1. Background

Young people have considered this application and identified it as a priority for Area Board funding.

Project Description

In 2019 the Carnival date moved to enable DOCA to work with young people in schools and youth organisations in the local area encouraging participation in Carnival and helping to breathe new life into the event. DOCA wants to continue to build on this work and bring more young people into the process teaching them making skills, giving them an opportunity to be proud, feeling they are part of the community and making a positive contribution. DOCA wants to bring in a professional artist to deliver high-quality workshops and also to train up a local artist to improve skills available.

Input from Community Engagement Manager:

DOCA piloted this workshop ahead of the 2019 Carnival and had a good response even though funding was not confirmed until close to the date. DOCA worked with Wansdyke School, Wiltshire Museum, The Trinity CE Primary Academy, Five Lanes Church of England VC Primary School, Rowde Primary and Southbroom St James Academy. There were 292 participants in total. For 2020 and with more publicity, they hope to reach even more people. The workshops will encourage participation in Carnival and allow young people to be creative and learn new craft skills. It shows that moving the date of Devizes Carnival to be within school term time has had the desired effect of engaging with more young people via their schools and giving the event a boost.
