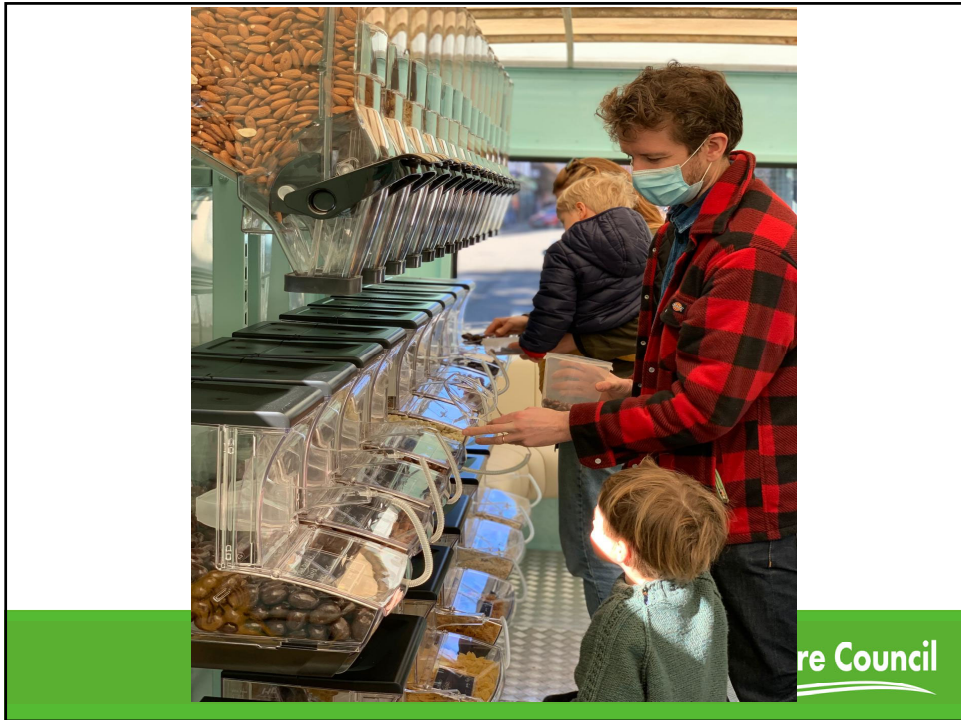

- Wiltshire Council plan to recruit 100 foster carers in 3 years
- Since 1st April 2020, 28 new foster carers approved and 10 due by 31st March 2021
- Current need is for specialist foster carers and those wishing to care for teenagers
- Foster carers need to be over 21 years of age, have a spare bedroom, time to care for a child and a willingness to care for young people who have experienced trauma and loss.
- We need to recruit foster carers in your local community

How are we are doing in the South West Wilts area?

14/10/2020: 5 children in foster care and 7 fostering households
12/01/2021: 4 children in foster care and 6 fostering households

Children not living with Wiltshire Council foster carers often live further away from their school, friends and family. They are usually placed with costly profit making independent fostering agencies, sometimes outside Wiltshire.

We need your help to think how together we can recruit more foster carers in your local community

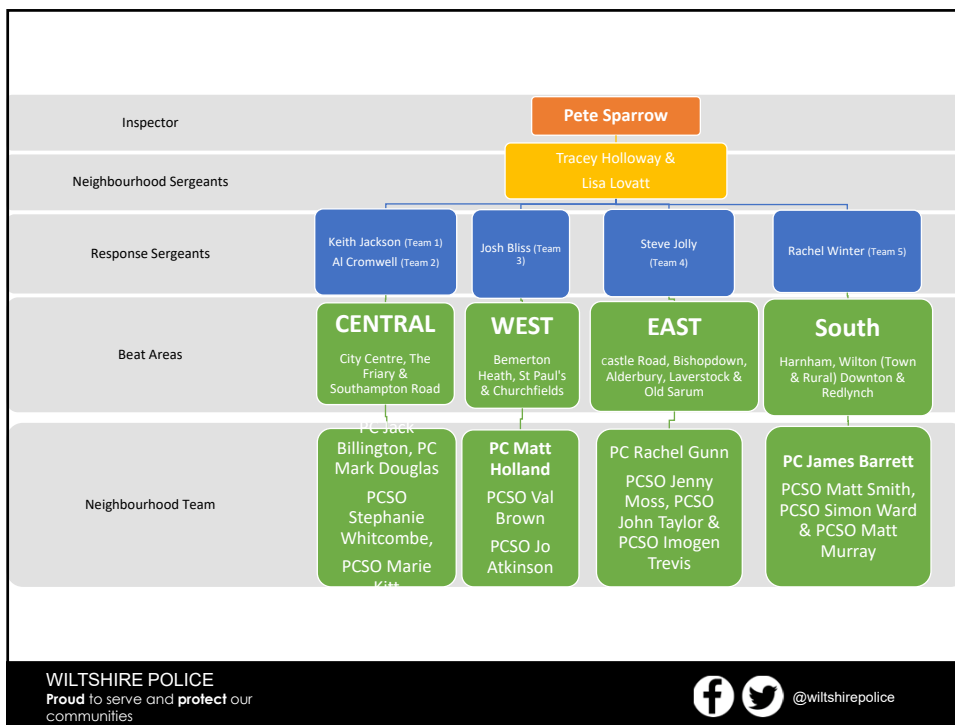

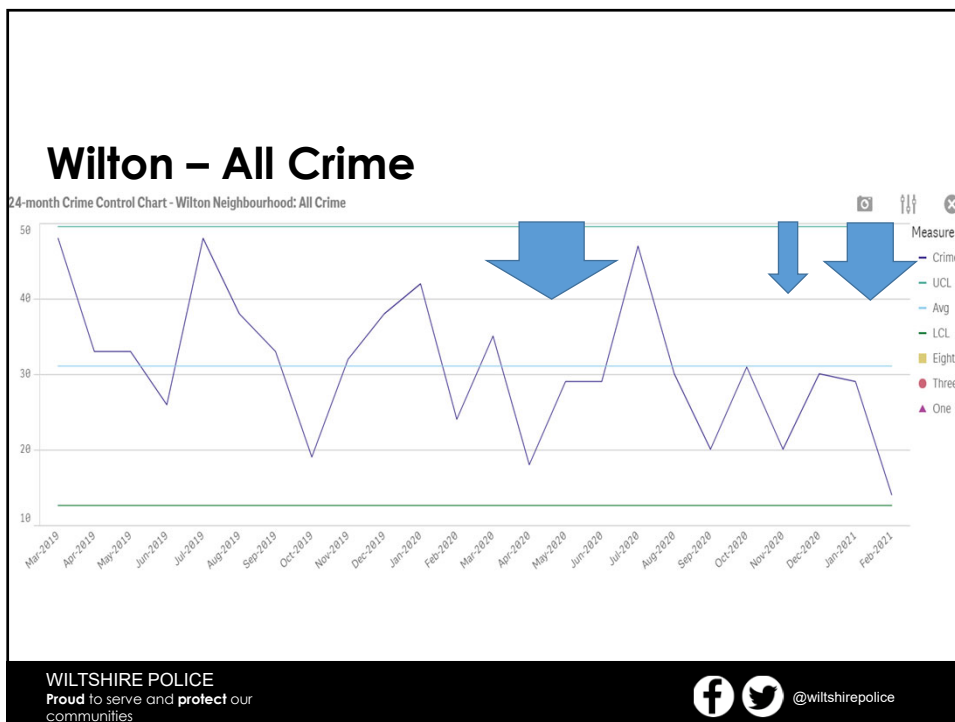

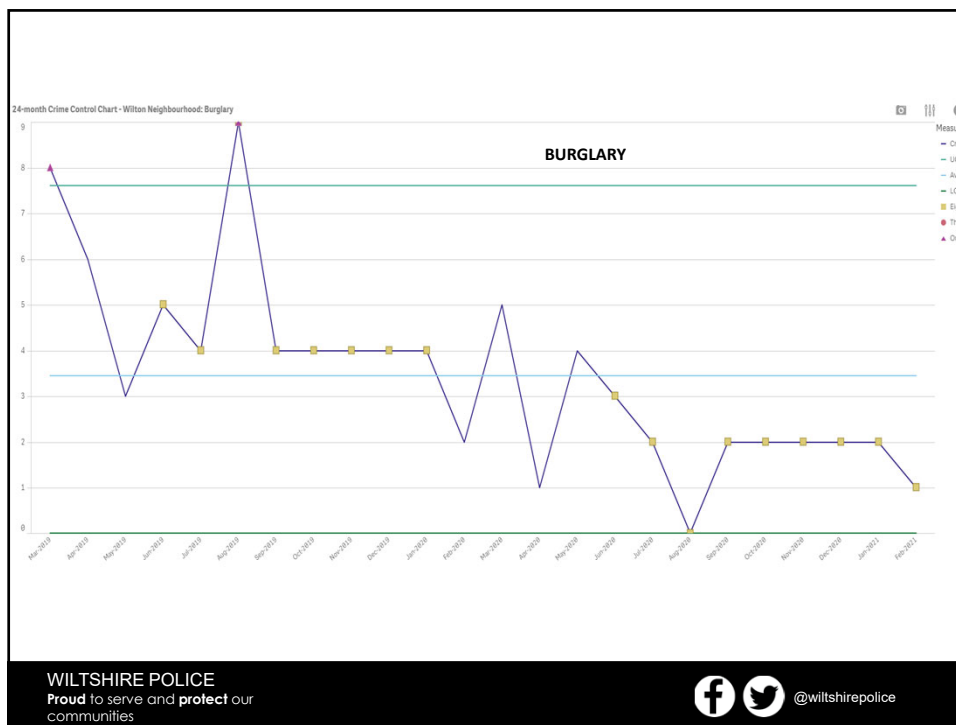
