Project Summary:

Wiltshire Wildlife Trust are developing an area of the Green Lane Nature Reserve to facilitate wellbeing and educational activities for local residents. In order to make the site fully accessible for longer visits and activities, we are seeking to install an accessible composting toilet and a shelter. There are no local public toilets or facilities within a suitable distance of the site, reducing the ability for those with health conditions to visit the site and make the most of the benefits of engaging with nature.

Ofcom's figures show that three quarters of people have a preference for DAB, so DAB is an imperative for WWR which is currently an internet only broadcaster.

Project Summary:

Celebrating Age Wiltshire (CAW) will use arts & heritage activities to reach the most isolated older people in the Trowbridge area, helping to tackle loneliness and aiming to improve their health and wellbeing through creative and artistic engagement. In particular CAW will target those people who are vulnerable and socially isolated due to frailty, ill health, dementia, poor mobility or caring responsibilities. Our programme has developed four different strands of both live and online activity to meet the needs of this group. CAW is a partnership of community organisations across the county with Wiltshire Music Centre as lead organisation.

Project Summary:

We will provide after school activities from our pop up cafe van one evening each month on the Kensington Fields open area. This will be open to all young people free of charge, although we are aiming particularly to meet the needs of those in the 10-16 age range. The pop up will be run by trained and experienced youth workers, accompanied by trained volunteers. We will provide a range of activities to suit all young people, from sports like football and volley ball to traditional board games and video games. We will signpost young people to other agencies as approipriate.

Background

- Area Boards have authority to approve funding under powers delegated to them. Under the Scheme of Delegation Area Boards must adhere to the Area Board Funding and Grants Criteria. This document is available on the council's website.
- 4. Three funding streams are available to the Area Board, each with an annually awarded amount. These funding streams are as follows:

 - Youth Grants (revenue)
 - Older and Vulnerable People Grants (revenue)
- 5. The Area Board will be advised of the funding available prior to their first meeting of each financial year.
