Carers often have an increased presence in hospitals because of their caring role which in turn can lead to heightened feelings of stress and anxiety and can be made worse by a lack of relevant accessible and practical information and advice within the hospital environment. We seek funding for resources - including posters leaflets cards volunteer uniforms and carer friendly badges for hospital staff - to better identify engage and support unpaid carers in Chippenham Community Hospital.</p> <p><b>Input from Community Engagement Manager:</b>  Carer Support Wiltshire seeks support to launch a carer-outreach campaign at Chippenham Community Hospital in which a range of resources including posters leaflets cards volunteer uniforms and carer friendly badges for hospital staff to better identify engage and support unpaid carers at Chippenham Community Hospital. Hospitals therefore provide a unique setting in which a high proportion of visitors and patients are likely to be carers and who may be at various stages in their caring role.
