Project Description:

After numerous break-ins to the school grounds, acts of vandalism, theft and damage to property, as well as wider anti-social behaviour in areas just outside the school grounds the school would like to install a CCTV system to prevent incidents and to assist the police in solving such crimes. Incidents are most common outside of the school day when the grounds are closed.

Psychologically, both students and staff will benefit from a reduction in anti-social behaviour and a feeling of increased security knowing that the CCTV system will monitor an area in which they should feel safe.

Input from Community Engagement Manager:

This application meets the criteria for the grant scheme. Having a CCTV system covering the school and the grounds may cut down on ASB and damage to property. This in turn will make pupils and staff feel safer whilst at school and free up budget away from repairs.

Project Description:

This project consists of three elements:

Replacement of a 50m fence that is adjacent to neighbouring land. This will stop livestock getting onto the field.

Provision of a large water storage tank with a powerful pump to allow essential irrigation that is required to produce a top-class playing surface.

Replace existing protection netting on the roadside with higher poles and netting to increase safety for the cars passing by, horse riders and pedestrians.

Input from Community Engagement Manager:

This application meets the criteria of the grant scheme. The cricket ground at Bishops Cannings hosts over 80 games a season including numerous representative or County games. Over 1000 people play cricket every season at the club and 500 boys and girls practice and are coached there. The benefits of a team sport like cricket is profound in terms of physical health and mental wellbeing.

Project Description:

Alzheimer's Support has been running a Movement for the Mind project providing activity sessions blending light exercises, including for those with restricted mobility and wheelchair users. Reminiscence and plenty of fun helps people regain confidence in themselves and their abilities, provides a social outing and helps stimulate brain function. Post-Covid, they are seeking support to re-launch with a wider remit to incorporate more local people with dementia.

Input from Community Engagement Manager:

This application meets the criteria for the grant scheme. The Movement for the Mind sessions provide an important way for people living with dementia and their carers to socialise, take important physical exercise and meet with advisers from the charity. Increasing these sessions will be a great benefit for people living in the Devizes community.

Project Description:

Love Devizes is the follow-up to the successful Devizes Covid-19 Support Group that operated for 19 weeks during lockdown. Love Devizes intends to provide:

- a DC19S type-response should restrictions tighten
- volunteering opportunities within the Devizes Community Area
- a means for individuals referred to by others e.g. GPs, charities and organisations to access volunteers
- a means for neighbours in the community to enable their own flourishing and the growth of others being resourced to set up their own projects etc.
- a means for the community to be strengthened from within using the skills resources time and talents of those within the Devizes Community Area

Input from Community Engagement Manager:

This application meets the criteria for the grant scheme. This project involves and is supported by Cllr Laura Mayes and can also be regarded as a Member's Initiative, hence the amount requested being larger than usual. DCS was held as a flagship group during the lockdown of spring 2020 and used innovative ways of communicating with volunteers and using them effectively. Love Devizes draws on that experience of using volunteers and will direct those willing people to new local projects that need help as and when.
