interest in excluding the public outweighs the public interest in the hearing taking place in public.

6. Officer Recommendations

6.1 Officers are not permitted to make a recommendation – the decision is to be reached by the members of the Licensing Sub Committee.

7. Right of Appeal

7.1 It should be noted that the Premises Licence Holder and the Responsible Authority may appeal the decision made by the Licensing Sub Committee at the Magistrates Court. The appeal must be lodged with the Magistrates Court within 21 days of the notification of the decision.

7.2 In the event of an appeal being lodged, the decision made by the Licensing Sub Committee is suspended until any appeal is heard and any decision made by the Magistrates Court.

7.3 The Premises Licence Holder and all Interested Parties have been informed of the date, time and location of the Hearing and their right to attend and be represented.

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And subject to the following additional conditions:

The prevention of crime and disorder:

1. No glass bottles, glasses or alcoholic drinks to be permitted off the premises or in the porch area after 2100hrs.
2. All drinks to be served in polycarbonate glasses and no glass bottles to be served from over the bar after 2100hrs.
3. The premises will adopt a zero tolerance to drugs. The premises licence holder will produce within 28 days of the grant of the licence a written drugs policy to the satisfaction of the licensing authority and the police which will be provided to all staff and implemented.
4. The designated premises supervisor or his/her representative will attend regularly, and be an active member of, Pubwatch.
5. When regulated entertainment is offered a minimum of three door supervisors will be deployed at the premise from 2100hrs to the closing of the premises.
6. CCTV will be installed at the premises - the system should be installed so as to cover all entrances and exits, and the licensed area. The system is to be maintained and in full working order during all licensable hours. The system is to be of sufficient quality so as to enable identification. Images must be retained for a minimum of 28 days and produced to a police officer or a Wiltshire Council licensing officer on request.
7. Customers wishing to smoke will be restricted to the frontage of the premises, and will not be permitted to use the footpath or highway. No more than six persons will be permitted to use this area at any one time. When door staff are on duty this number may be increased to no more than ten persons.
8. The premises will maintain an incident record in a consecutively numbered log book. All incidents shall be recorded promptly and shall record the date, day, time, description of incident and any actions taken. The record is to include details of successful challenges to proof of age and be available to the police and licensing authority on request.
9. The premises will maintain a record of all door supervisors deployed at the premises which will be made available on request to the police and licensing authority.
10. Staff will undertake appropriate training in all aspects of relevant licensing legislation within two months of commencement of employment; this training will be recorded and regularly refreshed.

11. In the absence of the designated premises supervisor, a personal licence holder will be present on the premises at all times when a licensable activity is taking place.
12. No person under the age of 18 years old will be permitted on the premises after 2100 hours.
13. The premises licence holder shall maintain a noise log book during live and recorded music events including karaoke. A responsible person working within the premises shall undertake observations at the nearest noise sensitive residential premises. The observations shall be undertaken at hourly intervals during events. The following information must be recorded and available for inspection by the Council: the date and time, location, name of the person making the observation on the level of music and any remedial actions taken to reduce the levels.
14. Doors and windows to be kept closed during regulated entertainment (except for ingress and egress) after 2100hrs to reduce noise nuisance from the premises.
15. Prominent, clear and legible notices must be displayed at all exits requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly and not loiter close to the entrance.
16. No bottles to be emptied into waste receptacles between the hours of 2000hrs and 0900hrs the following day.
17. Any request by authorised Officer of the Council in relation to reducing noise levels during regulated entertainment to be complied with.

Reasons

The representations made by the police and the Environmental Protection services related respectively to the licensing objectives of preventing crime and disorder and preventing public nuisance. The Sub-Committee noted that the police had agreed a number of conditions with the applicant which, if imposed, would meet many of the concerns that the police had in relation to possible crime and disorder associated with the premises. The conditions set out above were generally in line with those requested by the police and were in any event consistent with those set out in the applicant's operating schedule.

The Sub-Committee accepted the concerns raised by the Environmental Protection officer regarding the suitability of the premises for music event, given its location and structure. In view of this, the Sub-Committee considered it necessary to reduce the hours during which regulated entertainment could take place at the premises, as well as imposing the additional conditions relating to noise monitoring and the reduction of noise, in order to prevent noise nuisance to neighbouring residents.

In reaching its decision the Sub Committee has considered the relevant provisions of the Licensing Act 2003 (in particular Sections 4 and 18); the guidance issued under Section 182 of the Act and the Licensing Policy of Wiltshire Council.

The Sub Committee have also considered the written evidence presented in the agenda and the supporting evidence provided by the applicant, police and the Environmental Protection Officer together with the oral evidence given at the hearing.

Right to Appeal

All parties have the right to appeal to the Magistrates Court within 21 days of receipt of this decision.

In December 2011 NEWBURY was cautioned for offences under the Licensing Act 2003. In addition she was dealt with formally by Wiltshire Fire and Rescue and Wiltshire Council Environmental Health Officers.

The landlord of The Carpenters gave notice for her to quit the premises on 29th of March 2012.

At the same time NEWBURY made application to take over the premises formerly known as PEEWEES, Church Street, Trowbridge. Police objected to this application and her taking the role of DPS.

On the 20th of March 2012 Wiltshire Council Licensing Committee granted the licence following negotiation between Police and the applicant.

NEWBURY moved the DPS position to a Steven Phillip JAMES. The premises opened as the Black Pearl on or around 30th of March 2012.

On granting the licence the Committee attached twelve conditions. Each condition addressed specific concerns Police had in relation to in particular the 'the prevention of crime and disorder' and 'public safety'. Police find that there have been several breaches of one or more of these conditions.

Since opening there have been a number of incidents of disorder, including two incidents of serious violence at the premises, one on the 13th of April 2012 (log 0280 refers) which involved three males fighting on the premises, injuries were sustained including a deep laceration which required stitches and a broken nose, this was witnessed by five children on the premises. At least one person involved is named on the Trowbridge Pubwatch ban list.

On the 19th of April 2012 (log 0354 refers) two males were involved in a fight on the premises; injuries were sustained including a cut to the face and a laceration to the wrist. Police believe glass or bottles were used as weapons in this fight.

On the 20th of April 2012 Police were advised that the DPS had left the premises, on the same day the Police Licensing Officer attended the premises and NEWBURY was spoken to under caution regarding the unlawful sale of alcohol since the departure of the DPS.

On the 25th of April 2012 Police attended the premises to retrieve CCTV footage and carry out of licensed premises check. The premises licence holder was not available due to sickness, but her partner who is involved in the day to day running of the premises was able to provide details, which highlighted a number of further breaches of the premises licence.

On the 25th of April 2012 an Ann ROBSON applied to become the Designated Premises Supervisor. Police interviewed Ms ROBSON and found that there were no grounds to object to her application, advice was given in relation to the premises licence, it was explained the full compliance was essential. We emphasised that she should be present during all key trading times and that she would be required to familiarise herself with the premises licence.

On the 29th of April 2012 at 02.00 hours Police attended the premises and found that regulated entertainment was in progress, music was being played through amplification and patrons were dancing. At hearing the Licensing Committee restricted these activities to a terminal hour of midnight.

On the 30th of April 2012 Police contacted NEWBURY to remind her that she was due to meet with Police in the afternoon of the same date, she failed to attend this meeting.

Police have grave concerns regarding the fitness and suitability of this premises licence holder to promote the licensing objectives. The lack of regard for conditions specifically designed to reduce disorder, violence and injuries demonstrates a blatant disregard for the Licensing Act 2003.

Police have concluded that although the premises has only been open a short time the level of risk to public safety requires them to act swiftly in calling for a review of the premises licence.

Having reviewed the previous licensing history of this premises licence holder and having reviewed the incidents at The Black Pearl Police find that only the revocation of the licence would now fully promote the licensing objectives.

The Black Pearl 5A Church Street Trowbridge Wiltshire

Tammatha NEWBURY has until recently been the licence holder and designated premises supervisor (DPS) at The Carpenters Arms, Roundstone Street. She held this position for twelve months. During this period the premises was the subject of violence, disorder and anti social behavior.

In December 2011 NEWBURY was cautioned for offences under the Licensing Act 2003. In addition she was dealt with formally by Wiltshire Fire and Rescue and Wiltshire Council Environmental Health Officers.

The landlord of The Carpenters gave notice for her to quit the premises on 29th of March 2012.

At the same time NEWBURY made an application to take over the premises formerly known as PEEWEES, Church Street, Trowbridge. Police objected to this application and her taking the role of DPS.

On the 20th of March 2012 Wiltshire Council Licensing Committee granted the licence following negotiation between Police and the applicant. Conditions were imposed on the licence following representations from Wiltshire Council Environmental Protection Services and Wiltshire Police.

NEWBURY moved the DPS position to a Steven Phillip JAMES. The premises opened as the Black Pearl on or around 30th of March 2012.

On granting the licence the Committee attached twelve conditions. Each condition addressed specific concerns Police had in relation to in particular the 'the prevention of crime and disorder' and 'public safety'. Police find that there have been several breaches of one or more of these conditions.

Since opening there have been a number of incidents of disorder, including two incidents of serious violence at the premises, one on the 13th of April 2012 (log 0280 refers) which involved three males fighting on the premises, injuries were sustained including a deep laceration which required stitches and a broken nose, this was witnessed by five children on the premises. At least one person involved is named on the Trowbridge Pubwatch ban list.

On the 19th of April 2012 (log 0354 refers) two males were involved in a fight on the premises; injuries were sustained including a cut to the face and a laceration to the wrist. Police believe glass or bottles were used as weapons in this fight.

On the 20th of April 2012 Police were advised that the DPS had left the premises, on the same day the Police Licensing Officer attended the premises and NEWBURY was spoken to under caution regarding the unlawful sale of alcohol since the departure of the DPS.

On the 25th of April 2012 Police attended the premises to retrieve CCTV footage and carry out of licensed premises check. The premises licence holder was not available due to sickness, but her partner who is involved in the day to day running of the premises was able to provide details, which highlighted a number of further breaches of the premises licence. Specifically that –

1. No drugs policy was in place at that time.
2. Door staff were being deployed but not from 21.00 hours as Martin HINDS stated they couldn't afford it.
3. An incident book was in place but not properly completed.
4. No staff training had been completed or recorded.
5. Martin HINDS was not aware of the need for a personal licence holder to be present when the DPS was not present. He was totally unaware of the conditions consistent with the operating schedule 1 to 14.

During the visit it was reiterated to Martin HINDS the need to ensure that the licence was adhered to at all times.

On the 25th of April 2012 an Ann ROBSON applied to become the Designated Premises Supervisor. Police interviewed Ms ROBSON and found that there were no grounds to object to her application, advice was given in relation to the premises licence, it was explained the full compliance was essential. We emphasised that she should be present during all key trading times and that she would be required to familiarise herself with the premises licence.

On the 27th of April 2012 (log 0239 refers) at 16.34 hours a member of the public called Police to report that there was a very drunk male with trousers around his knees in Church Street. He was reported that he was so drunk he could hardly stand, members

public have had to get him out of the road to ensure his safety. The subject involved in this incident had been ejected from the Black Pearl.

On the 29th of April 2012 at 02.00 hours PC Jacobs attended the premises and found that regulated entertainment was in progress. Music was being played through amplification and patrons were dancing. At the hearing the Licensing Committee restricted these activities to a terminal hour of midnight.

On the 30th of April 2012 Police contacted NEWBURY to remind her that she was due to meet with Police in the afternoon of the same date. She failed to attend this meeting.

On the 1st of May 2012, the Police Licensing Officer attended the premises and advised the premises licence holder that it was believed the premises had breached the conditions of the licence on the 29th of April 2012 in that entertainment was in progress at 02.00 hours. It was at this time an application for the review of the licence was prepared.

Since making the application for review, Police note the following intelligence and incidents -

On the 16th of May 2012 the 'Black Pearl' Facebook page stated ' Friday and Saturday til 3am dancehall m b music you never hear anywhere else get ya dancing shoes on or off'.

On the 2nd of June 2012 a female was a customer at The Black Pearl. She was in the smoking area at the front of the premises when she was approached by a former partner. She knew that this male was on the Trowbridge Pubwatch ban list and she deliberately went into the premises to get away from him knowing that he was not allowed in. However despite three door supervisors being deployed at the premises, the male managed to gain entry and the female recalls being assaulted on the dance floor of the premises by she believes the male, witnesses confirm that it was the male identified as the former partner who carried out the assault.

On the 3rd of June 2012 Police received a call from a member of the public at 02.55 hours, stating that loud music was still being played at the premises, and that the music was keeping her awake. The premises had a temporary event notice in place to extend the hours of regulated entertainment until 02.45 hours.

Police have grave concerns regarding the fitness and suitability of this premises licence holder to promote the licensing objectives. The lack of regard for conditions specifically designed to reduce disorder, violence and injuries demonstrates a blatant disregard for the Licensing Act 2003.

Police have concluded that although the premises has only been open a short time the level of risk to public safety requires them to act swiftly in calling for a review of the premises licence.

Having reviewed the previous licensing history of this premises licence holder and having reviewed the incidents at The Black Pearl Police find that only the revocation of the licence would now fully promote the licensing objectives.

Further to your recent application for a new premises licence for 5A Church Street Trowbridge, and following our telephone conversation I have the following observations.

The application is as its fullest extent to permit the sale of alcohol and the provide entertainment until 03.00 hours and 03.00 hours respectively on a Thursday, Friday and Saturday. I understand from our discussion that you are now proposing a 02.30 terminal hour for the sale of alcohol; it is unlikely that police would have concerns in relation to this proposal

I have read the proposals at page 20 and at this time find that given the extent of the licence and the challenges of running a premise within the night time economy of Trowbridge, they do not adequately promote the licensing objectives.

To assist you I have provided a list below which whilst not exhaustive should be used as a guide when considering in particular the licensing objective the prevention of crime and disorder, I have also provided a short list of matter which are covered by other legislation and or mandatory conditions already a applied to a premises licence which do not need to covered in your application.



I am Police Constable 1984 Matthew JACOBS based at Trowbridge Police station for the Wiltshire Police.

On SUNDAY 29th MARCH 2012 at 0215 hours I was in the company of Special Constable SMITH 5862 when we conducted a licence premises check at the Black Pearl public house on Church Street, Trowbridge. The purpose of the visit was to ensure that the venue was complying within their licence, i.e offering drinks in plastic cups and that they were complying with their 0000 hours entertainment licence and that there were no offences taking place.

As we approached the venue I could see three male door staff members all of which were displaying their SIA (security industry authority) badges. On entering the venue I could hear music playing although there was no DJ in the DJ booth, the venue was lit and there were a number disco lights flashing in time with the music giving the venue a dancing atmosphere, alcohol was still drinking purchased and drank at the bar, I could see that the staff were delivering the drinks in plastic cups, I also noticed that there was two females dancing near to the bar. I then proceeded to check the gent toilets and SMITH checked the females, both of which were clean and tidy. On exiting the venue we spoke to doorstaff who informed us that they were closing at 0230 hours that morning.

The Wiltshire Police licensing officer Jacquie GALLIMORE was on this morning and I informed her of my findings.

I refer to my visit to your premises on the 17 May 2012. As promised I enclose a copy of my licensing inspection report for your records. Once you have included the information that we discussed is missing from your premises drugs policy it was agreed that you would forward an amended copy of the policy to me. I look forward to receiving the revised document in the near future.

Whilst writing I wish to record my serious concern with regard to the fact that when you dismissed Mr Steven James, the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) named on your Premises Licence and despite the fact that you did not notify the Licensing Authority of his removal or submit a application for change of DPS, you carried on with the sale of alcohol at the Black Pearl. It's at this point that I would remind you of the following mandatory licence condition on page 3 of your licence, which states:

"Alcohol

Where this Licence authorises the supply of alcohol:

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under this Licence:
 - a. At a time when there is no Designated Premises Supervisor in respect of it
 - b. At a time when the Designated Premises Supervisor does not hold a Personal Licence.
2. Every retail sale or supply of alcohol made under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a Personal Licence."

Mr James notified this Authority on Friday 20 April 2012, that his last shift at the Black Pearl ended at 6p.m. on Wednesday 18 April 2012. I note that you did close the business on Friday 20 April 2012 but only after the police had visited your premises that day, following a serious assault taking place at the premises the day before.

Licensing Officers now have the power to call a review of a premises licence and/or take action for breaches of licence conditions, through the magistrates court. A person found guilty of an offence under the Licensing Act legislation, risks a fine of up to £20,000, or a maximum of six months imprisonment, or both.

The matter of the DPS situation, following the termination of Mr James' employment by you, has been included in the call for review of the licence by the Police and will therefore, if not withdrawn, be considered at the hearing of the application on the 25 June 2012, along with the other evidence presented.

And subject to the following additional conditions:

The prevention of crime and disorder:

1. No glass bottles, glasses or alcoholic drinks to be permitted off the premises or in the porch area after 2100hrs.
2. All drinks to be served in polycarbonate glasses and no glass bottles to be served from over the bar after 2100hrs.
3. The premises will adopt a zero tolerance to drugs. The premises licence holder will produce within 28 days of the grant of the licence a written drugs policy to the satisfaction of the licensing authority and the police which will be provided to all staff and implemented.
4. The designated premises supervisor or his/her representative will attend regularly, and be an active member of, Pubwatch.
5. When regulated entertainment is offered a minimum of three door supervisors will be deployed at the premise from 2100hrs to the closing of the premises.
6. CCTV will be installed at the premises - the system should be installed so as to cover all entrances and exits, and the licensed area. The system is to be maintained and in full working order during all licensable hours. The system is to be of sufficient quality so as to enable identification. Images must be retained for a minimum of 28 days and produced to a police officer or a Wiltshire Council licensing officer on request.
7. Customers wishing to smoke will be restricted to the frontage of the premises, and will not be permitted to use the footpath or highway. No more than six persons will be permitted to use this area at any one time. When door staff are on duty this number may be increased to no more than ten persons.
8. The premises will maintain an incident record in a consecutively numbered log book. All incidents shall be recorded promptly and shall record the date, day, time, description of incident and any actions taken. The record is to include details of successful challenges to proof of age and be available to the police and licensing authority on request.
9. The premises will maintain a record of all door supervisors deployed at the premises which will be made available on request to the police and licensing authority.
10. Staff will undertake appropriate training in all aspects of relevant licensing legislation within two months of commencement of employment; this training will be recorded and regularly refreshed.

11. In the absence of the designated premises supervisor, a personal licence holder will be present on the premises at all times when a licensable activity is taking place.
12. No person under the age of 18 years old will be permitted on the premises after 2100 hours.
13. The premises licence holder shall maintain a noise log book during live and recorded music events including karaoke. A responsible person working within the premises shall undertake observations at the nearest noise sensitive residential premises. The observations shall be undertaken at hourly intervals during events. The following information must be recorded and available for inspection by the Council: the date and time, location, name of the person making the observation on the level of music and any remedial actions taken to reduce the levels.
14. Doors and windows to be kept closed during regulated entertainment (except for ingress and egress) after 2100hrs to reduce noise nuisance from the premises.
15. Prominent, clear and legible notices must be displayed at all exits requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly and not loiter close to the entrance.
16. No bottles to be emptied into waste receptacles between the hours of 2000hrs and 0900hrs the following day.
17. Any request by authorised Officer of the Council in relation to reducing noise levels during regulated entertainment to be complied with.

Reasons

The representations made by the police and the Environmental Protection services related respectively to the licensing objectives of preventing crime and disorder and preventing public nuisance. The Sub-Committee noted that the police had agreed a number of conditions with the applicant which, if imposed, would meet many of the concerns that the police had in relation to possible crime and disorder associated with the premises. The conditions set out above were generally in line with those requested by the police and were in any event consistent with those set out in the applicant's operating schedule.

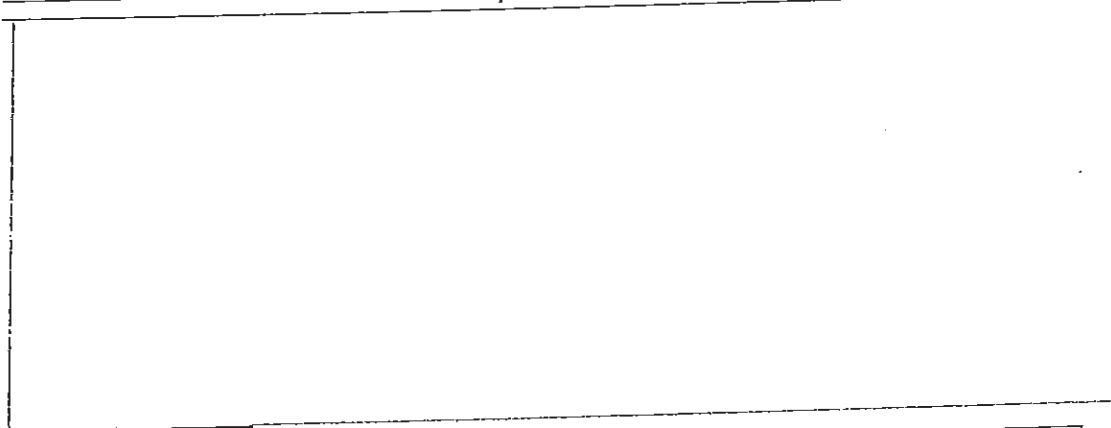
The Sub-Committee accepted the concerns raised by the Environmental Protection officer regarding the suitability of the premises for music event, given its location and structure. In view of this, the Sub-Committee considered it necessary to reduce the hours during which regulated entertainment could take place at the premises, as well as imposing the additional conditions relating to noise monitoring and the reduction of noise, in order to prevent noise nuisance to neighbouring residents.

In reaching its decision the Sub Committee has considered the relevant provisions of the Licensing Act 2003 (in particular Sections 4 and 18); the guidance issued under Section 182 of the Act and the Licensing Policy of Wiltshire Council.

The Sub Committee have also considered the written evidence presented in the agenda and the supporting evidence provided by the applicant, police and the Environmental Protection Officer together with the oral evidence given at the hearing.

Right to Appeal

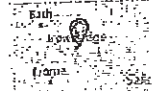
