# 6 Fire & Rescue Update

## 7 Wellington Heroes - Giving young people the voice they deserve

Chris Smith - Director & Lead Facilitator, Wellington Heroes outlined the role of the "Wellington Heroes". Members of the Heroes team introduced themselves and what they did at the Academy.

Points made included:

- Wellington Heroes were students from Years 8, 9 & 10.
- The Heroes programme at the Wellington Academy had been voted into the top 4 nationally out of 100+ Heroes journey's – which was a huge achievement!
- The Heroes journey was recognised as work experience and an extracurricular opportunity - these were both essential when applying for colleges, universities and jobs.
- As a Hero usually to give up about 3-5hrs of your time a term to the Heroes' journey. This was sometimes in lessons, however to minimise disruption the majority of time was during tutor time and after school.
- The five main outcomes of the Heroes work was help them create a strong foundation by improving 5 levels of Hope, Confidence, Happiness, relationships before finally enhancing their employability skills and life chances.
- That the Wellington Heroes would take on the role of the Local Youth Network, and that a representative(s) would attend future Area Board meetings.

The Chairman thanked Chris Smith and the Wellington Heroes for their presentation.

## 8 Warm and Safe Wiltshire

Philip Morris - Senior Development Manager, Warm and Safe Wiltshire gave a presentation on fuel poverty and ways residents can be supported to live better

in their homes.

Points made included:

What Warm and Safe Wiltshire do

- Free-phone based energy advice and support.
- Home visits.
- Fitting simple energy saving draught proofing measures for free.
- Supported referral on for other relevant services.

How can Warm and Safe Wiltshire help

- Practical advice setting heating controls, managing damp, understanding your energy bill.
- Advice on improvements that will save money and make patients homes warmer.
- Identifying issues and finding solutions to high energy bills.
- Support in accessing discounted or free; boiler/boiler repair, insulation and essential maintenance for vulnerable customers.
- Energy debt support and income maximisation.
- Energy switching support.
- Financial maximisation, support with accessing grants.
- Referrals for other support.

The Chairman thanked Philip Morris for his presentation.

#### 9 Recycle for Wiltshire Tidworth Community Area Project - update

Jessica Thimbleby - Wiltshire Wildlife Trust gave a brief update on the Recycle for Wiltshire Tidworth Community Area Project which aimed to educate and encourage school children and communities throughout Wiltshire to reduce, reuse and recycle more of their household rubbish.

Points made included:

- That the project had been ongoing since April 2016.
- Had held a litter related quiz.
- Had held a local litter campaign.
- Had been promoting Freecycle.

The Chairman thanked Jessica Thimbleby for her update.

## 10 Updates From Tidworth Community Area Partnership

Economic & Built Environment Group

## Health & Wellbeing Group Group – Reia Jones

- That missed GP appointments were still an ongoing issue. A new text appointment service was being looked at, this enabled a person to cancel an appointment via a text message to their surgery.
- That no dentists in the Tidworth/Andover area were taking on NHS patients.
- That the next meeting would be held during January 2017.

Older Person & Carers Champion – Tony Pickernell

- That the Schools Christmas concert had been a great success, with around 700 children attending.
- That the Wiltshire Council Older Persons Champions were due to meet on the 25 January.

- That the Area Board requests the Community Engagement Manager to work with key partners, agencies and community groups to coordinate action around the priorities identified.
- That the Board considers whether it wishes to champion a particular theme or priority and to earmark funding to promote, initiate and support community-led action around the selected priorities.
- That the Board considers appointing a lead member to champion any priority (priorities) adopted.
- That reports are submitted to the Board on progress made to address the priorities to ensure that positive outcomes are delivered and that this be made a regular item on future Board meetings.
