Community rugby league is a summer sport so ties in well with winter rugby union. We will play in the Rugby Football League (RFL) 'West on England' league in 2011.

How did you discover there was a need for your project and how will your project benefit your local community?

Nick Westaway, a local lad, played rugby union (RU) for Corsham. Whilst at university he started to play rugby league (RL) and enjoyed it immensely. On his return to Corsham he asked if his team-mates would be interested in playing RL and received a very favourable response. Through the RL south-west office, Nick was able to make contact with other local enthusiasts and a committee was formed. Community RL is a summer sport so complements winter RU. Wyverns played 3 matches in summer 2010 drawing mainly on Corsham RU players. Corsham RU offered use of its facilities in 2010 and our first home game drew a significant crowd. Outside Corsham RU, a lot of interest has been expressed in this new venture by local people. The community will benefit through the introduction of a new (to this area) team sport during the (normally quiet) summer season. RL will provide opportunities for existing RU players and people new to rugby to enjoy a robust but structured game during the summer. The sport will also enable the establishment of contacts both at committee and player level with like-minded people from other regional communities/clubs (e.g. Swindon, Bristol, Gloucester, Oxford).

Any other information about your project.

The Rugby Football League, through their south-west office provides considerable support to enable clubs to start-up and function. The RFL has been instrumental in enabling members of the club to: (a) attend an all-day meeting (6 hours!) at Yeovil of all south-west clubs - this included a course to obtain the qualification of 'touchline manager' (controlling negative behaviour etc); (b) qualify as an RL referee and (c) take the RL Coaching Certificate (RLCC) Level 2 at Gloucester University. The first part was completed over weekend 22/23 Jan; subsequent parts of the course also take place at Gloucester over weekends in February and March. Assuming we complete the course, there will be three qualified RL coaches at Corsham RL this summer. Wiltshire Wyverns has been accepted into the 'West of England' league for the 2011 season alongside Swindon St George, Bristol Sonics 'A', Gloucester Warriors and Oxford Cavaliers. The nascent Bath club plans to join this league in 2012.

Feedback. After our first 'friendly' season, many players were extremely enthusiastic about having 'discovered' this new game (to them). On the RLCC course, a Bristol Sonics committee member said that having played RU for thirty years, he only wished he had been able to play RL from the start of his rugby playing career.
