Lamp posts have been moved they've been hit so many times. The footpath sign was moved to an invisible location as was always getting knocked down the kerb has many many scuffs and scratches its been hit so many times. Cars in the hedge six foot up on three occassions I'm aware off. I've closed the road many times due to ice accidents or whatever reason needed Please do something someone is going to get killed soon. Many people use the track opposite my house to walk there dogs. They have to cross on the corner where traffic is already at 35 40 mph thats after having exited a 20mph limit 3400 yards down the road. Issue has been sent to PC to outline if there is support for issue. Metrocount request has been sent.
