Project description

The Marlborough area now has a start-up set of facilities that support and encourage Digital Making. Digital Making is part of a rapidly growing worldwide Maker movement that the educational establishment now recognises as supporting STEM learning as well as many other disciplines by providing opportunities for students to design - create - experiment and explore. Exploring and understanding at a real working level a range of digital technologies also prepares students for the rapidly changing work place and generally for a world that is being driven by many new technologies.

A lunch-time club at St John's School established in September 2017 and various workshops/demonstrations and larger scale all day public events - so called Raspberry Jams – were held in Marlborough Town Hall.

Further equipment and support resources are required to scale the activities to an adequate level and to enable them to be run efficiently and sustainably.

The additional equipment and support resources fall into four distinct areas:

- 1 upgrading the equipment, shared between the St John's School club and the larger scale public events, to use the integrated screen/power supply assemblies (pi-topCEEDs) that were originally sourced just for the smaller scale ad hoc workshop activities. The original funding was minimised by using St John's existing screens at the lunch-time club, but this has proved exceptionally time consuming since disconnecting the St John's screens, connecting them to the club equipment and then reconnecting them into the St John's network takes 3 times as long as the lunchtime club session itself.
- 2 providing some more work area set ups since at times the existing equipment, particularly at the St John's club, is fully used with users having to share equipment.
- 3 providing a central management system, that has recently become possible, so that each of the work areas' systems can be updated/upgraded remotely from a central server which will save a considerable amount of time as well as improving the system maintenance quality. The central management system will also provide the capability for individual users to save their work so that it can be continued from session to session.
