Performance – 12 months to May 2021

Force

- Wiltshire Police has had a decrease in the volume of recorded crime by 9.8% in the 12 months to May 2021 and continues to have one of the lowest crime rates in the country.
- Wiltshire Police has seen a 16% reduction in vehicle crime and a reduction of 39.2% in residential burglaries in the 12 months to May 2021.
- Our service delivery remains consistently good.
- In May 2021, we received:
- 9,044 '999' calls, (answered within 9 seconds on average);
- 11,292 '101' calls, (answered within 13 seconds on average);
- 11,415 'CRIB' calls, (answered within 1 minute and 29 seconds on average).
- In May 2021, we also attended 1,610 emergency incidents within 9 minutes and 23 seconds on average.

Stop and Search information for Chippenham CPT

During the 12 months leading to April 2021, 185 stop and searches were conducted in the Chippenham area of which 82.7% related to a search for controlled drugs.

During 76.8% of these searches, no object was found. In 22.2% of cases, an object was found. The remaining 1% did not have this information recorded.

Of these cases 79.5% resulted in a no further action disposal; 19.4% resulted in police action being taken; 5.9% resulted in an arrest.

Of the stop and search subjects who defined their ethnicity:

- White 162 stop and searches.
- Mixed Ethnicity 6 stop and searches
- Black or Black British 6 stop and searches
- Asian or Asian British 1 stop and searches





Local Priorities & Updates

Priority	Update
COVID	With lockdown restrictions easing, focus remains on local public houses to ensue they are COVID compliant. Any breaches of legislation will be dealt with and/or reported to the licensing team
Speeding (all sectors)	Officers are conducting speed checks at various locations across the sector. The locations are predominantly chosen based on intelligence and complaints received from members of the public at our recent community consultations. Locations in Calne identified as London Rd, Stockley Lane, Quemerford, North St and Curzon St. CPTN will target these areas and any others identified to us.
Tackling the supply of drugs	CPT has been, and is currently, targeting local drug dealers within our area. In the last 18 months we have executed 20 warrants. We have seized over £100k worth of drugs and thousands of pounds in cash. A local male from Calne has recently been arrested twice for possession with intent to supply Class A. The four warrant executed in Calne have resulted in £30-35k of drugs being seized.
ASB	There had been an increase in ASB reports around The Pippin and The Rec which coincides with the lifting of COVID restrictions. A local youth is currently being dealt with by CPTN for damaging flowers in The Pippin, CPTN are working with YOT to address the behaviour. High visibility patrols are being conducted to target ASB

High Level Updates: Force

- **COVID-19:** From Monday 19 July, it is expected that the COVID Regulations will be amended further as part of the final stage of the Government roadmap. We have sought throughout the pandemic to take a proportionate response, working with our communities and we continue to see high levels of compliance with the regulations across the County.
- Police Officer Uplift: As part of the Govenrment plan to recruit an additional 20,000 officers in England and Wales via the Uplift programme we have exceeded our first year allocation; recruiting 60 officers funded by Uplift by March 2021 (compared to a target of 49). We have recently closed our PC recruitment campaign receiving 400 applications within 48 hours of recruitment opening.
- **Surge Demand:** We know that once lockdown restrictions lift, certain areas of our operational demand will rise. We will be launching a public engagement initiative to coincide with the lifting of COVID restrictions to inform the public of what this demand will look like and the part they can play in helping us manage it. Look out for this summer-long campaign launching next month.
