2. Comprehensive Spending Review

Work is ongoing to deliver a new policing model to meet the projected funding cuts over the next 4-years. Wiltshire Police Authority is currently consulting with the public, stakeholders and partners about plans to save about £15 million. Mr Macpherson from WPA will be at the meeting to make a short presentation as part of the consultation process.

3. Performance

The reported overall crime figures continue to show that offences in the Community Area are falling. The **16%** reduction is the second best across the county. The number of detections puts Melksham in 3^{rd} place. Full details can be found below in **Table 1**.

NPT officers are still concentrating on reducing ASB in and around King George V Park and have recently introduced a drop-in surgery in partnership with Selwood Housing. The initiative has the support of the Forest Tenants and Residents Association. A key part of this work is to continue to engage with young people to encourage them to join activities run by the Youth Development Service. The Bluz 'n' Zuz initiative continues to be well supported.

There is evidence to support that an increase in reports during December is due to the weather and persons reporting snowballing incidents. Officers have adopted a common-sense approach and have only pursued incidents where there are other factors to suggest an intent to cause harm to another person or property.
