This is a capital project; the total project cost is under £1,000 and therefore according to the community area grants criteria a 50% contribution is not required.

<b>Project Description:</b> Provision of mapboards and leaflets etc in connection with the implementation of the Wilton Town Trail a joint Town CouncilBusiness Chamber project			
<b>Input from Community Engagement Manager:</b> The applicant reports that national and international visitors to the town will be given clear directions to the facilities and attractions on offer including the new			

Town Trail Heritage trail. This will encourage them to stay in the town and use the shops/cafes/restaurants that are available so boosting local trade and the local economy.

South West Wiltshire Area Board previously provided Wilton & District Business Chamber with £14,000 for a two-year project delivery plan, which included £3,000 being ring-fenced for this project. This is a capital project and the applicant has committed to paying 50% of the project cost (including taking into account the £3,000 already provided by the Area Board through WDBC), meeting the community area grant criteria.
