<u>Application for a Variation of a Premises Licence: Eastern Chillout, 99</u> Fisherton Street, Salisbury, SP2 7SP

1. Purpose of Report

1.1 To determine an application for a variation of a Premises Licence in respect of Eastern Chillout, 99 Fisherton Street, Salisbury, SP2 7SP made by Mrs Jemma Kemaneler.

2. Background Information

- 2.1 An application for a variation of a Premises Licence in respect of Eastern Chillout, 99 Fisherton Street, Salisbury, SP2 7SP made by Mrs Jemma Kemaneler. for which one relevant representation has been received.
- 2.2 Wiltshire Council (as the Licensing Authority) must hold a hearing to consider the application having regard to the representations. In accordance with Section 35(3) of The Licensing Act 2003 the Licensing Sub Committee is required to take such of the steps listed in 2.4 below as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives. In considering the application and the relevant representations, the Sub Committee must also have regard to relevant Government guidance and the Council's Licensing Policy.
- 2.3 The licensing objectives are:
 - i) The Prevention of Crime and Disorder;
 - ii) Public Safety;
 - iii) The Prevention of Public Nuisance; and
 - iv) The Protection of Children from Harm.
- 2.4 Such steps are:
 - i) To modify the conditions of the licence
 - ii) To reject the whole or part of the application.
- 2.5 On 8 October 2014 an application for a variation to the existing premises licence was received and accepted as a valid application. The Variation application is attached as **Appendix 1.** Amendments were subsequently made by the Applicant and are attached as **Appendix 1a**
- 2.6 The variation requested to make some internal alterations to the bar area ande screening, make changes to the external area reduce the Licensable area to build a Turkish Steam Bath, make changes to the Barn Area, Make changes to

the timings of the Licensable activities indoors. The current layout of the premises is attached as **Appendix 2** and the proposed new plan is attached as **Appendix 3**

- 2.7 The application was not advertised according to The Licensing Act 2003, When it was advertised correctly the end of consultation was stated as 26th November 2014 this was taken as the closing date for receipt of any representations. Attached as **Appendix 4**
- 2.8 The premises has held a licence since the inception of the Licensing Act 2003, initially known as The Kings Arms it subsequently became Safari Garden before becoming Eastern Chillout in August 2012. The current premises licence is attached as **Appendix 5** with the current conditions set out in **Appendix 5a**.
- 2.9 On 22 May 2013 an application for a variation of the existing premises licence was received and accepted as a valid application. During consultation for this application one relevant representation was received from Wiltshire Council's Environmental Health Team. The representation was accepted as a relevant representation against the licensing objectives Public Nuisance. Attached as **Appendix 6.** Hearing was held on 17th July 2013 and the licence was granted with additional and amended conditions and reduced hours. The decision notice of this hearing is attached as **Appendix 6a**.
- 2.10 The premise operates as a restaurant in the City Centre of Salisbury. The Location of the Premises is attached as **Appendix 7**. A more detailed position of the Premises is attached as **Appendix 7**a

3. Consultation and Representations

3.1 The application process requires a public notice to be posted on the premises for a period of 28 days together with a copy of the notice posted at the offices of Wiltshire Council, Bourne Hill, Salisbury, SP1 3UZ. During the consultation period one relevant representation has been received from a Responsible Authority.

3.2 Responsible Authorities

• On 26 November 2014 Environmental Public Protection Officer made a representation in connection with this application.

3.3 Interested Parties

- No interested parties made a relevant representation.
- 3.4 A summary of the representations made is detailed in the table below:

3.5 The relevant representation is attached as **Appendix 8**.

4. Legal Implications

- 4.1 This hearing is governed by the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations. These provide that hearings should be held in public unless the Licensing Authority considers that the public interest in excluding the public outweighs the public interest in the hearing taking place in public.
- 4.2 The Applicant and all Responsible Authorities and Interested Parties who have made representations have been informed of the date, time and location of the hearing and their right to attend and be represented.
- 4.3 At the hearing all those Responsible Authorities and Interested Parties who have made representations are entitled to address the Sub Committee and to ask questions of another party, with the consent of the Sub Committee.

5. Officer Recommendations

5.1 Officers are not permitted to make a recommendation – the decision is to be reached by the members of the Licensing Sub Committee.

6. Right of Appeal

- 6.1 It should be noted that the Premises Licence Holder and those who have made relevant representations may appeal the decision made by the Licensing Sub Committee to the Magistrates Court. The appeal must be lodged with the Magistrates Court within 21 days of the notification of the decision.
- 6.2 In the event of an appeal being lodged, the decision made by the Licensing Sub Committee remains valid until any appeal is heard and any decision made by the Magistrates Court.
- A Responsible Authority or an Interested Party may apply to the Licensing Authority for a Review of a Premises Licence. Whether or not a Review Hearing takes place is in the discretion of the Licensing Authority, but, if requested by an Interested Party will not normally be granted within the first 12 months except for the most compelling circumstances.



Dear Debbie and Ian,

I write concerning the application to vary the premises licence for Eastern Chillout, 99 Fisherton Street.

I regret that we have serious concerns regarding the licence application. Our concerns are specifically related to the following elements of the application.

- 1. To allow late night refreshment to be provided in the garden area and "Barn." For clarity the name "Barn" may cause a misunderstanding for some people reading the application. It is essentially an outbuilding to the rear of the premises with one side entirely open.
- 2. To allow regulated entertainment, in any form and including dancing, to take place in the "Barn"
- 3. To allow recorded music to be provided outside in the garden area
- 4. To allow speakers to be installed in the smoking tents in the garden area and allow recorded music to be provided there
- 5. To extend the times for regulated entertainment inside the premises without putting in place reasonable, and necessary, measures to prevent that entertainment from causing a nuisance. The current operating schedule and application to vary the licence do not put in place any specific measures which would prevent entertainment noise from inside the premises from causing a nuisance. Such as ensuring windows and doors are kept closed when regulated entertainment is taking place and ensuring an acoustic lobby is in place on the rear exit to the garden / Barn area.

As you know the Barn and garden area to the rear of the premises are almost entirely surrounded by houses. The garden and external area are also very narrow and the houses are very close indeed. In our opinion these factors make the elements of the application referred to above entirely inappropriate for the local area and people living nearby. The noise which will inevitably be created by these activities is likely to cause a public nuisance for people living nearby.

As an illustration of the risks associated with this premises and the proximity of neighbours in late 2012 both ourselves and yourselves were in receipt of complaints from a close neighbour regarding nuisance being caused by entertainment being provided at the premises. That neighbour advised that music noise from the premises was clearly audible in their home and was preventing them from sleeping. Although those complaints have since ceased we understand this was as a result of the cessation of entertainment being provided outside the premises.

On the basis that the application is likely to cause public nuisance we recommend the application be refused.

- 5. To amend the existing condition relating to recorded music to read: 'Other than where specifically allowed in conjunction with a performance of dance, recorded music will be limited to background music i.e. not regulated entertainment, which will not be audible outside the premises.'
- 6. To add a condition to read:- 'CCTV will be installed to cover all licensed areas, and the system will be of sufficient quality to ensure that identification of individuals will be possible. CCTV will be securely stored and images will be

retained for a period of not less than 30 days. CCTV images will be produced to a Police Officer or a Wiltshire Council Licensing Officer on request.'

7. To remove the existing condition that provides that Persons under 16 will not be permitted on the premises after 18.00 hours.

Informative

1. For the purposes of this licence, 'the restaurant area' is not to include any outside area, the tents, or the additional structure known as 'the barn'.

Reasons

The Sub Committee considered that the modifications to the premises licence as set out above would enable the licence-holder to expand and develop the range of facilities offered to patrons, whilst seeking to protect the amenity of nearby residents. In particular the Sub-Committee were concerned at the likely disturbance of residents by live and recorded music late at night and for that reason did not approve the requested addition of recorded music as a licensable activity (other than in the limited circumstances allowed); the increase in hours of live music; or the provision of late night refreshments other than in the restaurant area. The Sub-Committee accepted the comments of the Environmental Health officer that the acoustic properties of the restaurant area had not been significantly improved since noise complaints last year. They also accepted that the acoustic properties of the barn were inadequate, or at best untested, and that the tents would not contain any noise at all.

The Sub-Committee accepted that performances of belly-dancing needed to be accompanied by recorded music and therefore agreed that such music could be permitted, in the restaurant area, during the limited hours of those performances on Friday and Saturday evenings. They also felt that both live and recorded music would be acceptable on non-standard days.

The Sub-Committee saw no reason to restrict the presence of persons under 16 on the premises, but accepted the need to have appropriate CCTV in place, to prevent crime and disorder.

In reaching its decision the Sub Committee has considered the relevant provisions of the Licensing Act 2003 (in particular Sections 4 and 35); the guidance issued under Section 182 of the Act and the Licensing Policy of Wiltshire Council.

Evidence

The Sub-committee heard evidence from Mrs. Kemaneler, the licence-holder. She explained the nature of the business currently operated at the Eastern Chillout and how they wished to offer more services to their patrons, including being able to cater for weddings. She said that works had been carried out to the barn to improve its acoustic properties and that advice had been taken from an acoustic engineer. They had had a live music event last year at the premises which had led to complaints. Since then that had been no further events.



Mr. McMillan, for the Environmental Health Team, explained the concerns that his Team had with some of the proposed variations to the licence. There were residential properties very close to the premises and the occupants of those properties would be disturbed by both music noise and by the noise of people talking in the garden area late at night. The tents were particularly near to other properties and, in his view, it was inconceivable that there could be music in the tents that would not be audible beyond the premises. He had not seen details of any acoustic works to the barn, but in any event, would be concerned at the inevitable escape of music from the buildings, when doors were opened.

Right to Appeal

All parties have the right to appeal to the Magistrates' Court within 21 days of receipt of this decision.

Re: Premises Licence Application for Eastern Chillout

I write on behalf of the Environmental Control and Protection Team to object to the granting of the variation of the premises licence at the above premises. We recommend this application be refused because we are of the opinion that some of the changes are likely to lead to public nuisance for people living nearby. The application is therefore not in accordance with the "prevention of public nuisance" licensing objective.

We have visited the premises and been in email communication with the applicant about our concerns. Potential solutions have been suggested but the applicant has not accepted them. I will explain our concerns in more detail below.

1. Function Room (The Barn)

This department continues to have significant concerns regarding the use of the 'function room' for regulated entertainment. The function room is attached via a party wall to a residential property. There are also residential properties to the north and west of the building less than six meters away. Should live or recorded music be played for entertainment in this room the noise is likely to have an adverse impact on residential amenity nearby and cause a public nuisance.

It is noted that sound proofing is currently being installed in the function room. However, we have no evidence to show whether this sound proofing will be adequate to protect residents of the surrounding properties from experiencing excessive levels of noise. This department has experience of investigating complaints about noise emanating from similar structures at other premises in similar locations.

This application to vary the licence, if accepted with no changes, would permit live and recorded music to be played in this function room 12:00 – 23:00 Sunday to Thursday and 12:00 to 00:00 Friday and Saturday. It has to be considered that if this variation was granted, and should the business demand it, the new licence would permit music to be played in this room seven days per week until late in the evening.

It should also be noted that the current planning permission for the premises includes a condition restricting the use of the function room. The condition dictates that there should be no sound-amplifying equipment, loudspeaker, or public address system operated or live or recorded music played or entertainment provided within the function room. This condition was attached to the planning permission on recommendation from this department. If the applicant wished to carry out these activities in the function room they will need to make an application to the planning department. If these activities are carried out in this room without the appropriate planning permission the Development Control department may investigate and take formal action if appropriate.

For this department to consider supporting any change to the planning condition or changes to the times regulated entertainment are licensed to take place in this room we would need to see evidence to show that noise making activities in the function room will not have an adverse impact at residential properties adjoining or nearby. The applicant has been advised of this.

2. Main restaurant

The applicant is requesting an increase in the hours that music to be played in the main restaurant. The current licence permits live music to be played Friday and Saturdays 20:00 to 23:30 and recorded music, when in conjunction with the performance of dance, from 20:00 to 21:30 Fridays and Saturdays. This application looks for both live and recorded music to be performed Sunday to Thursday 12:00 to 23:00 and Friday and Saturday 12:00 to 00:00. The existing licence limits recorded music to only be played in conjunction with the performance of dance. We would not support a change to this restriction at this time.

We have concerns that without careful management these changes could result in a public nuisance to people residing in properties to the front, rear and adjacent to this premises.

The application includes the implementation of a lobby to the rear of the premises. This will help in mitigating sound escaping if it is managed properly. It has been suggested to the applicant that their application be altered to include in the operating schedule measures to manage noise associated with regulated entertainment in the main restaurant. The measures suggested were for doors and windows to be closed except for access and egress and for frequent monitoring checks to be made outside of the premises to check the sound levels when regulated entertainment is taking place. Unfortunately the recommendations have not been taken forward. This department can therefore not support this aspect of the application.

3. Garden, tents and gazebos

The existing licence permits the four tents in the garden. This variation will permit the tents to be on the western boundary of the garden rather than the eastern. We do not consider that this change is likely to have a significant impact on the noise levels experienced at residential properties nearby. However, the use of these tents must be carefully monitored and managed to avoid complaints being made about noise from the people using them. It should be noted that there is a planning condition attached to the permission for this premises restricting the use of gazebos to 08:00 to 23:00.

The current licence prohibits regulated entertainment in the garden, tents or gazebos this department would not support a change in this restriction at this time.

Smoking legislation: Smoking should not take place in tents or gazebos which have more than 50% of their area enclosed. The tents and gazebos detailed in this application all have more than 50% of their area enclosed and smoking should not take place inside them.

These outside structures must meet relevant standard of fire resistance and do not compromise the existing means of escape.

This department has no objection to the changes in internal layout of the restaurant or function room. However, given the nature of the area, structure of the buildings and proximity of residential properties nearby the changes to the times that regulated entertainment can take place in this premises are not appropriate. We consider that these changes are likely to result in a public nuisance and we therefore recommend that this application is refused.




